Lent

The early church set aside days during which they prepared themselves for Easter. The purpose of Lent sets before us our former captivity to sin, death, and the devil and then directs us to

Jesus, who out of His great love rescues us from that great captivity by His death and resurrection. Thus during the season of Lent, we meditate on our sinfulness, but always with an eye toward Easter, where the empty tomb tells us that our salvation has been accomplished. The season is a time of reflection on our baptism in the drowning of the old selfish self through repentance and raising to life in the absolution of our sins by the blood of Christ.

Ash Wednesday began the season of Lent, which lasts 40 days, excluding Sundays (thus Sundays "in" Lent not "of" Lent). On Ash Wednesday there was an exhortation for congregational prayer and penitential reflection: "Remember you are dust, and to dust, you shall return." We await the return of the Alleluia on Easter as well as the Final and Great Alleluia of the Lord at the resurrection to eternal life.

STEPHEN MINISTRY

During services March 22 and 23, our congregation will commission ten well-trained Stephen Series caregivers! These dedicated people will have completed 50 hours of in-depth training and after commissioning will be ready for caregiving assignments. The 50 hours of training included lecture and role-playing in 18 different areas, each of which has been summarized in newsletter articles the past five months. Here is a summary of the training modules we covered in February and March:



- t Helping Suicidal Persons Get the Help They Need Learned how to determine the level of risk and how to refer a care receiver to a qualified professional.
- t Dealing with Depression Learned skills appropriate to providing care for those who are mildly to moderately depressed and when to involve mental health professionals.
- + Bringing the Caring Relationship to a Close Learned and practiced skills on how and when to close a relationship and how to head-off premature closure.
- + Supervision: A Key to Quality Christian Care (Parts 1 and 2) Learned what tools are available for supervision and how to use them, with special emphasis on Focus Question Sets.
- t Using Mental Health Professionals and Other Community Resources Learned when and how to refer care receivers to mental health professionals, how and when it is okay to provide care in conjunction with a professional, and what other resources are available for people in crisis.
- + How to Make a First Caring Visit Reviewed all we have learned about caregiving and practiced setting up and conducting a first caring visit.
- + Follow Me Reviewed "The Caregiver's Compass" as a way of summarizing learnings in five qualities: compassion, faith, skills, trustworthiness, and remaining Christ-centered, and watched a video, Go–God Is with You!

Blessings to you in the name of God our Creator, Jesus our Redeemer and the Holy Spirit who sustains us,

Because all human life is precious and a gift from God, sometimes medical decision making can be difficult. Sometimes just because something can be done doesn't mean that it should be done. The following is a guide from the *Healthcare Advocacy* and *Leadership Organization* with *life-affirming principles for medical decision-making*; I pray you find it helpful:

- 1. No matter what life-sustaining procedure/medical treatment is in question, when in doubt, **err on the side of life.** A medical intervention can be tried with the option of stopping it if it proves ineffective or excessively burdensome *for the patient.*
- 2. It is the physician's obligation to truthfully and fully, in layperson's terms, discuss with the patient/proxy/family/guardian the benefits, risks, cost, etc. of available medical means that may improve the patient's condition/prolong life. The focus should be on what the person making medical decisions needs to know in order to give *truly informed consent*.
- 3. The patient or the patient's legal representative makes the decision whether a treatment is too burdensome. (Note: The patient's life must never be ended because it is considered a burden to the patient or others.) If a patient wishes to fight for every moment of life, this is a legitimate interest to be respected.
- 4. It is impossible to make <u>morally sound</u>, <u>sensible</u>, <u>informed</u> health care decisions based on guesswork about some future illness or injury and possible treatment options. Health care decisions must be based on *current* information.
- 5. Two extremes are to be avoided:
 - Insistence on physiologically useless or excessively burdensome treatment even when a patient may legitimately wish to forgo it.
 - Withdrawal or withholding of treatment with the intention to hasten/cause death.
- 6. The object and motive for administering **pain medication** must be to relieve pain. Death must not be sought or intended.
- 7. Nutrition and hydration, whether a person is fed with a spoon or through a tube, is basic care, not medical treatment. Insertion or surgical implantation of a feeding tube takes medical expertise, but it is an <u>ordinary life-preserving</u> procedure for a person who has a working digestive system but is unable to eat by mouth.
 - Acceptable During the natural dying process, when a person's organs are shutting down so that the body is no longer able to assimilate food or water or when their administration causes serious complications, stopping tube-feeding or spoon-feeding is both medically and morally appropriate. In these circumstances, the cause of death is the person's disease or injury, not deliberate dehydration and starvation.
 - Unacceptable When a person is not dying--or not dying quickly enough to suit someone--food and fluids are often withheld with the intent to cause death because the person is viewed as having an unacceptably low quality of life and /or as imposing burdens on others. The direct cause of death is then dehydration and starvation. (For more information see www.HALOrganization.com)
