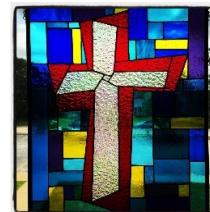

“To You O Lord”

One evening on the storm-blasted Sea of Galilee, the disciples sat in a boat. The wind was against them, the waves beat on their craft, and they were a long way from shore. In the night, somewhere between 3 a.m. and 6 a.m., they saw Jesus walking on the water.

But when the disciples saw him walking on the sea, they were terrified, and said, “It is a ghost!” and they cried out in fear. But immediately Jesus spoke to them, saying, “Take heart; it is I. Do not be afraid.” And Peter answered him, “Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water.” He said, “Come.” So Peter got out of the boat and walked on the water and came to Jesus. (Matt. 14:26-29).

An amazing thing takes place! Peter hears that one word from Jesus, “Come,” and is able to step out onto the water (not in the water, but ON the water). Clinging to the word of Jesus, Peter is able to do the impossible until he diverts his eyes from Jesus and his ears from Christ’s word, and he sinks into the troubled waters that surround him.

When Peter begins to sink does he cry out that he believes? Does he cry out “let me tell you my story”? Does he cry out, “but I love you Jesus”? No! He turns to the one who had given him the word – “Lord, save me.”

How easy it is to identify with Peter. So easily we take our eyes and focus off Him. We turn so easily from His Word, but it is in Christ and His Word that we have sure hope.

As we look for another shepherd (a pastor) for this congregation, we will be asked to consider what kind of shepherd we should have. We could find ideas on the internet:

- † The perfect pastor preaches for exactly 10 minutes.
- † He condemns sin roundly but never hurts anyone’s feelings.
- † He works from 8:00 a.m. until midnight and is also the church janitor.
- † The perfect pastor makes \$40 a week, wears good clothes, drives a good car, buys good books, and donates \$30 a week to the church.
- † He is 29 years old and has 40 years experience.
- † He makes 15 home visits a day and is always in his office when needed.
- † Above all, he is handsome.
- † The perfect pastor has a burning desire to work with teenagers, and he spends most of his time with the senior citizens.
- † He smiles all the time with a straight face because he has a sense of humor that keeps him seriously dedicated to his church.
- † The perfect pastor always has time for church council and all of its committees.
- † He never misses the meeting of any church organization and is always busy evangelizing the unchurched.

But how can we truly know what to expect of a shepherd, unless we look to the Word of God first? Articles concerning the Pastoral Office will be placed before you over the next several months. We will see from Scripture the institution of, the responsibilities of, and the strength and promise in the Office of the Holy Ministry. The Lord would not have us drift about, dashed by doubts. He would have us know who He would have to serve us His great gifts.

Lord into your hands we commend our way. Thy will be done.

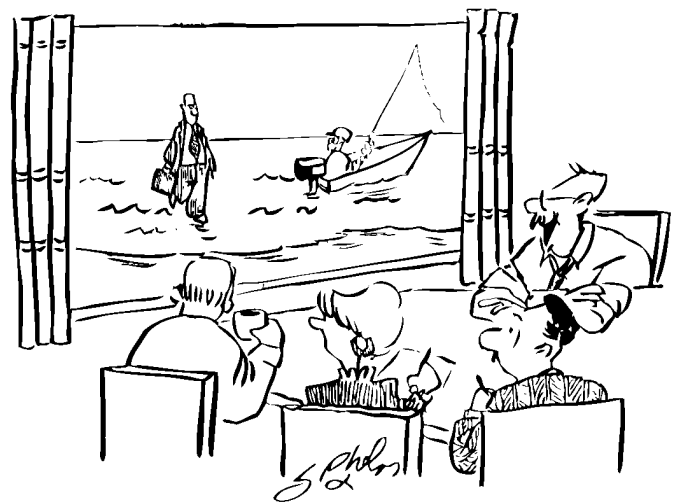

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MINUTES
(Draft Minutes - Yet to be Approved)

The regular monthly meeting of the Board of Directors was called to order on May 14, 2019 at 7:00 p.m. Attendees included Gary Kespohl (Chairman), Jacque Eckhoff (Secretary), Pastor Brian Thieme, Robert Hall, Mary Frerking, Virginia Propp, Michael Brown, Charlie Cott, Annette Kiehne, James Harms, Larry McCoig and Lou Eggerding.

