### "The Words and Promises of Christ"

he family was in pain. They had resigned themselves to seeing mom waste away. With mom's fading consciousness and failing health, why come visit? Prayers at church would be enough. They told me there was no reason to come and visit. She wouldn't even know I was there.

Their mother sat alone in the living room as we dined in the kitchen. Their mother was dressed and ready to go. She had been unresponsive whether lying down or sitting in her wheelchair. Days, weeks, and even months had passed since she had last been part of any kind of conversation.

With dinner over and the conversation ended, it was time to engage this child of God. Here was an unresponsive person sitting alone in the living room. What was I to say or do for her? Sitting down in front of her, I turned to the Lord (ok Lord you got me into this, now what?)

"Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life" (John 6:68).

I began to sing an old faithful hymn she would know from childhood. A hymn filled with Christ and His word. Stanza after stanza the hymn laid out who we were and who God was. Promise after promise of a loving Jesus was poured forth in song. Hope was carried by an ancient tune. And mom? Her lips began to move. She was trying to sing along.

Now to Psalm 23 -- As the words spoken by the Holy Spirit, written by David, rolled across my tongue and into her ears, this child of God responded with her eyes opening and her lips softly proclaiming these very same words.

Together we approached the throne of grace praying the prayer the Lord had taught us. Her eyes were fully open. With her head up she found herself not alone, but in the presence of the Lord and His people. The Lord's Prayer was prayed to the fullest. Each and every word pronounced clearly, distinctly and loudly.

Each subsequent visit was made in the same manner, going to the Lord who has the words of eternal life. They went on that is, until the day she was called to her eternal heavenly home.

Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God (Colossians 3:16).

Because hymns and liturgies had filled her life with the words and promises of Christ, the Holy Spirit could draw them up out of memories in the hours she needed them most. May the Lord fill your life and memories with His words and promises.



#### JUNE 12, 2018 BOARD OF DIRECTORS MINUTES

(Draft Minutes - Yet to be Approved)

The regular monthly meeting of the Board of Directors was called to order on June 12, 2018 at 7:00 p.m. Attendees included Gary Kespohl (Chairman), Jacque Eckhoff (Secretary), Andrew Saeger, Mary Frerking, JoAnn Schoenike, Carol Morrison, Pattie Smith, Warren Harms, Annette Kiehne, Pastor Brian Thieme, Ken Greer, Virginia Propp, Melissa Kiehne and Doug Kiehne.

Pastor Thieme gave the opening devotion.

Ken Greer asked to add Trustee Requests to New Business on the Meeting Agenda. Mary Frerking moved to accept the Meeting Agenda with this addition; seconded and approved.

Andrew Saeger distributed an updated report for the Board of Evangelism, as the back page had been mistakenly omitted. Warren Harms moved to accept the Consent Agenda, including the Minutes of the May 8, 2018 Meeting and the updated Board of Evangelism report; seconded and approved.

The Consent Agenda meeting minutes and reports are filed in the Congregation Secretary's notebook. The following are summaries of the reports, with the name of the board representative at the Board of Directors meeting listed:

#### PASTOR'S REPORT - Pastor Thieme

Rev. Spotts is visiting 2/3 of the "homebound" each month (started in April), and Pastor Thieme visits 1/3.

At some point a presentation on the Holy Land trip will be given to the congregation.

Adult Classes: There are three couples going through premarital classes, three individuals are taking the adult information class, Sunday morning is going through I Peter, and the Monday morning class is going through the Large Catechism.

One individual was baptized June 10th. June 17th at 10:30 Service a Profession of Faith for two individuals, and June 24th at 8:00 Service for one individual.

July 13th will be the last day for the DCEI.

DIRECTOR OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION INTERN - Not Present

No report filed.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY - JoAnn Schoenike

For the month of May, the Regular Envelope collections are 98.41% of the anticipated monthly amount. Loose Plate collections are 91.01% and Sunday School are 119.16%. The Total Monthly collections are 98.20% of the monthly anticipated amount.

The Total Year to Date collections through the end of May are 95.79% of the anticipated amount of \$216,963.

#### **BOARD REPORTS:**

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION - Mary Frerking

Sunday School is currently on its summer schedule, allowing regular teachers to have a break until Rally Sunday. VBS is scheduled for July 10-13th, from 5:30-8:00 PM. Set up will be Sunday, July 8th, from noon to completion. Lunch will be provided. The registration link and volunteer sign up have been emailed to congregation members and posted on the Sunday School bulletin board. Rally Sunday is set for August 26th. Kali will complete her work with TLC as Music Coordinator for VBS.

#### EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION - Virginia Propp

Summer 2018 has eight classrooms. For Fall/Spring 2018-19 there is 1 FT toddler spot and 1 TTh preK spot yet to be filled. TLCLC is fully staffed for the summer.

TLCLC will make an offer to a teacher to replace PreK teacher that resigned.

TLCLC passed their Fire Dept. Inspection on 6/7/28, and their Health Dept. Sanitation Inspection on 6/8/18.

First day of Summer Session was June 5th, and the last day will be August 8th.

