VIEW FROM THE CHAIR

As you have probably read, the Trinity Board of Directors set August 13th for a special meeting of the Assembly of Voters (AOV) to elect members to fill remaining terms of office which were vacated in the past few months. In addition, a published agenda item is to possibly vote to approve an option to settle the litigation with the State of Missouri in regard to the grant program for recycled vehicle tires. I am sure many of you are asking the question, "what out-ofcourt-settlement option is being considered?" Well, the short answer to that question is we still don't know. However, to even discuss an issue at an AOV special meeting, that issue must be in the published announcements for the meeting date and agenda. Consequently, the out-court-settlement option is essentially an agenda "placeholder" in the event our attorneys notify us of a proposed settlement. The general feeling is, now that the U.S. Supreme Court has ruled in Trinity's favor, The State of Missouri should be willing to negotiate a settlement to remove this issue from their case load. If we are notified of the possible settlement prior to the August 13th meeting, the issue will be discussed. If not, the issue will be postponed to the regularly scheduled AOV meeting in October.

July 2017 Board of Directors Minutes (Draft Minutes - Yet to be Approved)

The regular monthly meeting of the Board of Directors was held July 11, 2017, beginning at 7:05 p.m. The following people attended: Phil Glenn (Chairman), Tammy Mangold, Pastor Gerike, JoAnn Schoenike, Fred Luetkemeier, Karen Harms, Warren Harms, Carol Eggerding, Jim Niederjohn, Karen Niederjohn, Pete Easterhaus, Alyssa Famuliner, Annette Kiehne, Doug Kiehne, Ken Greer, Pastor Thieme, Ron Barrett, Chelsea Browner, and Cynthia Green (Secretary). Pastor Gerike opened the meeting with devotion.

Approval of Meeting Agenda: Chairman Glenn asked that the request for a Board of Youth Credit Card, a TLCLC credit card, and a Sam's Club card for the Kitchen Manager of the TLCLC, be added to the Meeting Agenda under new business, along with the request for the withdrawal of Youth funds for the North Dakota trip, an update on Pastor Andre and the creation of a dedicated account for the Israel Trip funds. A motion was made to accept the Meeting Agenda with these changes; seconded and approved.

June 25th and officiated at the funeral of Daniel Wertzberger on June 17, 2017. **Youth**: Senior High Youth Bible Study on Sunday morning; Senior High Youth will have Pray & Prep on July 16th for those going to Minot, South Dakota; the Senior Trip will be from July 22-30. **Fourth Vice President of the Missouri District:** The district is arranging for a Reformation lecture on the MU campus in either September or October. **Christian Education**: We will be creating a page on our website with information and resources; attended and presented at the Christian Storytelling conference in Normal, Illinois.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY'S REPORT – JoAnn Schoenike, Financial Secretary:

For the month of June, the Regular Envelope collections are 98.55% of the anticipated monthly amount, Loose Plate collections are 75.11%, and Sunday School collections are 82.77%. The Total Monthly collections are 97.82% of the monthly anticipated amount of \$40,157. The Total Year-to-Date collections through the end of June are 96.93% of the anticipated amount of \$265,347.

The historic period in the full report is a five-year average which includes 2012-2016 data.

BOARD OF PAROCHIAL EDUCATION (Tammy Mangold, Administrator)

Enrollment is still going on. Open house continues on the third Thursday of each month from 10:00 a.m. till 2:00 p.m. Summer hours are from 10:00 a.m. till 2:00 p.m. Monday – Thursday. Annual meetings with the congregations are on July 16, 2017 at 9:45 a.m. at Campus Lutheran, and 12:00 noon at Trinity Lutheran. School begins on August 16, 2017. There is an open position for Morning Shepherds Kids from 7:00 a.m. till 8:00

a.m. Monday through Friday when school is in session; this could be a shared position. Volunteers are needed to teach religion for grades 3–5 grades, Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday from 8:25 a.m. till 9:00 a.m.; this could be a shared position. There A financial report is included in the agenda packet.

