Why does God give us pastors?

When we look at our lives and measure them according to the holiness and righteousness of the Lord God Almighty we are moved to say, "Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner." We receive forgiveness of sins, and become righteous before God, by grace, for Christ's sake, through faith, when we believe that Christ lived, suffered, died and rose again for us, and that for His sake our sins are forgiven, and righteousness and eternal life are given to us.

But how do we receive this faith? In order to obtain such faith, God instituted the ministry of teaching the Gospel and administering the Sacraments. It is through the Word and Sacraments that the Holy Spirit produces faith, where and when it pleases Him, in those who hear the good news of Jesus' death and resurrection for the forgiveness of sins. Pastors accompany us on our earthly pilgrimage. They serve us with Christ's Word and Sacraments, through which the Holy Spirit gives us forgiveness, life and salvation.

Therefore, we believe, teach and confess that "when the called ministers of Christ deal with us by His divine command...this is just as valid and certain, even in heaven, as if Christ our dear Lord dealt with us Himself' (Small Catechism).

How does God give us pastors?

The pastoral office is a gift that God has given to the church, as Paul says, "When he ascended on high he gave gifts to men" (Eph. 4:8, 11-12). Paul enumerates pastors and teachers among the gifts belonging to the church, and he adds that they are given for the work of ministry and for building up the body of Christ. Therefore, the right of electing and ordaining ministers is a duty and responsibility of the church.

Through a congregation's call, God places a man to be the shepherd of that congregation. "Our churches teach that nobody shall publicly preach or teach or administer the sacraments without a regular call" (Augsburg Confession, Article XIV). Only those who are called and ordained to the pastoral office may exercise it publicly. Although the Holy Scriptures make it clear that all the baptized are priests, called to offer God sacrifices of thanks and praise (1 Peter 2:9; Rev. 1:6; 5:10), it also teaches that in the church there is an office to teach, feed, guide and rule, which Christians, by virtue of their general calling as Christians, do not possess (1 Cor. 12:29; Rom. 10:15; 1 Tim. 5:17; James 3:1). While all Christians through Baptism are made part of God's royal priesthood, not all Christians are ministers. When a man receives and accepts his first call to serve as a pastor, he is then ordained. Ordination is a confirmation of a man's call into the ministry of the church and is the historic and apostolic rite by which, through Word and prayer, a man is set apart for service to Christ and His church as a pastor.

During his ordination, he is also installed into the pastoral office of the congregation that calls him. In the future, if he accepts other calls to serve, he will be installed, but not ordained again.



The regular monthly meeting of the Board of Directors was called to order on June 11, 2019 at 7:03 p.m. Attendees included Gary Kespohl (Chairman), Jacque Eckhoff (Secretary), Pastor Brian Thieme, Larry McCoig, Angel Arnall, James Harms, Mary Frerking, Annette Kiehne, Virginia Propp and Chris Bailey.

Pastor Thieme gave the opening devotion.

Larry McCoig moved to approve the Meeting Agenda; seconded and approved.

Angel Arnall moved to approve the Consent Agenda; seconded and approved.

The Consent Agenda meeting minutes and reports are filed in the Congregation Secretary's notebook. The following are summaries of the reports, with the name of the board representative at the Board of Directors meeting listed:

PASTOR'S REPORT - Pastor Thieme

Rev. Spotts continues to visit 2/3 of the Homebound each month, and officiated June 2/3.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY - Not Present

The Total Monthly collections are 110.57% of the monthly anticipated amount of \$37,405.24. TREASURER'S REPORT - Jim Harms (Treasurer)

The Church's income for May was \$44,830 with a yearto-date income for the month ending May 31, 2019 at \$232,664 (43.04 % of the \$540,599 income budgeted for the year).

The Church's expenses for May was \$44,615 with yearto-date expenditures for the month ending May 31, 2019 at \$179,368 (40.86 % of the annual expenditure budget of \$439,029 (\$550,599 - \$101,530 Pastor Contingency).

The Church's year-to-date five-month income over expenses was \$53,296. This number is reduced to a fivemonth total of \$10,992 when the budgeted Pastor Contingency is deducted.

