hat was Abraham thinking? He had heard the Lord's promise that he would become a great nation. He had heard the Lord promise that he would have descendants as numerous as the stars of the sky, and as numerous as

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION - Mary Frerking

Refrigerator and freezer repairs made, and a bill will be submitted for payment. Children sang on April 29th at Center Sunday to the congregation.

ELDERS - Doug Kiehne

The Elders met on April 24, 2018. Pastor Mueller, our Circuit Visitor met with them to address the vacancy left by Pastor Gerike. The Elders then discussed the Vacation Payout for Pastor Gerike. After gathering documentation of the policy, Pastor Gerike and Pastor Thieme each earn four weeks of vacation per year, a motion was made/approved and the Elders recommend paying the beneficiary of Pastor Gerike four weeks of vacation pay.

TREASURER'S REPORT - Warren Harms (Treasurer)

The attached reports are for the first quarter of 2018 which is 33.3% of the full budget year.

For the month ending April 30, 2018, the Church income is \$54,021, and year to date is \$156,154 (31.9% of the total income budgeted for the year). But this is <\$16,447> or <7.80% > less than in 2017. The major difference from 2017 is that the 301-Regular Envelope is down <\$15,548.50> or <9.1%> less than at the end of April 2017.

The total Learning Center income for April is \$59,516 and \$257,109 for the year to date (37.9% of the budgeted income for the year). The year to date is \$23,307 or 10% greater than in 2017 when the additional classes had not yet been opened.

For the month of April, 2018, Church expenditures are \$33,054, and \$169,127 year to date (27.7% of the annual expense budget of \$609,775).

The Learning Center expenditures for April 2018 total \$51,688 and \$192,907 year to date (28.5% of the annual expense budget of \$677,900).

Total combined income of the church and learning center for the first quarter of 2018 is \$451,580 which is 35.07% of the annual budget. This is \$6,860 higher than in 2017.

Total combined expenses of the church and learning center for the first quarter of 2018 is \$362,033 which is 28.1% of the annual budget. The total combined expenses for the first quarter 2018 are <\$13,792> less than the first quarter of 2017.

Total reserve accounts at Lutheran Church are now \$136,185. I sent a total of \$29,352 to LCEF during April which is the total of designated gifts 269-Construction Fund (members designated Building Fund envelopes) plus the 827-Verizon Cell Tower account. This amount is now the balance of Reserve Account 193-Building Payment Reserve and will earn interest at LCEF.

Andrew Saeger moved to approve the Treasurer's Report; seconded and approved.

DAVID ATTEBERY (Short Wave Radios):

David Attebery answered questions the BOD had regarding possible usher use of short wave radios. He stated that the radios would not be used by ushers to patrol the parking lot, but could be helpful in various situations. Ken Greer suggested looking into creating a "Board of Security".

TRUSTEES - Ken Greer

Ken Greer reported that the AC unit broke down this past week in Annette's office. It will cost \$3,000 to fix. He told them to proceed to fix it. Pastor Thieme's office AC line was frozen, but is now working. A roof AC unit is still not working correctly. Mary Frerking moved we recommend to the AOV to spend the \$3000 on TLCLC AC; seconded and approved. Mary Frerking moved to authorize the Executive Committee to approve the fixing of any future AC problems if needed; seconded and approved.

Surveillance System

The following is from the April 2018 BOD Meeting: This revised proposal from Sound Solutions is due to the closing of GSLS. This proposal eliminates all cameras in the basement. It covers exterior entrances, playgrounds and parking for a total of 10 cameras. Price reduced to \$23,560 plus the \$30 monthly charge. Monitors could be in the TLCLC office and church office. Andrew Saeger moved to accept the revised proposal; seconded and approved. Therefore this action will be taken to the AOV Meeting on Sunday, May 20th.

Intercom System

AED Maintenance Agreement

Neil stated the fire department does not have their AED's certified and to possibly call the manufacturer before paying the money. Andrew Saeger reported that he called the manufacturer. They stated we need to get them certified to be covered by the Good Samaritan Law of Missouri. Mary Frerking moved we spend the \$700 to have them certified; seconded and approved.

EARLY CHILDHOOD ED.: Virginia Propp

Virginia updated the AOV on the status of the current TLCLC Grant Application. Originally the AOV set aside \$10,000, but may need to raise it to \$13,000 to cover our cost. Also we have to pay \$30,000 for sections 1 & 2, in full to the vendor. Then we get reimbursed by the State. Virginia Propp moved we spend up to \$13,000 for Sections 1 & 2, not 3. And we pay \$30,000 and get reimbursed by State. All contingent on IF WE GET THE GRANT. Seconded. Discussion. There are members willing to help with the site prep. This could help lower costs. Approved.