BOARD OF EVANGELISM (Chelsea Browner): No report was filed

BOARD OF YOUTH (Alyssa Famuliner): Undertaking the study of refraining from using personal credit cards. No report was filed.

BOARD OF ELDERS (Doug Kiehne): Concluded the book study regarding the frequency of communion. "Feed my Lambs" care packages containing *Portals of Prayer* were sent out the week of June 12th to 50 members who had not attended service for an extended time. Proposals have been presented by Pastor Thieme and Ron Barrett for placing a TV screen with various media connections in the library. The idea is to pilot an IT solution for meetings, presentations, trainings, and etc.

BOARD OF SOCIAL MINISTRY (Carol Eggerding): Plans were made for the Circle of Friend's cookout in August. In June, the Board collected \$975.00 for Love INC. They will be collecting school supplies for the Voluntary Action Center starting in July. Tammy Mangold requested the Board work with GSLS to collect food for the Food Bank with a campaign around the Solar Eclipse, called Eclipse Hunger.

BOARD OF STEWARDSHIP AND FINANCE (Fred Luetkemeier): No report was filed

BOARD OF TLC ENDOWMENT FUND (Pete Easterhaus): Balances as of May 31, 2017 are: TLC Fund: \$16,784.01; Youth Ministry Fund: \$12,745.42; Bourret/Elliott Fund: \$32,852.21.

The full financial report for the three funds is included in the agenda packet.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES: (Ken Greer) The failed air compressor has been replaced and the unit appears to be working properly. The Trustees are continuing to clean house in the storage areas. They would like to point out that there are a large number of items on the perimeter of the gym floor and that it is not appropriate to store items in this location. The Trustees would like to thank Karl Christopher who has joined the mowing team. Crum mechanical is still evaluating the dampers and damper control system.

Committee Reports

Executive Committee: The Committee drafted an employee application form and revised the church office secretary ministry description in preparation for hiring a new secretary. Notices for the church office secretary position were published in the *Church News* and the July edition of *News of the Son.*

Five Hundredth Anniversary Committee: No report was filed.

BOARD OF THE MONTH (Board of Early Childhood Education): Virginia Propp was not present; therefore it was

decided that the Board of Early Childhood Education will present in August, along with the Board of Trustees.

A motion was made to accept the Membership Changes; motion seconded and approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT –Ron Barrett, Treasurer Pro Tem For the months ended June 30, 2017, the church income is \$303,902, which is 48% of the total budget for the year. The Learning Center income is \$339,331 which is 56% of the budget for the year. Total income is \$643,233, which is 52% of the

budget for 2017.

2015: Regular Envelope: \$252,791; Loose Plate \$8,179; Tuition \$252.117

2016: Regular Envelope: \$244,990; Loose Plate \$12,429; Tuition \$314,114

Through June 2017: Regular Envelope: \$246,787; Loose Plate \$9,948; Tuition \$328,702

The Treasurer reported that in March 2017, Trinity received a check from Concordia Health Insurance paid during 2016. On April 2, 2017, this amount was credited to a liability account #219. Previously, the BOD had approved that the employee portion of this refund (25%) was to be returned to the employees, by depositing the corresponding funds into their HSA accounts. During the month of June 2017, the Treasurer distributed these funds to the employees. The employee's portion of the refund amounted to \$1,172.25. There were six employees who had paid health insurance in 2016. Two of the employees did not have an HSA account so the Treasurer applied the employee portion on the third payroll check as a negative insurance deduction. The employer portion of \$3,516.75 was credited to Misc. Income for the Church, and for the Learning Center, in proportion to amounts each had paid for Health Insurance in 2016.

The treasurer also reported that the computer program, *Shepherd's Staff* has the ability to maintain and report on monthly budget amounts for each line item (account number). The Treasurer set the monthly "projected" (historic) amounts for the church income accounts, regular envelopes, loose plate, and Sunday School. This will provide a little bit more precise budget to actual reports, rather than using the standard 1/12th amounts. This will allow the Treasurer's Reports to agree with the Financial Secretary's Reports for the budget to actual reporting.

