

## Your God



The word barak (  $1 \frac{1}{2}$ ) in Hebrew means to bless. As in the familiar words of Numbers 6:22-24:

The LORD bless you and keep you;

the LORD make his face to shine upon you and be gracious to you; the LORD lift up his countenance upon you and give you peace.

In our culture we might think of a blessing as a material thing, good health, or even a peaceful life. These may well be considered blessings from God, but Job chapter one reminds us that the taking away of these things is also a blessing from God. However, this definition of a blessing still does not capture what our Heavenly Father has in mind for us to be blessed by Him.

In order to know what the Lord has in mind, we need to understand the Hebrew language. "Every word in the Ancient Hebrew language was related to an image of action, something that could be sensed (as observed by the five senses – seen, heard, smelled, tasted, or touched) and in motion."

Let us take the example of "anger" in the Old Testament. Anger in Hebrew literally means to "flare your nostrils." It sounds funny, but think about it. When people are angry, their nostrils will literally flare. A very vivid picture of anger is portrayed.

And so the picture that the ancient Hebrew paints for God's people when they hear the word "bless" (barak) is the picture of someone "kneeling". To bless someone is to come before them in a humbled manner (kneeling).

SO when the Lord Almighty, the creator of heaven and earth, and the maker of the universe blesses **you**, He humbles Himself (as if kneeling before you) to keep you, to be gracious unto you, and to give you peace.

Toss aside the idea of a god as some old man in heaven waiting to judge you (you can get that from any other religion). Cling instead to the God who kneels before you (humbles Himself – Philippians 2). He who was first became last, stepping down from His heavenly thrown to become one of us. Why? That we who were last would become first. He, who knew no sin, became sin.

This is the Christ of grace and mercy that as a pastor I am to ensure continues in your pulpit and at your altar, in your bible classes, and by the grace of God in your daily lives.

## SEPTEMBER 11, 2018 BOARD OF DIRECTORS MINUTES

(Draft Minutes - Yet to be Approved)

The regular monthly meeting of the Board of Directors was called to order on September 11, 2018 at 7:00 p.m. Attendees included Gary Kespohl (Chairman), Jacque Eckhoff (Secretary), JoAnn Schoenike, Doug McDowell, Virginia Propp, Doug Kiehne, Annette Kiehne, Chris Bailey, Andrew Saeger, Warren Harms, Ken Greer and Pastor Brian Thieme.

Pastor Thieme gave the opening devotion.

Virginia Propp added Septagon Change Order to Old Business. Warren Harms moved to accept the Meeting Agenda with this addition; seconded and approved.

Virginia Propp moved to accept the Consent Agenda, including August 14, 2018 Minutes; seconded and approved. The Consent Agenda, meeting minutes, and reports are filed in the Congregation Secretary's notebook. The following are summaries of the reports, with the name of the board representative at the Board of Directors meeting listed:

## PASTOR'S REPORT - Pastor Thieme

Pastoral Help: Rev. Spotts is leading the Divine Services Sept. 30/Oct. 1.

Missouri District Duties: August 19th - Installation in Stringtown, MO. September 15th - Presenting state of the Missouri District to the LLL Convention (Columbia). September 30th-October 2nd - Missouri District Pastor's Conference (Lake of the Ozarks).

Adult Classes: Three individuals are taking the adult information class, Sunday morning is going through I Peter, and the Monday morning class is going through the Large Catechism.

Bible Classes for New Members: Looking to train leaders and start new classes.

Jr. Confirmation will begin September 16th.

## FINANCIAL SECRETARY - JoAnn Schoenike

For the month of August, the Regular Envelope collections are 86.16% of the anticipated monthly amount. Loose Plate collections are 127.54% and Sunday School are 92.51%. The Total Monthly collections are 87.44% of the monthly anticipated amount of \$43,082. The Total Year to Date collections through the end of August are 97.56% of the anticipated amount of \$334,754.

#### **BOARD REPORTS:**

## CHRISTIAN EDUCATION - No Rep. Present

The BOCE began using the former GSLS classrooms on Rally Sunday. They also purchased and have paid for several items from GSLS. Sunday School Fall curriculum began on Sunday, September 2nd. The Board is blessed to have all teachers from last year returning to teach again this year.

