Dear Saints,

Since the late 2nd century, Christians have set aside time for renewed discipline and devotion as they prepared to celebrate Easter. By the Council of Nicaea (AD 325), there is a mention of a forty day fast which was associated with Jesus' forty day fast in the wilderness when he was tempted by the devil (Matthew 4:1-11).

Eventually these forty days came to be known in English as "Lent." Lent comes from the old English word *lencten* which means "lengthen" and is a reference to the lengthening of days during the spring.

That's actually how you should think of Lent: as spring for your body and soul. As the earth sees a rebirth and renewal of the earth, so Lent is a time to for spiritual renewal so that we flourish in faith toward God and love for our neighbor.

We need to be clear about our efforts, though. Lent is not a time to impress others. It is not a time to earn brownie points with God to get into heaven—we are saved by God's grace alone. It is not even a time for long faces and feeling sad or bad.

Rather, Lent is a time to remember that you are a new creation in Holy Baptism (2 Corinthians 5:17). You are alive! The old sinful self has been drowned in baptism, and now Christ by His Spirit lives in You (Romans 6).

So you can't make yourself more alive. But, like a gardener, you can prune away the dead parts of yourself, so that Christ lives more fully in you and you grow in faith and love.

During Lent, the church has given us three tools by which we can prune our lives (following Jesus' words in Matthew 6):

1. Prayer

Prayer is one important way we grow in relationship with our Heavenly Father. In prayer, God invites us to let Him know what we need and to discover more and more who He is and how much he wants to give us.

- Set aside a time and place for the next forty days, and say your prayers, every day—even if it's only one minute to say the Lord's Prayer in the morning.
- Grab a Lent devotion or Portals of Prayer from the narthex and read it. We've got a Lent craft for families, too.

2. Giving to the Poor

There is a long history in the church of Lent being a special time of sacrificial giving. Giving away our money reminds us that money is not our God and teaches us to cleave to Him who provides for our every need.

- Make a donation to a local food pantry, pregnancy center, or maternity home.
- Volunteer at one of the above.
- Offer to take a shut-in member for errands or go for them.

3. Fasting

Jesus assumes that fasting will be a part of his disciples' lives. The purpose of fasting is to make sure nothing controls us but the love of Christ. We live "by every word that comes from the mouth of God" (Matthew 4:4). If you do fast, try to use some of the extra time to pray or read Scripture.

- Pick a day(s) of the week and eat less food. This could mean not eating snacks, skipping a meal, or not eating until noon or 3 pm.
- Fast from chocolate, alcohol, TV, or social media—whatever habit tends to control you.
- Fast from complaining, gossiping, anger, or revenge.

Whatever you do, you're bound to struggle and probably fail at times. When that happens, return to God, knowing that you're forgiven in Jesus. Then try again!

BOARD OF MINISTRY DIRECTORS by Ken Ladage, Chairman

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

May knowing Jesus bring you peace to bless each day, hope for each tomorrow, and joy in every season. Lent comes in mid-February; Ash Wednesday is the 14th. In our Lenten journey towards Easter, let us remember the One who humbled Himself and became obedient unto death, even death on a cross (Philippians 2:8). Let us renew our faith and receive with open hearts the love of God who makes us brothers and sisters in Christ.

In January the Board welcomed our newly elected members, Tim Mahnke and Georgina Ozga Dortch. Officers for the new year were elected; Ken Ladage Chair, Ed Dennis Vice Chair and Nancy Dvorak Secretary.

Financial performance at Trinity continues to be strong. As a result of strong December giving, the Church is comfortably operating \$11,000 in the black year-to-date. The Annual Financial Review was completed by an outside accounting firm. Everything was in order; no changes were recommended. Louise Johnson deserves our thanks for her excellent financial management. The audit report is available for your review on the bulletin board.

The Budget Committee is being formed to begin preparing a 2024-2025 budget. The church facilities will be reviewed for areas needing repair or improvements. Preventative maintenance will be considered. An area of concern is the anticipated increases in our Commercial Insurance Premiums and increased deductibles. Other companies are being reviewed.

The Board is waiting for a remodeling plan from our architect. The Village Team will explore the feasibility of remodeling our education wing to include a larger fellowship space, a meeting room, and accessible bathrooms. With a plan in place a general contractor can then develop the cost. The Board of Ministry Directors will review and then present a plan to the Congregation for their approval.

The Board welcomes your input. A segment of each Board meeting, (second Thursday of the month at 6:00 pm) is reserved for Steward comments, suggestions, or questions. Our next meeting is February 8th. A suggestion box is located in the Narthex.


A NOTE FROM OUR MUSIC DIRECTOR by Lana Gibbons
