This month, we examine the final portion of the article entitled "What about Pastors" by Rev. Dr. A. L. Barry, a former president of the LCMS.

What are the duties and commitments of pastors?

Our pastors preach, catechize, administer the Sacraments, hear confession from penitent sinners, and comfort the sick. The church knows that even the most faithful pastor can never do enough of these things, but the church also knows these are the precious duties our pastors are given to do. We must never allow other things to take priority over these key pastoral duties and activities.

With the help of God, our pastors have the responsibility to speak the truth in love, but this duty must be understood correctly.

Our pastors are not "people pleasers," watering down the truths of God's Word. Pastors pledge themselves unconditionally, and without qualification, to the Lutheran Confessions as contained in the Book of Concord of 1580, as a true and faithful exposition of the Word of God.

This strong doctrinal commitment safeguards the teaching of the truth of the Word of God in the congregation. Also, it protects the pastor from unjust criticism when he stands up for the truths of God's Word. By means of this strong doctrinal foundation, both pastor and people are able to evaluate their relationship to one another and the work of the congregation.

How do we support our pastors?

The most important way we support our pastors is through our prayers, asking the Lord of the Church to give our pastors wisdom, strength, courage and peace, asking Him to bless our pastors' ministry among us and to work powerfully through their proclamation of the Word and administration of the Sacraments. Our children should be taught each night to remember their pastor in their prayers.

The members of our congregations assist their pastor as they encourage and support him in the ministry entrusted to him. They volunteer their time, by serving in a variety of ways in the parish, and give of their treasures. The pastor is not a "hired hand," who is to do all the work of the congregation. Telling the good news of the forgiveness of sins in Jesus Christ, in all of the many different situations and opportunities in life, is a task and duty given to all Christians, not only pastors (Matt. 28:19-20; 1 Peter 2:9; 1 Peter 3:15).

Jonah Wayne Provost and Eve Renne Vandermillion were welcomed into God's family through the Sacrament of Holy Baptism this month. The wedding of Amanda (McDowell) and Daniel Hakes took place July 20th.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY - Not Present

For the month of July, the Regular Envelope collections are 106.84% of the anticipated monthly amount. Loose Plate collections are 87.6% and Sunday School are 73.5%. The Total Monthly collections are 106.07% of the monthly anticipated amount of \$37,813.66. The Total Year to Date collections through the end of July are 109.15% of the anticipated amount of \$281,163.80.

BOARD REPORTS:

CHRISTIAN ED. - Mary Frerking

TLC hosted its annual VBS July 16-19th from 5:30-8:00 PM. This year's theme was "Miraculous Mission". Sixty one children, ages Pre-K to 5th grade, were enrolled. Approximately 400 meals were served to these children, their siblings and parents over the course of the four nights. Over No report filed. fifty members of our congregation volunteered their time and YOUTH - No Rep. Present talents to make the week of VBS a success. TLC collected No report filed.

\$248 for the VBS Mission, Baby Bottle Boomerang, on behalf of Lutheran Family & Children Services of Missouri. Rally Sunday is scheduled for Sunday, August 25, 2019. The 2019/2020 Sunday school year will begin the Sunday following Rally Sunday. Three of the nine Pre-K to 8th grade Sunday school teachers from last year will not be returning. The BOCE is still in the process of looking for additional teachers. The BOCE is also still in need of an additional board member.

EARLY CHILDHOOD ED. - Virginia Propp

Fall 2019 enrollment is at 100%. The TLCLC staff is continuing to attend Conscious Discipline Training sessions in groups of three. Cheryl Harr announced her retirement as a Pre-K teacher at the end of the 2019/2020 school year. Phyllis White will also retire from her position as the Jesus Time teacher in May 2020.

The BOECE discussed an idea from the recent district administrator's conference regarding distributing Children's Bibles to Pre-K students during their Graduation. This idea will be discussed with the staff and if approved will be added to the Learning Center's 2020 budget. The BOECE visioning process continues.

TREASURER'S REPORT - Jim Harms (Treasurer)

The word "June" should be changed to "July" in paragraphs one, two, four and five. In paragraph three change "five-month" to "seven-month". Jim is working on the Concordia Plan Renewal. A decision needs to be made by September 6, 2019. He is also working on an audit to be done by the end of month for insurance for the church. Finally, Jim and Ron Barrett are working on Safe Church.

The Church's income for July was \$43,681 with a year-to-date income for the month ending July 31, 2019 at \$337,216 (62.38 % of the \$540,599 income budgeted for the year). Church receipts are down \$15,960 to the prior four (2015-2018) fiscal years average at the same time each year.

The Church's expenses for July was \$35,213 with year-to-date expenditures for the month ending July 31, 2019 at \$245,683 (55.97 % of the annual budget of \$439,029 (\$550,599 - \$101,530 Pastor Contingency).

The Church's year-to-date seven-month income over expenses was \$91,533. This number is reduced to a five-month total of \$32,307 when the budgeted Pastor Contingency is deducted.

The Learning Center's income for July was \$67,502 with a year-to-date income for the month ending July 31, 2019 at \$425,459 (59.82 % of the \$711,200 income budgeted for the year).

The Learning Center's expenses for July was \$53,175 with year-to-date expenditures for the month ending July 31, 2019 at \$378,808 (53.23 % of the annual expenditure budget of \$711,200).

The Learning Center year-to-date income over expenses was \$46,651. Combined (Church's and Learning Center) year-to-date income over expenses was \$138,185.

Net operating cash available as of July 31, 2019 was \$229,651. Dedicated accounts totaled \$83,303 as of July 31, 2019. Lutheran Church Extension Fund (Designated Reserves & \$40K General Operating 4-yr 4% CD) accounts totaled \$400,099 as of July 31, 2019.

Angel Arnall moved to approve the Treasurer's Report; seconded and approved.

OLD BUSINESS:

Call Process Update: Pastoral Nominations: Larry McCoig reminded everyone that the Elders extended the nomination period by a few weeks. The Elders did receive more nominations during this time. Nominations were sent to President Hagan.

Insurance Claim Update: Chairman Kespohl reported that the west side of the gym roof has hail damage and the east side does not. The west side would cost \$31,000 to replace. Chairman Kespohl will continue gathering information.

In January 2013, GSLS stopped paying their part of the agreement for its last six months. GSLS will reimburse that money.

But, many of us interact with similar innovations daily. Apple launched Face ID in 2017, and my browser's "cookies" leave a trail of crumbs that are a feast for marketers acquainted with Google Display Network.


"O Lord, you have searched me and known me! You know when I sit down and when I rise up; you discern my thoughts from afar" (Psalm 139: 1–2).

Google's algorithms have searched us. Google Maps might as well know when we sit down and rise up. My iPhone long ago "learned" my hometown, occupation, and interests. Compared to our devices, we feel like strangers to those around us! But to Apple and Google, we're faceless statistics. And although the contours of my cheekbones clue the CBP in to a wealth of information, they don't *know* me.

There are two Spanish words for "to know:" *saber* for facts and *conocer* for familiarity. Google Analytics junkies have factual knowledge about me. CBP agents have more. God, too, *sabe* many things about us: whereabouts, thoughts, and what's next out of our mouths. But God also *nos conoce*. He's familiar with our every atom and quirk. My Creator knows more about me than

I know about myself. Oddly, it's not even creepy, because I am also deeply loved by God, and the knowing is mutual. In Baptism, I became God's child. John 10:14 says, "I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me." What a privilege! Yes, I can spout facts about each person of the Trinity, but most importantly, I can echo Job: "I know that my Redeemer lives," (19:25).


