





As announced here last month, we are beginning a great ministry that will deepen and expand the person-to-person caregiving capacity of our congregation. The Stephen Ministry is a way for our congregation to train and mobilize members to pro-

vide Christ-centered care and support to people experiencing life difficulties.

Our next step is to send a team of people to be trained as Stephen Leaders at a one-week Leader's Training Course in St. Louis, where they will learn how to begin and lead the Stephen Ministry here at Trinity. Our Stephen Leaders will return home with the knowledge and skills to train members to serve as lay caregivers – called Stephen Ministers – in our congregation, match those Stephen Ministers with people in need of care, and provide ongoing support to our Stephen Ministry.

The regular monthly meeting of the Board of Directors was called to order on March 12, 2019 at 7:02 p.m. Attendees included Gary Kespohl (Chairman), Jacque Eckhoff (Secretary), Virginia Propp, Annette Kiehne, Jim Niederjohn, Pastor Brian Thieme, Larry McCoig, James Harms, Angel Arnall and Rob Hall.

Pastor Thieme gave the opening devotion.

Chairman Kespohl added Proposal for Human Resources Committee, Mercy Medical Team Mission Request, College Scholarship Request, and Kitchen Refrigerator Repair to New Business. Angel Arnall moved to approve the Meeting Agenda with these changes; seconded and approved.

Angel Arnall moved to approve the Consent Agenda; seconded and approved.

The Consent Agenda meeting minutes and reports are filed in the Congregation Secretary's notebook. The following are summaries of the reports, with the name of the board representative at the Board of Directors meeting listed:

PASTOR'S REPORT - Pastor Thieme

No report filed.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY - Not Present

For the month of February, the Regular Envelope collections are 95.09% of the anticipated monthly amount. Loose Plate collections are 21.09% and Sunday School are 60.92%. The Total Monthly collections are 91.61% of the monthly anticipated amount of \$36,081.21. The Total Year to Date collections through the end of February are 101.94% of the anticipated amount of \$75,250.28.

BOARD REPORTS:

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION - No Rep. Present

The BOCE is still in need of a Superintendent for Sunday School. They would like to add another member to the Board to act solely as Sunday School Superintendent. The Board is still trying to fill a current vacancy. Plans for Easter Sunday include the Resurrection story followed by an Easter egg hunt. The BOCE is in the process of compiling a calendar of events to be used each year by the incoming board members. They are also in the process of compiling a listing of board member duties for each of the members based on year of service.

EARLY CHILDHOOD ED. - Virginia Propp

The members of the BOECE are continuing the visioning process for TLCLC for 2019. There is currently one TTh Pre-K opening. Summer 2019 and Fall 2019/Spring 2020 enrollment continues. Two used laptops were purchased for staff use and placed in the TLCLC Office. Seventeen staff members attended the Missouri District Early Childhood Educator's Conference on Saturday, March 2, 2019 in Wentzville. The newly constructed classroom bathrooms and the gym ceiling passed the Health Department Inspection in February.

ELDERS - Larry McCoig

The Elders met with President Hagan to discuss the Call Process. This will involve the congregation preparing a position description. The Elders were the Board working the Lenten Light supper and lunch on March 6, 2019, Ash Wednesday. The schedule of services will need to be reviewed by the May meeting to be presented at the May Assembly of Voters.

EVANGELISM - Rob Hall

The BOE met February 21, 2019. The Plus-One Initiative was discussed. Other topics of discussion were potential projects, and current events and their possible effect on community relations (loss of GSLS, publicity from the lawsuit over TLCLC playground cover, etc.)

PAROCHIAL EDUCATION - No Rep. Present

SOCIAL MINISTRY - Angel Arnall

The Senior Ministry group is no longer meeting at Denny's on a weekly basis. A board member looked into other venues in the area. In polling different attendees, the Board found that most have found other weekly groups to join at Lenoir and various other locations. There will be no new location for weekly luncheon at this time. There is a need for a lead person to assist with planning activities and events for the Senior Ministry group. The Board of Social Ministry was made the contact for "Room at the Inn". The Board will look at directory providers through mid-2019 and provide bids to BOD in the Fall of 2019. The hope is to schedule photo sessions around Easter of 2020 and publish a paper and online directory by Summer of 2020.

MINISTRY HIGHLIGHTS:

Pastor Thieme stated that this year's winter weather has made live streaming or recording of services a priority. Those who are unable to attend could still see the service.

TREASURER'S REPORT - Jim Harms

For the month ending February 28, 2019, the Church income is \$41,419 (15.84% of the \$540,599 income budgeted for the year).

The Learning Center income for the month ending February 28, 2019 is \$61,912 (17.24% of the \$711,200 budgeted income for the year).

For the month ending February 28, 2019, Church expenditures are \$30,249 (13.97% of the annual expenditure budget of \$439,029 (\$550,599 - \$101,530 Pastor Contingency).

The Learning Center expenditures for the month ending February 28, 2019 are \$54,521 (13.79% of the annual expenditure budget of \$711,200).

Net operating cash available as of February 28, 2019 is \$141,181. Dedicated accounts total \$76,250 as of February 28, 2019.