#### ELDERS - Doug Kiehne

The Elders met on May 29, 2018. The Board passed a motion affirming Pastor Thieme's trip to Israel was paid work time. Pastor Thieme will try to schedule a time for Pastor Gene Wyssman to meet with the Board of Elders while he is in Columbia June 10-12. Topic of discussion will be a potential congregational survey. The Board is recommending a Special AOV Meeting on July 15th to address a change for Pastor Thieme to sole Pastor. Pay for visiting preachers was again discussed. A motion was passed to clarify any discrepancies by following District guidelines. Finally, the Board assigned a Benefits Subcommittee to address benefits recommendations for called workers.

#### **EVANGELISM - Pattie Smith**

The Board of Evangelism met on May 21, 2018. Mary Frerking, chairman of the BOCE, was present to discuss working with BOE on Family Fun Day (Rally Sunday) in conjunction with the BOE Ice Cream Social. Leftover snack bags from Finals Week for college students will be offered at the Christian Storytelling Conference at the end of June. Suggestions were discussed on how to welcome visitors to TLC. Participation in the Christian Storytelling Conference was also discussed.

PAROCHIAL EDUCATION - No Representative Present

SOCIAL MINISTRY - Carol Morrison

The Board met on May 1, 2018 for their monthly meeting. They continue to collect food items for the Food Bank and deliver to them. Pastor Thieme's Storytelling Conference Cookout will be provided by Board of Social Ministry.

The shelter at Fairview Park has been reserved for June 27th from 2:00-10:00 PM.

The Board will also be helping with VBS.

STEWARDSHIP & FINANCE - Andrew Saeger

No report filed.

TRINITY LUTHERAN CHURCH ENDOWMENT FUND - No Representative Present

No report filed.

TRUSTEES - Ken Greer

As time permits, the Trustees will be replacing thermostats in education and office wing with the programmable thermostats removed from the sanctuary and basement. Other topics of discussion at the June Trustees meeting were replacement of one of two AC compressors in 10 ton units, extension of ductwork ceiling vents in basement, the Septagon contract for the TLCLC bathroom addition, and the disconnect of electrical service to the modular building.

No report filed.

MEMBERSHIP CHANGES:

JoAnn Schoenike moved to accept changes; seconded and approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT - Warren Harms

The attached reports are for the first five months of 2018 which is 41.7% of the full budget year.

For the month ending May 31, 2018, the Church income is \$44,196 and year to date is \$238,667 (39.14% of the total income budgeted for the year). This is <\$17,520> or <6.84%> less than in 2017. The major difference from 2017 is that the 301-Regular Envelope is down <\$12,919> or <6.2%> less than at the end of May 2017.

The total Learning Center income for May is \$58,418 and \$315,527 for the year to date (46.5% of the budgeted income for the year).

For the month of May, 2018, Church expenditures are \$42,492, and \$211,619 year to date (34.7% of the annual expense budget of \$609,775).

The Learning Center expenditures for May 2018 total \$49,932 and \$242,839 year to date (35.82% of the annual expense budget of \$677,900).

In May, we paid the assisting pastors a total of \$1,976 in salary and mileage for their services in assisting Pastor Thieme in the pulpit, Sunday School, and member visits for April and May. These pastors are reporting their individual services performed to Pastor Thieme, the treasurer and the Board of El-

Page 4 ders. They are being paid through the same pay-

roll service as the pastor, secretary, organists, and TLCLC director and staff.

Total reserve accounts at Lutheran Church Extension Fund are now \$136,218. There is currently no building loan on the books.

Andrew Saeger moved to approve the Treasurer's Report; seconded and approved.

**OLD BUSINESS:** 

Surveillance System Update

Chairman Kespohl spoke to David Attebery and the official install is scheduled for July 9-11, 2018.

Together In Mission (TIM)

TLC would partner with a missionary. We can specifically choose Erin Mackenzie. The church would set a budget amount, and congregation members could give extra. We would need AOV approval to participate. Pastor Thieme suggested that if we are interested and want to move forward we can ask Erin to visit TLC. Andrew Saeger moved that we invite Erin Mackenzie to visit/speak at TLC and then get feedback from congregation members; seconded and approved.

**NEW BUSINESS:** 

Plans for Improvements to Back Parking Lot once Portable Classroom is removed:

Chairman Kespohl stated that CLAS is taking inventory of the trailer. He will ask CLAS to order the disconnect of electricity to the trailer on July 1, 2018. A member of CLAS has made arrangements for the trailer to be removed. Once the trailer is removed, decisions will need to be made regarding the back parking lot.

Format and Scheduling of AOV Meetings:

Virginia Propp brought the information to the attention of the BOD. There are things that could be changed at TLC regarding the format and scheduling of AOV Meetings. Andrew Saeger moved that this topic go to the Constitution Review Committee; seconded and approved.

Request Change in Policy for Purchases over \$500 needing AOV Approval: See Above Motion

Basement Room Requests:

Handbell Choir

Chairman Kespohl suggested maybe Choir could share the space with the Handbell Choir. Handbell Choir is hoping for the GSLS First Grade room.

