# **TRINITY TIDINGS**

Dear Saints,

We continue our walk through Christian art by taking a look at Caravaggio's *The Supper at Emmaus* painted in 1601, when he was only 30 years old(!).

This beautiful painting relates the events of Luke 24:13-35, Jesus' journey with the two disciples on the road to Emmaus. We heard this Bible story in church on April 23. If you don't remember it, I'd encourage you to reread it before continuing.

In the text, it is Easter Sunday, and Jesus is risen from the dead. The two disciples have heard rumors of this from the women, but they don't believe it nor do they recognize Jesus when he joins them on the road. Perhaps that is why Caravaggio depicts the risen Jesus so youthfully and without a beard. It is the same Jesus in his flesh and blood, but he is also changed, raised from the dead, unrecognizable to many.

The painting depicts the climax of the story. They are sitting down for a meal, and Jesus takes bread, blesses it, breaks it, and gives it to the two disciples. Only then are their eyes opened, and they recognize him—their crucified and risen Savior, Jesus. Then, Jesus vanishes.

Note the disciples' abrupt, physical reactions of surprise—arms thrown open, chair hastily pushed back, eyebrows raised, and brows furrowed. Caravaggio masterfully portrays the joy and surprise of Easter. Christ is risen! Death no longer has the final word! Alleluia!

Why does Jesus vanish, though? Luke's point seems to be that one place that followers of Jesus now find him is in the Lord's Supper. It is there that we truly see him and recognize him and receive his benefits. Caravaggio reinforces this point by nearly concealing the bread behind the roasted chicken. The Body of Jesus in the Lord's Supper, just like the Risen Body of Jesus, is concealed from many and yet revealed to those who have faith and eyes to truly see.

Caravaggio may also employ some wonderful symbolism. There are grapes in the fruit basket, perhaps symbolizing the wine of the Lord's Supper and the blood of Christ. The apple in the basket appears to be rotting, too, a symbol of the temptation and fall of humanity in the Garden of Eden. Jesus is the new Adam who is faithful where Adam, Eve, you and me are not.

Finally, notice the shadow of the basket. It appears to show the silhouette of a fish. Jesus has caught them in the net of his church, and now they will be "fishers of men" (Matthew 4:19). They will go to the ends of the earth and tell everyone that Jesus died, is risen, and is coming back.

### BOARD OF MINISTRY DIRECTORS by Ken Ladage, Chairman

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

May Jesus Christ be praised, He is risen, Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia. May knowing Jesus bring you peace to bless each day, hope for each tomorrow, and joy in every season. Let us remember the One who humbled Himself and became obedient unto death, even death on a cross (Philippians 2:8). Let us renew our faith and receive with open hearts the love of God who makes us brothers and sisters in Christ.

The average attendance for the Lent midweek services averaged 76 Worshippers. The Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday Services totaled 560 Worshippers. This represents a 17% increase over last year. Compliments and a thank-you to those responsible for the beautiful decorations and music during the services. Church attendance for 2023 is up 25% over 2022.

The work of the Church continues. The Village Team has received the pricing for our building options. These figures were presented and discussed during the Congregational Town Hall meeting on March 26<sup>th</sup>. Pastor is organizing a group to set long-term goals for Trinity. These goals can provide direction as building options are considered.

The Church Security Committee continues to move forward with their plans. CPR Classes are being scheduled for the Preschool, staff, Board Members and Elders in mid-May. The Committee will reach out to others in the congregation who are often in the building to get as many Trinity members as possible trained.

The financial performance for Trinity and the Preschool continues to be strong. Year to date, we continue to operate in the black.

The Budget Committee completed the budgets for Trinity and the Preschool and sent them to the Board of Ministry Directors for review. The windows replacement project was completed in 2023 and represented a significant infrastructure expense. However, the needs of our aging facility will continue to require repairs and replacements in 2023-2024. The budgets will be offered to the Congregation for review beginning May 28<sup>th</sup>. A Voters Meeting is scheduled on June 11<sup>th</sup> for Congregational approval.

The Board will be meeting May 11<sup>th</sup> and your input is welcomed. A segment of each Board meeting, (second Thursday of the month at 5:00 pm) is reserved for Steward comments, suggestions, or questions. A suggestion box is located in the Narthex.