Pastor Thieme gave the opening devotion.

Larry McCoig added Summer Service Options to New Business. Pastor Thieme added Memorial Fund Designation Form to New Business. Virginia Propp moved to approve the Meeting Agenda with these changes; seconded and approved.

Chairman Kespohl made one change to the April 9, 2019 minutes. Under Old Business, Constitution: Human Resources Committee, the cost of the outside company should read \$400 per month, not per year. Virginia Propp moved to approve the Consent Agenda with this change; seconded and approved.

The Consent Agenda meeting minutes and reports are filed in the Congregation Secretary's notebook. The following are summaries of the reports, with the name of the board representative at the Board of Directors meeting listed:

PASTOR'S REPORT - Pastor Thieme

Rev. Spotts continues to visit 2/3 of the Homebound each month, and Rev. Riggert led the Divine Services April 29th.

President Hagan visited Trinity on April 4th.

One individual has finished the adult information class, Sunday morning class is studying the Pastoral Epistles, and Monday morning class is going through the Large Catechism (Lord's Prayer).

FINANCIAL SECRETARY - Not Present

For the month of April, the Regular Envelope collections are 102.56% of the anticipated monthly amount. Loose Plate collections are 74.01% and Sunday School are 75.39%. The Total Monthly collections are 100.86% of the monthly anticipated amount of \$45,026.43. The Total Year to Date collections through the end of April are 102.26% of the anticipated amount of \$166,807.06.

BOARD REPORTS:

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION - Mary Frerking

As in the past, they will continue with Sunday School during the Summer and are asking congregation members to volunteer to help each week. Unlike past years, the board has decided to purchase a set of curriculum for the volunteers to use each week.

VBS will be during the week of July 16-19th. Set up will take place after church on Sunday, July 14th. Volunteers are needed for set up, decorating, crafts, meals, group leaders/helpers and clean up. It will conclude with Family Fun Day that Friday.

Rally Sunday will be held on August 25th. The BOCE is considering a new curriculum to be used this Fall. It's a new curriculum by CPH that covers a three year cycle and includes all Bible study age groups including Senior Youth and adult. The board shared the information with the Sunday School teachers and is currently waiting on their feedback. The BOCE is still in need of a new member to serve on the Board.

EARLY CHILDHOOD ED. - Virginia Propp

As of April 30th, TLCLC has one TTh opening in PreK and one MWF opening in Preschool. Summer enrollment continues. A Toddler Aide will be hired the first part of May. A list of needed maintenance will be given to the Trustees for the May 18th church work day. \$526 made from the Pancake Breakfast will be used to correct drainage issues on the playground.

MINISTRY HIGHLIGHTS:

Stephen Ministry

Pastor Thieme, Larry McCoig and Joanna McDowell attended the Stephen Ministry Leadership Training in St. Louis, MO, April 28th-May 4th. In addition to attending informative and very well organized training sessions 8-13 hours a day, they received a comprehensive system of files and resources to guide us in implementing this program at TLC. The group is wanting to use the old GSLS

office for their space. Mary Frerking moved to approve the office be used by Stephen Ministry team members; seconded and approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT - Jim Harms (Treasurer)

The Church's income for April was \$49,739 with a year-to-date income for the month ending April 30, 2019 at \$187,834 (34.75% of the \$540,599 income budgeted for the year).

The Learning Center's income for April was \$56,329 with a year-to-date income for the month ending April 30, 2019 at \$239,060 (33.61% of the \$711,200 income budgeted for the year).

The Church's expenses for April was \$34,727 with year-to-date expend-

itures for the month ending April 30, 2019 at \$134,753 (30.69% of the annual expenditure budget of \$439,029 (\$550,599 - \$101,530 Pastor Contingency).

The Learning Center's expenses for April was \$51,519 with year-to-date expenditures for the month ending April 30, 2019 at \$203,111 (28.56% of the annual expenditure budget of \$711,200).

The Church's year-to-date three-month income over expenses was \$53,081. This number is reduced to a three-month total of \$19,237 when the budgeted Pastor Contingency is deducted.