Lutheran Church Extension Fund (Designated Reserves & \$40K General Operating 4-yr 4% CD) accounts total \$382,376 as of February 28, 2019.

TLC received by direct deposit the \$18,221 owed by MoDNR on the TLCLC playground.

GSLS reimbursed TLC \$2,165.11 for expenses paid in removal of the classroom trailer.

2018 TLC & TLCLC EOY funds in excess of ex-

penses totaled \$141,343.22. As per the October 2018 AOV, 10% or \$14,134.32 was sent for budget missions to the MO District LCMS and 90% or \$127,208.90 was transferred to 190 Capital Outlay Reserve LCEF account.

Several changes were made to the EOM Summary Treasurer Report. Adjustment made to reflect \$215,653 Net Operating Cash as of 12/31/2018. Reserve Accounts name was changed to LCEF Accounts which reflect both designated reserve and general operating accounts.

198 Scholarship Fund LCEF in the amount of \$6,852.50 was added as an additional TLC asset to the LCEF Accounts.

Angel Arnall moved to allow the Treasurer to combine 195 and 198, and to call 198 "Operating Cash"; seconded and approved.

Larry McCoig moved to approve the Treasurer's Report; seconded and approved.

OLD BUSINESS:

Insurance Claim Update—The adjuster inspected on 2/14/19; we are now waiting on the report.

Call Process Update—The Elders met with President Hagan. The Elders next step is to write a position description.

Life Network Banquet—Sylvia Glenn sent a letter requesting Trinity be a Sponsor for the Life Network of Central Missouri Banquet. Larry McCoig moved to approve a \$500 Sponsorship; seconded and approved.

Locking of Lower Level/Fellowship Hall—Pastor Thieme stated that from now on the two downstairs doors with codes will not be locked. The doors between the gym and TLCLC will be locked for the

safety of TLCLC.

Signed Contract for Furnace Repair/Replacement—The upstairs furnace that feeds into the Associate Pastor's office does not work and will not work. The West wall furnace is also not working well. Crum quoted the price of \$8400 for two new units. Chairman Kespohl signed the contract so they could start work. Rob Hall moved to approve the contract; seconded and approved.

Proposal for Human Resources Committee—The proposal states that a standing committee at TLC should be established to provide oversight and guidance on Personnel/Human Resources. This standing committee would be appointed by the Executive Board and linked with the Executive Board on decisions and approvals (as needed). See complete proposal in Congregation Secretary's notebook.

Mercy Medical Team Mission Request—A college congregation member would like to be part of a Mercy Medical Team Mission. They'd like voluntary support, meaning it will be advertised in the newsletter. Larry McCoig moved to approve the request; seconded and approved.

College Scholarship Request—A college congregation member is asking for renewal of a yearly scholarship. Angel Arnall moved to approve the request; seconded and approved.

Kitchen Refrigerator Repair—The kitchen refrigerator is not cooling correctly. Chairman Kespohl contacted Commercial Kitchen Services. He would like permission to sign a contract with the company to get the process of fixing it started. Larry McCoig moved to approve the request; seconded and approved.

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Chairman Kespohl requested that TLCLC create a proposal for remodeling the TLCLC Kitchen. He would like the proposal by the April BOD meeting.

The next Board of Directors meeting will be held on April 9, 2019 at 7:00 PM.

The next Assembly of Voters meeting will be held on May 19, 2019 at 12:30 PM.

Angel Arnall moved to adjourn the meeting at 8:07 PM; seconded and approved. Pastor Thieme led the group in the Lord's Prayer.

"Genesis 1:3!"

That was my high school theology teacher's exclamation whenever he entered the classroom, found us sitting in the dark, and flipped the switch. I'll never forget the performative words "Let there be light."

Beginning with its epic appearance in Genesis, light is a powerful image

throughout Scripture. But then, we come to Matthew 5:14: "You are the light of the world." Me? I don't feel very bright sometimes. I worry. I say things I regret. I'm prideful. I'm judgmental. Jesus goes on. "A city set on a hill cannot be hidden." One more reminder of my inadequacy! My feeble filament is laid bare on a pedestal.

Yet the 2nd half of Jesus's statement is also reassuring. Cities are communal. "You" is plural. I'm reminded of the fellowship I share with my faith family every time I return home to my neighborhood here, whose name literally translates to "high hill!" I also inhabit a figurative city on a hill. As prayer warriors and donors use their gifts and callings to bolster missionaries in ours, our luminescence multiplies.

My prayer is that Genesis 1:3 might be true for a world in darkness: Let there be light. "And there was light" (Gen. 1:4) — the Light of the World, Rejoicing in the forgiveness won for me on the hill of Calvary that cannot and will not be hidden, I confidently echo the familiar song: "This little light of mine, I'm gonna let it shine!"

They differ from taxis in sticking to designated, lettered routes: C, M, ZP, etc. There's no published route map...you learn by doing. Conchos operate on a hop-on-hop-off basis and cost RD \$25 (\$0.50 USD)/ride, no matter the distance. Concho drivers typically hog the right lane so they can easily pull over to pick up or drop off passengers. They signal the number of open seats by holding a hand out the window.

Conchos are almost always Toyota Corollas that have seen better days, and yes, I have personally been in one with SIX other humans. It was...a cultural experience!