## EARLY CHILDHOOD ED. - Virginia Propp

TLCLC will have a T/Th toddler opening as of October 16, 2018 when the parents move. There will also be a T/Th tod-

dler opening January 1, 2019 when a child changes from full time to MWF. Annette will contact Marilyn Simmons to begin work with a Curriculum Committee for the purchase of new curriculum materials. Intercom installation is complete. The Toddler Playground was closed on September 1st and will remain closed for about a month to allow for the site work for upcoming installation of the pour-in-place surface.

## ELDERS - Doug Kiehne

The Elders met on August 28, 2018. Rev. Spotts continues to help with visiting shut-ins. The Benefits Subcommittee presented a final recommendation for clarifying benefits for called workers not covered by the personnel manual. The Elders seek feedback from the BOD in the form of a motion to adopt the recommendations. The congregational survey was finalized and will run September 7-24. Discussions about the schedule of worship for 2019 have begun.

## EVANGELISM - Doug McDowell

The Board of Evangelism met August 20, 2018. Andrew reported that Snow Creek Apparel suggested they could set up an online store for members to place orders and submit payment for TLC shirts. 1200 pens will be purchased as giveaways. They will not be available through the online store. Trunk or Treat will be held October 28, 2018 from 3:00-5:00 PM. A Serving Trailer Project was discussed. Ideas were given to have a TLC sponsored trailer loaded with items to help with future service projects, including tools for painting and gardening.

## PAROCHIAL EDUCATION - No Rep. Present

## SOCIAL MINISTRY - No Rep. Present

The Board met on August 6, 2018. A Circle of Friends cookout was held August 11th. August 26-27 the Board started the collection supporting Voluntary Action for Warm-Up Columbia. Food items are still being collected for the Food Bank. The amount collected for the LFCS Baby Bottle Boomering during VBS was \$453.83. Trinity Senior Group Day Trip to Sight and Sound Theater took place September 6th.

## STEWARDSHIP & FINANCE - Andrew Saeger

Stewardship & Finance held a work meeting on August 21st. During the meeting the Board assembled the informational letter and an example of the Stewardship election form for mailing to each communicate member. The Walk of Faith will be held during the September 23rd services. Also, during the month, the offering count continued per the agreed upon schedule.

## TRINITY LUTHERAN CHURCH ENDOWMENT FUND - No Rep. Present. No report filed.

#### YOUTH - Chris Bailey

The Board of Youth is working on new Sunday School Curriculum. Planning for the National Youth Gathering in July 2019 has started. The informational meeting for youth and their families is set for September 16th at 12:00 PM.

## COMMITTEE REPORTS:

## EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Members of the Executive Committee met August 27, 2018 at 6:30 PM to discuss the upcoming evaluation of the Church Secretary, Andrew Saeger. Chairman Kespohl distributed information to the Committee to read before reconvening on September 4, 2018. On this date the information was discussed and the Performance Evaluation Sheet was completed. Members of the Committee, along with Pastor Thieme, met with Andrew on September 5, 2018 for his Evaluation. The Committee agreed to a raise of \$.50 more per hour.

## MEMBERSHIP CHANGES:

JoAnn Schoenike moved to accept the Membership Changes & Profession of Faith; seconded and approved.

## TREASURER'S REPORT - Warren Harms

For the month ending August 31, 2018, the Church income is \$41,020 and year to date is \$380,270 (62.36% of the total income budgeted for the year). This is <\$29,823> or <7.27%> less than in 2017. The major difference from 2017 is that the 301-Regular Envelope is down <\$16,658> or <4.99%> less than at the end of August 2017. The total Learning Center income for August is \$62,500 and \$487,133 for the year to date (71.86% of the budgeted income for the year). For the month of August 2018, Church expenditures are \$34,978, and \$341,112 year to date (55.9% of the annual expense budget of \$609,775). The Learning Center expenditures for August 2018 total \$3,348 and \$415,286 year to date 61.3% of the annual expense budget of \$677,900. Total reserve accounts at Lutheran Church Extension Fund are now \$197,613. There is currently no building loan on the books.

During August, Trinity wrote two checks for a total of just over \$1,400 to Columbia Lutheran Association of Schools for remaining supplies, chairs, rugs, small furniture left in the inventory of Good Shepherd Lutheran School. These materials will be used by the Sunday school classes and Trinity Lutheran Child Learning Center. The Board of Christian Education had two expenditures totaling around \$600 for some room furnishings and Rally Sunday expenses.