The Learning Center year-to-date income over expenses was \$35,949. Combined (Church's and Learning Center) year-to-date income over expenses was \$89,030.

Net operating cash available as of April 30, 2019 was \$179,886. Dedicated accounts totaled \$72,153 as of April 30, 2019. Lutheran Church Extension Fund (Designated Reserves & \$40K General Operating 4-yr 4% CD) accounts totaled \$396,446 as of April 30, 2019.

Chairman Kespohl reported the CLAS Board split GSLS assets 50/50 between Trinity Lutheran Church and Campus Lutheran Church. Trinity will get a check for approximately \$146,000 in June 2019. Larry McCoig moved the funds from GSLS be placed in a separate account titled "Funds from GSLS"; seconded and approved. Larry McCoig moved to approve the Treasurer's Report; seconded and approved.

Accessibility Recommendations: Removing Pews

The Elders discussed a recommendation of the Visioning Committee to remove two pews for accessibility needs of members. The pews will be removed and stored for approximately 90 days to see how it works. The floor will be left during the trial period, and fixed if it becomes permanent. Two places where you can buy diapers inexpensively are Big Tree Medical Home and CoMo Cubs Pediatrics. Big Tree is located on Southampton Drive, Suite 103, in the same suite as Tiger Pediatrics. Any package of diapers you buy there is \$13 no matter the number or size. You do have to pay cash or use Venmo. Another option, CoMo Cubs, is located at 201 W. Broadway in Doctors' Park. Their diapers run \$18.88 a package. Newborn packages hold 240 diapers and the number decreases with the size.

We still plan to show a movie for the congregation, but we had to postpone it because of some licensing logistics. This movie will have a pro-life message and we encourage you to watch for more information in the Trinity Weekly News and this newsletter.

Sharper Together

The LCMS has been actively planting churches in Latin America & the Caribbean since 1902 thanks to innumerable Mission Senders and TIM partners like YOU. What you may not know is that the missionaries you support work hand in hand with a difficult-to-define but vital class of servants from partner church bodies who fill much-needed roles within the Church but are funded differently: Alliance missionaries.

Alliance missionaries emerged onto the LAC scene in 2009 and are used more widely and effectively here than in any other region. There are currently 11 serving in Argentina, the Dominican Republic, Jamaica, Honduras, Peru, Puerto Rico, and the US. The longest serving Alliance missionary is one with whom I've become well acquainted in my first nine months on the field: Rev. Obot Ite, a Nigerian national having served in Kingston, Jamaica, for 10+ years.

Alliance missionaries are critical since they are more attuned to Hispanic culture than us North Americans, acclimating quickly. They are especially helpful in the wake of natural disasters and when the field faces the sudden departure of an network supported (NSM) missionary. Alliance missionaries receive a base salary, health plan, evacuation insurance, and retirement package, which can add up to be more or less cost effective than an NSM missionary. The region assumes roles that the St. Louis support staff plays for NSM missionaries, such as donor relations and HR.

Alliance missionaries don't replace NSM missionaries. Area Facilitator James Sharp put it best when he explained that an NSM missionary and an Alliance missionary working together are more effective than two NSM missionaries or two Alliance missionaries. Proverbs 27:17 lived out!

"Iron sharpens iron, and one man sharpens another."

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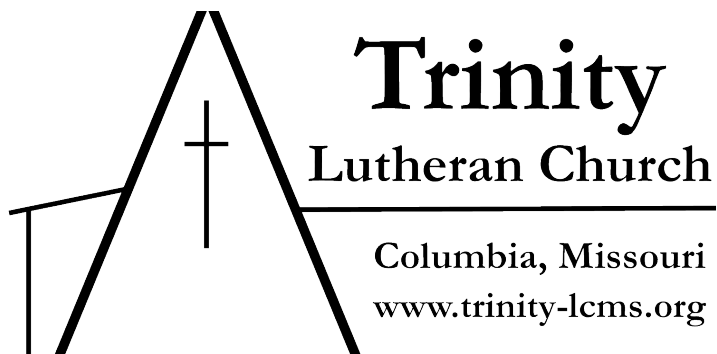
