#### How Long Do I Hold onto Sin?

he boy wearing his robe of many colors went to find his brothers. He was sent by his father to see if they and the flock were doing well. When he approached, they took hold of him and planned to kill him, because jealousy burned in their hearts. Instead of killing sold him to a slave trader who took the boy far from their sight.

him they sold him to a slave trader who took the boy far from their sight, their family, and their land. He was seventeen at the time.

He suffered much after that time (slavery, prison, etc.), but he was also blessed by the Lord. His name was Joseph. As you may remember the story (Genesis 37; 39-50) he became the second most powerful man in Egypt. He used that power to bring his father and family to safety. He freed them from a famine and gave them a place to live. Many years later when Joseph's father died, the brothers were still hanging on to their sin. They feared for their lives. This could well be the time that Joseph would pay them back for their evil.

<sup>15</sup> When Joseph's brothers saw that their father was dead, they said, "It may be that Joseph will hate us and pay us back for all the evil that we did to him." <sup>16</sup> So they sent a message to Joseph, saying, "Your father gave this command before he died: <sup>17</sup> 'Say to Joseph, "Please forgive the transgression of your brothers and their sin, because they did evil to you." 'And now, please forgive the transgression of the servants of the God of your father."... (Genesis 50).

They lied to cover their sin.

What did Joseph do? Did he hang onto this sin? No, Joseph wept when they spoke to him.

<sup>18</sup> His brothers also came and fell down before him and said, "Behold, we are your servants." <sup>19</sup> But Joseph said to them, "Do not fear, for am I in the place of God? <sup>20</sup> As for you, you meant evil against me, but God meant it for good, to bring it about that many people should be kept alive, as they are today. <sup>21</sup> So do not fear; I will provide for you and your little ones." Thus he comforted them and spoke kindly to them (Genesis 50).

Joseph covered their sin with the forgiveness of God.

I have observed in Scripture and over many years, that holding onto sins destroys the person holding them. Whenever we try to share that sin or cover it up by any other means (telling others –gossip, revenge, grudges, lies, etc), it brings shame, chaos, and destruction to the life of the holder. True freedom from sin, as Joseph knew it, comes from sins being covered by the blood of Christ. Not just our sins, but the sins done against us.

<sup>13</sup> But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. <sup>14</sup> For he himself is our peace, who has made us both one and has broken down in his flesh the dividing wall of hostility (Ephesians 2 – this wall is the one between us and God, but this also holds true of the wall between fellow believers.).

Holding onto sin does no one any good. "Behold, now is the favorable time; behold, now is the day of salvation" (II Corinthians 6:2b). Christ brings us joy! Let us rejoice with one another in it.

The Total Monthly collections are 108.42% of the monthly anticipated amount of \$38,976. The Total Year to Date collections through the end of June are 97.71% of the anticipated amount of \$255.939.

#### MEMBERSHIP CHANGES:

Andrew Saeger moved to accept changes; seconded and approved.

#### TREASURER'S REPORT - Warren Harms (Treasurer)

The attached reports are for the six months ended June 30 2018. For the month ending June 30, 2018, the Church income is \$50,187 and year to date is \$288,855 (47.37% of the total income budgeted for the year). This is <\$14,801> or <4.87%> less than in 2017. The major difference from 2017 is that the 301-Regular Envelope is down <\$10,155> or <4.1%> less than at the end of June 2017.

The total Learning Center income for June is \$58,241 and \$373,768 for the year to date (55.1% of the budgeted income for the year).

For the month of June, 2018, Church expenditures are \$63,470, and \$275,088 year to date (45.1% of the annual expense budget of \$609,775). The church expenses were \$21,000 higher in June than in May. There was just over \$11,000 down payment made to Sound Solutions for the security camera system. There was \$14,370 paid to Missouri District-LCMS in account 583-Synod and District Missions as 10% of Trinity's surplus in 2017 per the May 20 Assembly of Voters meeting.