The Learning Center has implemented a new tuition payment system this month. It is an online system that is linked with the Pro Care accounting system that has been used by the Learning Center now for several years. This system (Tuition Express) processes the tuition payment by drafting the bank account (of the parents) with an ACH bank transaction (an automatic bank draft). This has been a very nice improvement in the overall processing of tuition payments. It is helping the tuition payments to be made and processed more timely, and is likely to reduce the total staff time involved with depositing paper checks manually at the bank, and at the same time improve the payment recording and tracking processes.

Virginia Propp moved to approve the Treasurer's Report; seconded and approved.

#### OLD BUSINESS:

Surveillance System Update: Warren Harms called Sound Solutions for an update. They cancelled last Friday due to rain, but it's still in progress.

Trailer Removed: Wiring is disconnected at the source, but wires are in a box at the ground. Ken Greer stated we need to restore the ground cover.

Playground Equipment: Trinity keeps the playground equipment at no cost. Please see BOD packet for details. There was discussion of other GSLS supplies that were purchased. Trinity wrote a check for \$987 to CLAS for supplies purchased. Campus does not plan to pay for their supplies at this time. JoAnn Schoenike moved that CLAS cash the \$987 check from Trinity; seconded and approved.

Facility Use Policy Review (See Packet): The Executive Committee & Church Secretary will review the Facility Use Policy.

Facility Use Request: Pickle Ball

Doug Kiehne moved to approve this request under Priority D, as an affiliated group. The group can only be Trinity members, so no insurance certificate is needed at this point. If non-members participate, the group must reapply; seconded and approved.

Together in Mission (TIM) Budget Reminder: This will be added to the upcoming Budget.

Planning Committee's First Meeting: Chairman Kespohl is wanting this to take place September 19th, at 6:30 PM. At the meeting he will layout his idea of their scope. They'll elect officers and start the process.

Constitution and Bylaw Revisions: Chairman Kespohl went around the table and asked if anyone had questions or comments. The following items will be taken back to the Constitution Revision Committee for further consideration:

- -Changing Chairman to President
- -Changing BOD to Church Council.
- -Financial: Higher Spending Limits
- -Combining of boards, and if they'll now need more than 3 members.
- -Stating that Pastor, Chairman, & Board of Elders can be male only.
- -Confessional Standard Recommendations
- -Consider adding Head Elder to the Executive Committee

Warren Harms moved to have the Constitution Revision Committee reconsider these seven items before the October Board of Directors meeting; seconded and approved.

Septagon Change Order: Virginia Propp moved to accept this revision to the original estimate; seconded

and approved.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

Trunk or Treat - October 28th: The Board of Evangelism would love to see a trunk from every board.

Evaluation: See Executive Committee Report. Increased hourly rate to \$.50/hour more. Chairman Kespohl suggested giving Andrew \$500 seed money for his HSA, if he's on the Concordia Plan. This would set the precedent for all newly eligible employees on the Concordia Plan. JoAnn Schoenike moved to accept the recommendation; seconded and approved.

Called Worker Benefits: Doug Kiehne spoke in regards to the Board of Elders recommendations. They approved these recommendations and ask for BOD approval. The BOD will look

at the recommendations and discuss them at next month's meeting.

Survey: Doug Kiehne reported that the survey is electronic, but there is a paper option. Electronically it's available by email, Facebook, TLC website, weekly news and QR code. September 24th is the deadline.

Adopt-a-Highway: October 6th - JCC. Chairman Kespohl will work on finding someone to organize future dates.

Distribution of Excess: Chairman Kespohl thinks we need an annual plan for distribution of excess. 10% will already go to missions due to a motion passed by the AOV. Ken Greer moved to recommend to the AOV to set up an annual plan for distribution of excess. The plan would be to put any excess into the Capital Outlay Account (190), minus the 10% that goes to missions; seconded and approved.

Release Funds for Youth: Chris Bailey moved to release \$5600 from Account #527 for the National Youth Gathering that is taking place the summer of 2019; seconded and approved.

Budget for 2019: Worksheets due Sept. 26 to Treasurer Budget Meeting Oct. 3rd - 7:00 PM BOD Meeting Oct. 9th - 7:00 PM AOV Meeting Oct. 21st - 12:00 PM

Copiers: The current Marco contract renews Oct. 1, 2018. It was suggested to have Fred Pistel help. Currently we pay \$385/month. Equipment is wearing out. Andrew Saeger moved that pending a favorable review from Fred, we cancel the Marco contract and go with a temporary GFI contract; seconded and approved.