The Treasurer pointed out an error on page 22 of his report included in the agenda packet. The first sentence of the 5th paragraph from the bottom of the page reads:

"The Learning Center expenditures for the six months total

\$339, 331."

The Treasurer asked that it be amended to read:

"The Learning Center expenditures for the six months total \$291,066."

Further details of the treasurer's report are included in the agenda packet.

There was a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report as amended and place it on file. Motion was seconded and approved.

INTRODUCING AND WELCOMING THE DIRECTOR OF CHRISTAIN EDUCATION INTERN: Intern Kali Weishaar was introduced to the members of the BOD.

OLD BUSINESS

<u>CLAS Facility Lease Update</u>: There is no update at this time.

SCOTUS Ruling Discussion: Chairman Glenn informed the BOD that the attorney, from Alliance Defending Freedom, who represented Trinity, is currently in negotiations with the Missouri Attorney General over fees and Trinity's options.

Status of Church Office Secretary Hiring Process: The position was advertised to our Trinity congregation. One individual applied, though they are currently not a member of Trinity.. The search will now be widened by sending out the notice for the church office secretary position to other area LCMS churches.

<u>Discussion of Major Construction Needs</u>: This discussion will be tabled until the next meeting in August. Chairman Glenn directed the various Board representatives to go back to their boards, if they had not already done so, and seek their opinions as to what they feel needs built, if anything.

A motion was made to set the Special AOV Meeting for August 13, 2017, immediately following the late service and to hold the elections stated above and to vote on the motions stated above. Motion was seconded and approved.

TLCLC Credit Card: A motion was made to authorize the Treasurer, Pro Tem to contact the bank to establish a credit card for the Director of the Learning Center, Annette Kiehne, with a limit of \$1,000 per month, for expenditures. Discussion

followed. Motion was seconded and approved.

<u>Sam's Club Card Membership for Kitchen Manager</u>: A motion was made to add the Kitchen Manager for the TLCLC, to the Sam's Club Card membership. Discussion followed. Motion was seconded and approved.

<u>Board of Youth Credit Card</u>: A motion was made to authorize the Treasurer, Pro Tem to contact the bank to establish a credit card for the treasurer of the Board of Youth, Melissa Kiehne, with a limit of \$4,000.00 per month, i.e. a maximum monthly balance of \$4,000.00; the credit card is also to be held in the church office. Discussion followed. The motion was seconded and approved.

<u>Funds for Youth Trip</u>: A motion was made to be permitted to withdraw funds for the Youth Trip to North Dakota from account #242. Motion was seconded and approved.

<u>Israel Trip Funds</u>: A motion was made to establish a dedicated account for the funds Pastor Thieme has received from individuals going on the Israel trip. Discussion followed. The motion was seconded and approved.

<u>Update on Pastor Andry</u>: Though there is nothing that is certain at this point, it appears that he will be able to come back by September and bring his family with him.

<u>Facility Use Requests:</u> There has been a request, per Pastor Thieme, to use one main area and five breakout areas for the Missouri District E2 conference (Encourage and Equip), on Saturday, October 14, 2017 from 8:00 a.m. until 12:00 p.m. Motion was seconded and approved.

There was a request, per Lynne Scharlott, to use the fellowship hall and the gymnasium for a Handbell Musicians of America, Area VIII, Handbell Workshop on November 4, 2017 from 9:00 a.m. until 12:00 p.m. (open from 7:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m.); setup will be Friday evening, November 3, 2017. Motion was seconded and approved.