The Learning Center expenditures for June 2018 total \$68,169 and \$311,008 year to date (45.52% of the annual expense budget of \$677,900). The June expenses were \$18,237 more than in May. The largest account difference in the two months is \$14,889 in 703-Salaries as there were three pay periods in June.

Total reserve accounts at Lutheran Church Extension Fund are now \$192,888. I sent \$56,547 to account 190-Capital Outlay Reserve. The May assembly of voters approved sending to this account the 2017 budget surplus of \$143,696 less 10% for Synod & District Missions, less planned bathroom project, less \$3,000 expected HVAC replacement, less \$23,000 for the surveillance camera system. These projects will be paid out of the 2018 bank account and overrun budget items of capital outlays or repairs.

There is currently no building loan on the books.

Virginia Propp moved to approve the Treasurer's Report; seconded and approved.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

Surveillance System Update

Six cameras, one monitor, and control equipment have been installed and are operational. Remaining cameras will be installed after the City of Columbia installs a meter to operate the parking lot camera.

#### Together In Mission (TIM) Update

On Monday Pastor Thieme received an email from Erin MacKenzie stating she has no open Sundays available to visit. Instead she could Skype this fall, send a video, or share her blog. Warren Harms moved to support Erin through TIM and proceed with moving forward; seconded and approved. Pastor Thieme will contact her. Contact information is erin.mackenzie@lcmsintl.org

#### Standing Rules for AOV

Chairman Kespohl reviewed the list of proposed Standing Rules. Virginia Propp moved to accept the proposed list and recommend it to the AOV; seconded and approved. The complete list of proposed Rules can be found in the Congregation Secretary's notebook.

#### Septagon Contract

Septagon has a signed contract for the TLCLC Bathroom Project. They will go to the City for approval of the drawings. Pending City approval, Septagon plans to start the project in August.

#### Attorneys to Read Contracts

Chairman Kespohl will have a list at the August BOD Meeting of possible attorneys who could ready over TLC contracts.

#### NEW BUSINESS:

#### Request to Increase BOECE Membership

The BOECE is asking to add members to their board, which currently has three members. This is something that can be changed by the Assembly of Voters.

Trustees also mentioned it could use extra help. According to the Constitution and By-Laws of Trinity Lutheran Church, 8.2.2.10, "Each board may appoint sub-committees at any time to assist with special projects or assigned duties of its board."

#### **GSLS** Purchases

Chairman Kespohl reviewed a list of GSLS Inventory that TLCLC would like to purchase. The complete Inventory List can be found in the Congregation Secretary's notebook.

When GSLS items are sold, Campus gets 40% and Trinity gets 60%. The items TLCLC would like to purchase at this time total \$987.50. Decisions still need to be made regarding the playground equipment and Promethean boards. The Trinity BOD wants to revisit the items of playground equipment and promethean boards at the August meeting. Andrew Saeger moved to approve \$987.50 for TLCLC to purchase items; seconded and approved.

Storytelling Conference: June 26-29, 2019

The 2018 Conference was very successful, and many extended a huge thank you for our hospitality. Andrew Saeger moved that Trinity Lutheran Church host the Storytelling Conference again next year; seconded and approved.

Facility Request (Childcare Aware)

Annette Kiehne explained that Childcare Aware is a Preschool training in Missouri. The program needs the use of facilities, and would like to use Trinity Lutheran Church for these trainings. Annette or another TLCLC employee would attend. Training are in the evenings. Annette will look at specific dates, but the facility use would be in October, November and December. Virginia Propp moved to approve the use of Trinity Lutheran Church for Childcare Aware trainings in October, November and December of 2018, with dates pending on facility use; seconded and approved.

#### TLC Pens

Andrew Saeger has spoken with the Board of Evangelism about purchasing pens that promote Trinity Lutheran Church. It would be 1200 pens for just under \$500.