The Learning Center's income for May was \$59,071 with a year-to-date income for the month ending May 31, 2019 at \$298,130 (41.92 % of the \$711,200 income budgeted for the year).

with year-to-date expenditures for the month ending May 31, 2019 at \$273,826 (38.50 % of the annual expenditure budget of \$711,200). Expenses did exceed income for May, but an explanation is fairly simple as Pew Removal there were three bi-weekly payroll deductions in May.

Leap for Joy

A few years ago, I was approached by a couple considering an abortion. They wanted a pastor's opinion, so I gave them one. I told them that God values life—so much so that He sent His one and only Son to be crucified for the sins of the world. The young couple seemed conflicted. "But, it's legal!" replied the young man.

About a year later, the governor of my state vetoed a bill requiring doctors to ask women seeking an abortion if they would first like to see an ultrasound. I watched on social media as several friends rejoiced over the veto—with one friend writing, "I've never been so proud to live in this state!"

These comments came from intelligent people, but intelligent people who have been deceived. The Scriptures tell us that it is God who knits a child together (Psalm 139:13), and even that the infant John the Baptist leapt for joy in his mother's womb when he first heard the voice of Mary—the mother of his Lord (Luke 1:44). As the Church, we are created to stand against evil. We are created to speak truth... and forgiveness.

The truth is that abortion ends the life of a human being, and we should be unwavering in our opposition to it. But that is not the end of the story. We have been given the gift of Christ, and the power of Christ can wash our sins away. Perhaps that is the message you need to hear today—the message that all sinners need. Whatever your sin, no matter how big or how small, the blood of Jesus is enough. May your soul leap for joy—for your Savior has come! (Rev. 

MINISTRY DESCRIPTION

Position: Pastor

Purpose: To serve the Church by coordinating and implementing the program of the Church. Working under the direction of the other Pastor to facilitate the vision, develop new programs in keeping with established goals, maximizes the effectiveness of present program, and give leadership to program volunteers involved in this ministry. Call on members and friends of the Church at homes or in hospitals; especially the elderly, grieving, troubled, or those celebrating a special occasion.

Duties and Responsibilities:

- † Administer the Word of God in its full truth and purity as contained in the Sacred Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments and as set forth in the confessional writings of the Evangelical Lutheran Church as found in The Book of Concord.
- † Administer the Holy Sacraments in accordance with their divine institution.
- † Perform the functions of a Pastor in an evangelical manner, to aid, counsel and guide members of all ages and social conditions; to visit the sick and the dying, and to admonish the indifferent and the erring.
- † Guard and promote faithfully the spiritual welfare of the members of the congregation, in particular to instruct the catechumens, both children and adults, in the Word of God and thus prepare them for the communicant membership in the Church.
- † Promote and guide mission activity of the congregation as it is related to the local community and to endeavors of the Synod and its Districts.
- t Serve the congregation as an example of Christian conduct, to endeavor earnestly to live in Christian unity with the members of the congregation, fellow workers, sister congregations in the Synod, and by the grace of God to do everything possible for the edification of the congregation and the upbuilding of the Church in Christ.
- † Meet on a regular schedule with the other Pastor to clarify vision, goals and strategy.
- † Evaluate the evolving needs of the congregation and work to strengthen the present program in keeping with those needs. Especially developing and supervising the educational ministries of the Church, with direct responsibility for youth.
- † Facilitate the development of programs through volunteers, committees, and boards of the Church
- † Supervise the communication of the program of the Church to the congregation by overseeing preparation of weekly bulletins, overseeing production of newsletters, and writing press releases.
- † Work closely with the other Pastor in leading meetings and retreats.
- † Work with appropriate committees, officers, and leaders to carry out the mission and ministry of the Church.
- † Participate in the selection of Church officers and provide officer training.
- † Attend board meetings as a resource for informational purposes and for moderating.
- † Officiating Divine Services in coordination with the other Pastor.
- † Oversee and lead in the education program of the Church and Learning Center.
- † Conduct weddings and funerals by providing appropriate preparation and support.
- † Represent the Church by serving at the District level and Synod level.
- † Cooperate with the Elders by performing other duties when asked.
