Dear Saints,

We continue this month with our reflections on famous works of Christian art. This month, we reflect on Matthias Grünewald's *Isenheim Altarpiece* (c. 1510-1515). In order to understand this painting, we must first understand its background.


This altarpiece was commissioned by a hospital order of monks that devoted themselves to the care of people in the tiny town of Isenheim, France. Their care consisted primarily of treating patients afflicted with a terrible skin disease called "St. Anthony's fire." The disease caused painful seizures and spasms, as well as throbbing pustules and open wounds.

People who came to the hospital knew they would soon die. The monks invited Grünewald to create a painting that patients could meditate upon to help them cope with their agonies. As they suffered from their disease, they could look up to see Christ's suffering for them on the cross. He was with them in the midst of suffering.

There are several characters in the painting. On the far left is Mary, the mother of Jesus, dressed like the nuns who cared for the patients in the hospital. The apostle John comforts Mary. Jesus has asked this disciple whom he loved to care for his mother (John 19:26).

Mary Magdalene kneels in front, praying, wringing her hands in sorrow. At the hospital, Mary Magdalene would have been eye level with the patients. She embodies their experience—sorrow mingled with prayer.

John the Baptizer stands to the right pointing to Jesus and says, "He must decrease and I must increase" (John 3:30). John exemplifies the attitude of a Christian, especially during Lent: eyes fixed on Jesus, finger firmly pointing to Jesus, knowing that we must deny ourselves so Jesus can live within us.



Finally, Christ on the cross dominates the painting, towering over everyone else. The depiction is grim. His hands and feet twist and contort in pain. His body is grayish green and covered with wounds—the same sores the patients had covering their bodies.

Grünewald's image of the crucified Christ communicates one message, whether we live in the 16th or the 21st century: Christ is on the cross for us. Christ has suffered and died, and nothing—no suffering and no death—can separate us from his love (Romans 8:38-39).

This Lent, spend some extra time with this crucified Christ--whether through extra church services, prayer, or devotions—who "suffered, sad and lonely, rest to give my weary soul" (LSB 420, v. 3).

BOARD OF MINISTRY DIRECTORS by Ken Ladage, Chairman

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

May knowing Jesus bring you peace to bless each day, hope for each tomorrow, and joy in every season. In our Lenten journey towards Easter, let us remember the One who humbled Himself and became obedient unto death, even death on a cross (Philippians 2:8). Let us renew our faith and receive with open hearts the love of God who makes us brothers and sisters in Christ.

Ash Wednesday was February 22nd and Easter will be April 9th. We are in the Lenten season. Midweek services will be on Wednesdays, supper at 6:00 pm and the service at 7:00 pm.

Trinity has received nine new members. The Confirmation class has eight members. Family ministries night was attended by 14 adults and 16 children. Future events are planned. Sunday School is up and running. Sunday and Thursday's adult Bible study are meeting.

Ed Dennis and the Church Security Committee are making progress in reviewing safety considerations at Trinity. Our fire extinguishers have been checked and signage will be used to clearly indicate these locations. The Committee has purchased two Trauma Kits for the Preschool. The materials in these kits contain items designed specifically for use with children in the event of an emergency. Two adult Trauma Kits, one for the main floor and one for the basement, were also purchased. The committee is now looking into training options for staff, ushers, and elders.

Trinity's financial performance continues to be strong. We continue to operate in the black. In spite of varying weather conditions, church attendance continues to be strong year to year.

Budget planning for Trinity and TLC Preschool began in February. The tentative schedule calls for budgets to be presented to the Board of Ministry Directors by April 13th. The budget will be approved by the Board on May 11th and presented to the Congregation on May 28th for their review. A Voters Meeting is scheduled for June 11th for Congregational approval. The 2023-24 budget planning includes appropriate increases based on inflation. Meetings were scheduled with the trustees to review upcoming building maintenance issues and repair schedules.

The Village Team is expecting a quote by March 8th from our General Contractor regarding costs for our building project. With that information, the Team will begin reviewing our options.

The Board will be meeting March 9th and your input is welcomed. A segment of each Board meeting, (second Thursday of the month at 5:00 pm) is reserved for Steward comments, suggestions, or questions. A suggestion box is located in the Narthex.