Andrew Saeger moved to approve \$500 from Capital Outlays for promotional pens; Second. Discussion. JoAnn Schoenike amended the motion to take the \$500 from Board of Evangelism budget. Andrew Saeger gave a friendly second to the amendment, approved.

Academy Preschool

Chairman Kespohl spoke about Academy Preschool, which is a facility in Columbia that recently completely flooded. They are quickly cleaning and rebuilding. They could be done Tuesday, but possibly a week from Friday. He asked if it was possible to help by letting them use GSLS empty classrooms for some of their kids. It would be for approximately a week. Virginia Propp shared that there are several reasons we could not help...licensing issues, unnecessary wear and tear, liability, safety, and TLCLC might need the space. Licensing for those classrooms could not happen within the specified time frame, therefore we are unable to let them use the facility.

Rally Sunday

Doug McDowell noted that in the Board of Evangelism report, on page 14 of the BOD packet, there is an error. Rally Sunday is August 26th, not the 19th.

#### ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Next meeting of the Board of Directors is scheduled to be held on August 14, 2018.

Andrew Saeger moved to adjourn the meeting at 8:21 pm; seconded and approved.

Pastor Thieme led the group in closing prayer.

#### Greetings in the name of Jesus, the Way, the Truth and the Life,

The president of Lutherans For Life, Lynette Auch, recently shared her thoughts about Truth in the following article entitled, **VOICE OF TRUTH:** 



As a nurse, I belong to the most trusted profession in the U.S. (according to the Gallup polls). I take that trust very personally. I want to be trusted; therefore, I want the information that I share with patients or clients to be accurate and truthful and based on evidence from credible, independent, well-done research studies----so that my voice will be a voice of truth.

My daughter's recent pregnancy and delivery of a beautiful and healthy baby girl----another masterpiece by God's hand---spurred me to do further research into an area of nursing that I have been a part of for over 26 years: Obstetric and Newborn Nursing. Although I am required to stay current with the protocols of the healthcare system where I am employed, my research indicated that some standard ("routine") care given is not necessarily evidence based. I found this very disturbing.

## But, should I be surprised when society burns with half-truths and lies? We live in a world where wrong things are considered right, and right things are considered wrong.

God's Word, the Voice of Truth, beckons us to do as the Bereans did, to examine the Scriptures to see if the things that Paul taught were really true (Acts 17:11). We must live as the Bereans did, testing everything against the plumb line of God's Holy Word.

Since 1973, when abortion was accepted as a legal alternative to pregnancy, healthcare professionals have been confronted by an ever-increasing number of morally challenging life issues---and the list of ethical dilemmas continues to grow: in vitro fertilization, cloning, fetal experimentation, organ donation and transplantation, nutrition and hydration, patient rights, certain sterilization practices, looming rationing of medical resources, assisted suicide and euthanasia, and stem cell research with its promise of advances in the treatment of disease.

How does this myriad of biotechnology and life issues measure up to God's plumb line? We cannot let ourselves be spoon-fed with whatever "supposed" truths the media, or society at large want us to believe. It is imperative that we research and seek out the "real" truth, then search the Scriptures and ask God to reveal to us His good and prefect will.

From God's Word we know this:

God created us! "For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb....My frame was not hidden from you when I was made in the secret place...Your eyes saw my unformed body; all the days ordained for me were written in your book before one of them came to be" (Psalm 139:13, 15-16 NIV)

Murder is wrong! "You shall not murder" (Exodus 20:13 NIV)

Our body is not our own; we were bought at a price! "Do you not know that your bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit, who is in you, whom you have received from God? You are not your own; you were bought at a price" (1 Cor. 6:19-20a)

Just because something can be done, does not mean it should be done. "I have the right to do anything,' you say---but not everything is beneficial. I have the right to do anything---but I will not be mastered by anything." (1 Cor. 6:12 NIV)