Lawn Care Equipment: The riding lawn mower has many hours on it, and it was purchased used 10 years ago. It's a commercial steel mower that was purchased for \$4000. It's serviced every year. Needs all new seals, is leaking oil, and needs new back tires. Sydenstricker Auction is September 16th. Discussion followed regarding whether to keep fixing what we have or buy another. Andrew Saeger moved to authorize Chairman Kespohl to go to the Sydenstricker Auction with a \$4000 budget to purchase a mower. If that is unsuccessful, use the \$4000 to purchase a mower from Lawn and Leisure; seconded and approved.

Chris Bailey moved to adjourn the meeting at 9:50 p.m.; seconded and approved. Pastor Thieme led the group in the Lord's Prayer.





## Blessings to you in the name of Jesus, "from Age to Age the Same",

## LAST CHANCE to register for the 2018 Lutherans For Life Annual Conference in St Louis!

On October 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> Lutherans For Life is celebrating 40 years of being a voice for life and is still motivated by the same Gospel courage and compassion to speak truth and show love while respecting and protecting every



human being as a treasure and privilege from God our Father. To register go to www.lutheransforlife.org/conference. Now is the time. Don't miss this opportunity.

Since October is also the time to celebrate the Reformation, it seems fitting to consider what Martin Luther had to say about life issues. Luther's view of family matters proved revolutionary in its time. He promoted marriage, encouraged childbearing and praised parenting. He concluded even unborn babies qualified as full-fledged human beings. Reverend Michael W. Salemink, executive director of Lutherans For Life, shares "How Luther Nailed It on Life Issues". The following are excerpts from Rev. Salemink's article and direct quotes from Luther:

"Look at your infancy, and give thought to whether you remember that you were in your mother's womb, that you lay in a cradle, that you sucked your mother's breasts, cried, ate pap, grew, etc. Yet we are certainly alive even during the first year, when the fetus is carried in the mother's womb." (LW 5:75)

"For no one of those who are alive today knows where he was during the first two years, when he lived either in the womb....Yet he lived at that time, and he was a body joined to a soul---a body adapted to all natural functions." (LW 8:316)

"Luther derived this truth directly from God's Word. He observed how the Holy Scripture testified about the prenatal humanity of Jesus and John the Baptist. "Moreover, when Christ, the Son of God, was to be conceived in his mother's womb and become incarnate, he certainly had to be already present in essence and in person in the Virgin's womb, and had to assume humanity there" (LW 37:62).

"So Luther called abortion a sinful offense against the tiniest neighbors. "For those who pay no attention to pregnant women and do not spare the tender fetus become murderers" (LW 5:382). "How great, therefore, the wickedness of human nature is! How many girls there are who prevent conception and kill and expel tender fetuses, although procreation is the work of God!" (LW 4:304).

"In the same way, Luther saw suicide and its assistance as wrong. "Therefore those hotheaded spirits do wrong by scourging and beating themselves or by killing themselves and trying in this way to take heaven by storm" (LW 30:109).

""Christ Himself explains and sums it up. He says that we must not kill, neither with hand, heart, mouth, signs, gestures, help, nor counsel....So also, if you see anyone innocently sentenced to death or in similar distress, and do not save him, although you know ways and means to do so, you have killed him". (McCain, Paul Timothy, ed. *Concordia: The Lutherans Confessions*, 2<sup>nd</sup> ed. [St. Louis: Concordia, 2006], 379-80).

"God's limitless grace convinced Luther to regard life with such respect. Both Bible and experience led him to behold human beings and their bodies as gifts and privileges of infinite preciousness imparted by the Lord Himself. Neither ability nor disobedience, whether one's own or a neighbor's, could improve upon or invalidate the worth the Almighty instilled.

"Finally, Luther found this grace great enough to forgive even evils against life. Jesus Christ died and rose to save sinners from just such guilt. "That is why all those should be absolved whose sins are hidden, whether they are sins of the flesh, or of every kind of lust, abortion, and the like" (LW 39:42).

""When the devil throws our sins up to us and declares that we deserve death and hell, we ought to speak thus: "I admit that I deserve death and hell. What of it? Does this mean that I shall be sentenced to eternal damnation? By no means. For I know One who suffered and made satisfaction in my behalf. His name is Jesus Christ, the Son of God. Where he is, there I shall be also" (Tappert, Theodore G, trans. And ed. *Luther: Letters of Spiritual Counsel* [Vancouver: Regent College, 2003], 86-87).""

For those who are suffering, there is a **word of hope!** "He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds" (Psalm 147:3).