Greetings in the name of Jesus, who makes every life precious,

Many of you may know the name of Dr. Maggie Karner as the past Director of Life and Health Ministries of the LCMS. After a long battle with glioblastoma multiforme brain cancer, she died September 25, 2015. While living she was a relentless champion of life in all its stages and conditions. She impacted many lives with her message of mercy and willingness to serve others as she served her Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Her legacy of life continues even after her death as the



following blog by her daughter will testify. Dr. Karner and her daughter were featured in a recent issue of the Lutherans Women's Quarterly. Read on to hear part of Dr. Karner's message through her daughter:

Ramblings, Monday, October 5, 2015 (www.marykarner.blogspot.com); For My Mom:

"Okay, I'll admit it: I'm an adrenaline junkie. And judging from the plethora of new TV shows like "Trauma: Life in the ER" or "Code Black," most of America is too. Except that's my life. I'm a Trauma Nurse. I eat, sleep, and breathe trauma. Every time I walk into work with a French vanilla swirl latte in my hand, life and death are waiting for me. And, up till this week, I thought I'd seen just about everything. I've performed CPR till I thought my arms would fall off to keep blood pumping through a child's body. I've administered life-saving medication to a patient having a stroke and seen the joy on his face when he regained his speech. I've had a patient fall through a ceiling onto another patient (I can't even make that up). I've held the hand of patients as they've taken their last breath, and I've hugged family members so tight I couldn't breathe. I really thought I'd seen it all.

"And then last week, my mom died. She had a glioblastoma brain tumor. I knew all about it, even cared for patients with her same diagnosis. I knew what was going to happen. But no matter how much I thought I was ready, I wasn't. Death stings. And my beautiful, 52-year-old mother's grave is freshly dug.

"But my mom's name was Dr. Maggie Karner. And she was the textbook definition of awesome. Don't take my word for it; Google her. She devoted her entire life to helping others and spreading Christ's beautiful gift of mercy for all. I'm not sure I've ever heard my mom speak more passionately than when she was talking about the word "mercy". And that's why my mom used her last days on Earth to campaign against a very dangerous use of that word. A "merciful death" some would call it, or a "right to die".

"My mom is most famous for a YouTube video that went viral entitled, "A Letter to Brittany Maynard." In the video, my mom pleaded with Brittany, who had the same diagnosis, not to commit assisted suicide. Unfortunately, Brittany eventually chose to end her life, but my mom never stopped advocating for life. In her words, "How long will it be before the right to die quickly devolves into the duty to die? What does this mean for all who are elderly, or disabled, or just wondering if they've become a burden to the family?" Even while she was receiving chemotherapy my mom spoke at the Connecticut state house to lobby against a "right to die" bill. The bill did not pass.

"Believe me, terminal illness sucks. There is no way to sugar coat that. It stole my mom from me along with so many others. But it also gave me something that I could never begin to describe: the opportunity to serve her. My family and I cared for her when she could no longer care for herself. We were her left arm when hers was paralyzed. And when that became too much, we had the distinct privilege of being able to visit her at her hospice facility during the last month of her life. She was not herself, and many times confused, but she could laugh. Even up until the day before she died. We laughed about the seagulls that she thought were drones. We laughed about how much she loved chocolate and McFlurrys. We laughed about all the stupid things I did as a kid. And, then, when she could no longer laugh, we sang to her and we prayed with her.

"My mom said it best in an Op-Ed in the *Hartford Courant:* "My brain may be cancerous, but I still have lots to contribute to society as a strong woman, wife, and mother, while my family can daily learn the value of caring for me in my last days with compassion and dignity."

"I'm here to say that she was right. No matter how hard it was and still is. She was so right. And the greatest honor of my life was to care for my mom in her last days. I hope and pray that her legacy will continue to inspire caring American voters to support those choosing to squeeze life for every drop it has to give. Support hospice and palliative care programs that give true meaning to "death with dignity." Let those fighting illness and disabilities know that they are precious, no matter what. They should never have to feel for a second that they might have a "duty to die" just because the option is available." (Mary Karner, RAMBLINGS, Lutheran Woman's quarterly, Summer 2017)

Every life is precious because of what Jesus Christ has done. Dr. Maggie Karner demonstrated that as she lived a life of mercy serving those less fortunate for whom Christ also died. Even in her dying, she taught her daughters and us to serve others in mercy. Whom are you serving today? Don't be deceived by "merciful death" or "right to die". Show mercy by speaking against these deceptive words and pointing to the gift of life.