Sunday School

They would want all five GSLS classrooms for Sunday School. Mary Frerking moved to approve permanent usage of the basement classrooms for the Sunday School Program, who would then share the spaces with the Handbell Choir, and other groups as requested; seconded and approved.

LFCS Chipotle Fundraiser Advertising

JoAnn Schoenike moved that the Chipotle flyer be put in the church bulletin the weekend of June 17th; seconded and approved.

Standing Rules

Chairman Kespohl and Pastor Thieme have discussed having Standing Rules for AOV Meetings. Examples being setting a maximum length of time that individuals can speak, number of times an individual can speak, etc. The purpose of Standing Rules is so everyone is heard and a small number do not dominate. Chairman Kespohl would like suggestions of Standing Rules. Ken Greer suggested that BOD members could email suggestions to Chairman Kespohl. All agreed.

#### Trustees

The Trustees met on Saturday, June 9, 2018. They have two recommendations for the BOD. One, Trustees recommend for TLC to receive legal counsel on an "as

need" basis for contracts. Two, Trustees recognize the TLCLC bathroom project needs to designate a Project Manager. They suggest it be Ken Greer, Virginia Propp, Larry Propp, or some member of the Facility Planning Committee. Chairman Kespohl asked how much time the Project Manager would need to spend on site. Annette asked to be made aware of who it will be so she can communicate with them. JoAnn Schoenike moved that Chairman Kespohl appoint a Project Manager for the upcoming TLCLC bathroom project; seconded and approved.

Mary Frerking moved that TLC establish a relationship with legal counsel for contracts, with the BOD choosing the counsel. Seconded. Discussion. Who would we consider? Chairman Kespohl will bring a list to next month's BOD meeting. Approved.

#### Elders

Regarding the Ministry Timeline and Plan, the Board of Elders is recommending a Special AOV Meeting on July 15, 2018 to address a change for Pastor Thieme to sole Pastor. Doug Kiehne asked the BOD if that date is workable. All seemed to think that date would work.

After some conflicts between motions and paperwork were found, the Board of Elders revisited the pay for visiting preachers. A motion was passed at the May 29th Board of Elders Meeting to clarify any discrepancies by following District guidelines of \$125 for one service, \$160 for two services, and \$200 for three services. Doug Kiehne moved that the Board of Directors also approve this motion to follow District guidelines on the topic; seconded and approved.

#### ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Next Meeting of the Board of Directors is scheduled to be held on July 10, 2018. That date is during VBS, therefore Pastor Thieme could not attend BOD. BOD members agreed to change the date of the meeting to July 17th at 6:30 PM.

Read Built on the Rock Chapter 7 for July 17th.

Andrew Saeger moved to adjourn the meeting at 8:34 p.m.; seconded and approved.

Pastor Thieme led the group in closing prayer.

#### INFORMATION FROM THE BOARD OF ELDERS JUNE 26, 2018

It has been over one month since our last written update to the congregation. Some of the information below was shared with those in attendance at the May 20 Assembly of Voters (AOV) meeting, but this will be a good opportunity to provide a current status of the activities related to the efforts to put forth a plan to the congregation on how we are moving forward with properly staffing our church in the short- and long-term.

We had a productive meeting in mid-May with our current Circuit Visitor, Pastor David Mueller, of St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Fulton. He relayed to us some important thoughts to keep in mind as we move forward as a congregation:

He suggested we be sensitive to the fact that the congregation is working through a 12-month "grieving period" as we continue to have annual festivals (Easter, Pentecost, etc.), activities, and events without Pastor Gerike for the first time in over 30 years.

He recommended that we resist the urge to rush the process of deciding how we move forward with the addition of a full-time church worker(s) at Trinity but take a deliberate approach and "get it right."

He urged us to work quickly to identify resources to assist Pastor Thieme with his regular duties and the new tasks that he now has without his long-time ministry partner.

The Elders and Board of Directors have acted on item 3 by putting a process in place to regularly obtain the help of other pastors in our parish, for assistance with preaching at Sunday/Monday services, for making calls to members who are shut-in or hospitalized, and other tasks as needed. We wish to thank them for making themselves available – Pastor Riggert, Pastor Spotts, Pastor Whittle –and encourage you to do the same.

One item that Pastor Mueller discussed with us, as did District President Hagan, is that the pulpit at Trinity Lutheran Church is not vacant. It is, however, being filled in a different manner, as it is no longer shared by two pastors. The Board of Elders is acting on clarifying this matter with the parish-family at Trinity Lutheran Church in Columbia, Missouri by recognizing Pastor Thieme as sole pastor with the intent to present this at a special Assembly of Voters meeting in July.

Finally, we plan to follow the special AOV meeting with a "Congregational Self-Study" survey. This is a tool provided by the Synodical office that is often used by congregations when they are considering calling an additional pastor or other full-time church worker. As is common with such efforts, the survey tool is now online. Arrangements will be made for those that would prefer a traditional hard copy survey. Please look for more information on this in the service bulletins, Church News, etc.

In the same fashion that we closed the previous update, the Board asks the members of the congregation to pray for God-pleasing deliberations, actions, and decisions as we move forward together as part of the Visible Church here in Columbia, Missouri.