In Christ, who creates, redeems and calls each person into a personal relationship with Himself, and thus gives value to every human being,

WHY I AM A LUTHERAN...

This may surprise everyone, since many saw me grow up in Trinity, but I really only became a true Lutheran after false teaching (in other heterodox Christian denominations) left me in utter spiritual despair. Confusion started in college when other Christians invited me to different "Christian clubs" on campus and non-Lutheran teachings started to influence me. It became worse when I started attending a nondenominational church across town. A couple years later, I also became influenced by the Charismatic movement. That is when I despaired and was absolutely convinced that if the teachings of these other denominations were true, I had no chance at "getting into heaven". By that point, to my surprise, is that I was suffering from the same problem that terrified Martin Luther's conscience before the Reformation. We both realized "as sinners," if any measure of salvation is dependent on us doing our part, it is something unattainable.

In theological terms, I was struggling with the difference between "Divine Monergism" (salvation is entirely accomplished for you by God), and the error of "Synergism" (you have to contribute works of your human free will to be saved). In comparing these conflicting ideas, I had to study the Scriptures. There, it is made clear that we fix our eyes on Jesus who is the author and perfecter of our faith as we are saved by grace through faith in Christ, and not by our works of the law. While scripture does use language that salvation is both a process and fully accomplished, it is clear that it is "the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast."

I had fallen from the clear teaching of Scripture into the trap of Synergism! Jesus had been reduced into "My Partial Co-Savior." In this burdensome teaching, I hopefully could do a good enough job cooperating together with Jesus, so He and I could "get myself saved." Synergism can take many shapes among denominations. I was troubled, but never fully believed, its forms where I had to "take the first step" in salvation and then Jesus would "take the wheel" and do the remainder. However, I did fall prey to forms where it was taught it's up to me to "keep myself in the faith." These teachings took my eyes off Christ making me His child in baptism, His sufficient redemptive work, He being the author and perfecter of my faith, and His dedicated promises to never leave or forsake me. Instead, Christ was replaced with teachings about what I needed to accomplish with my free will (focusing on my works, my self-dedication, my ability to be less of a sinner, and how sincere and pure my feelings or motivations need to be). Christ's role as my Savior "decreased" and my requirements continued to "increase" as more of "my performing" was given as the answer to my sin problem. Despair came as I looked and still saw "the Sinner" inside me. It seems the older I get, the uglier it "looks inside" as more sins pile up. Also, with many denominations teaching different (and often conflicting) necessary steps a man needs to take in accomplishing his salvation, the "to do" list I needed to accomplish was confusing and cumbersome.

Then, in my studies, I focused back on Lutheranism. It was there is no "checklist" God is waiting for me to accomplish! I heard Divine Monergism is proclaimed in Lutheranism, where Jesus is "THE Savior" who entirely accomplished your salvation, for you. He, alone, took away your sins and gives you his righteousness as a free gift to you. He even creates the faith in you that holds to His gospel promises! Your good works do not contribute to your salvation, but are necessary for the sake of your neighbor whom you are free to love having been saved. Luther summarized, "The Law says, do this and it is never done. Grace says, believe in this, and everything is already done." A major emphasis of the Lutheran Reformation was to shift the focus back to what Jesus has done for us, instead of what we need to do for God in order to merit salvation. God gets all the glory in Lutheranism.

So why am I Lutheran? It was revealed to me by Lutherans teaching scripture, that when I become entangled in the snares of different synergistic theologies, it's my sinful nature trying to manipulate God into saving me. (It's boasting to Him that there's something worthy "in me" that merits my hold to sound doctrine. Confessional Lutherans speak boldly what scripture teaches, but are wise in keeping silent when scripture doesn't give us all the answers, in order to meticulously avoid error. Through the Word and Sacraments, I am delivered by my true Savior Who takes away all my sin, Who is my salvation and righteousness, even though I don't deserve His mercies. Lutherans have the reputation of being the church for people who have been broken by other denominations. That describes me ... The stray Lutheran sheep that Jesus had to gather back into the Lutheran flock ... that is why I am Lutheran.


