"During These Times"

During these times several Bible passages come to mind.

- † John 6:68 Simon Peter answered him, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life."
- † Psalm 121:1-2 I lift up my eyes to the hills. From where does my help come? My help comes from the LORD, who made heaven and earth.
- **†** Ecclesiastes 1:9 What has been is what will be, and what has been done is what will be done, and there is nothing new under the sun.

This is not the first time God's people have faced plagues, pestilence, epidemics, or other such troubles. I can look in my own family archive and find a newspaper clipping about my great-uncle's death from the Spanish Flu in 1918. The clipping tells how grief replaced happiness in the home. Ernst was on his way home from the war in Europe (The War to End All Wars – WWI), and the family was overjoyed. The joy was replaced with grief when the telegram from the War Department stated that he died aboard ship from the Spanish Flu on the way home. My great-grandmother's brave heart was challenged by her loss.

Churches were challenged when the 1918 epidemic reached American shores. Churches were closed, and people stayed in their homes. The *Lutheran Witness* magazine responded in part by encouraging God's people to gather around the Word in their homes. Here is an excerpt from a 1918 article:

Family Devotions. - During the present epidemic the Board of Health of many cities have requested that congregations' close schools, churches, and Sunday-schools until the danger has passed. Not only our pastors, but also the ministers of other churches advised their people through the public press, or otherwise, that during the closing of the churches they should read the Scriptures at home and have family prayers. In those homes in which this had been a custom before it was easily arranged. To others it was a novel experience. It is to be hoped that some who tasted the spiritual delight of family devotion will continue the practice in the future.

Let no one imagine that the churches of the pastors fear that people will take to prayer in the family and neglect public services. The family that enjoys the reading of the Scriptures and family prayers during the week is the one which is most ready to visit the house of God whenever the doors are thrown open. The more members of a congregation practice home or family devotion, the better will be the church attendance in that congregation. That father and head of the house who gathers his household together each day because it is his intention and determination: "I and my home will serve the Lord." - that father will be of the same mind on the day when the churches are open and the pastor proclaims God's Word.

Are you looking for some good work to do? Would you do something to glorify God, something whereby you may show gratitude towards the Savior, something whereby you may be yourself blessed, and whereby you may bless your neighbor, something whereby you may be a blessing to your whole country? Institute family devotion daily in your home. Go about it in a cheerful, friendly, evangelical manner. If that is daily done, you have accomplished something that will bless you and yours in time and eternity.

As we slowly begin to open again and things are still not back to normal, you are encouraged to gather around the Word of Christ. The Lord has and always will sustain us.

1 Peter 1:24–25 for "All flesh is like grass and all its glory like the flower of grass. The grass withers, and the flower falls, but the word of the Lord remains forever." And this word is the good news that was preached to you.

Pastor Thieme led the opening devotion.

Chairman Kespohl added TLC Website Upgrade and BOECE Motion to New Business. Charlie Cott added Church Office Renovation to New Business. Angel Arnall moved to approve the Meeting Agenda with these additions; seconded and approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT - James Harms

March's Church income was \$50,182 with a year-to-date income for the month ending March 31, 2020 at \$136,903 (25.26% of the years \$541,875 budgeted income).

AOV approved an annual budget change effective March 1 increasing item #511.5 - Pastor Health to cover 75% of the family health plan cost. This reduced item #519 - Pastor Contingency from \$103,796 to \$93,489.

March's Church expenditures were \$31,297 with a year-to-date expense total for the month ending March 31, 2020 at \$97,532 [21.73% of the years \$448,769 budgeted expenditures (\$541,875 budget - \$93,489) Pastor Contingency]. The Church's year-to-date three-month income over expenditures was \$39,371. This number is reduced to \$15,999 when the budgeted portion of the \$93,489 Pastor Contingency is deducted.

March's Learning Center income was \$60,919 with a year-to-date income for the month ending March 31, 2020 at \$152,213 (26.83% of the years \$732,000 budgeted income). Unsure how much tuition income will need to be credited/refunded due to COVID-19.

March's Learning Center expenditures were \$58,910 with a year-to-date expense total for the month ending March 31, 2020 at \$152,213 (20.79% of the annual expenditure budget of \$732,000). The Learning Center's year-to-date three-month income over expenditures was \$44,153.

Combined (Church and Learning Center) income over budgeted expenditures totaled \$83,524. This amount is reduced to \$70,547 after \$12,977 was paid in BOD & AOV Expenditures.

Prior & Current Year BOD/AOV approved expenditures paid in March totaled \$4,384. Acct 995.1 TLC BOD/AOV App: \$2,111 expenses \$1,318.20 - 4 wooden sanctuary chairs \$408.87 - Lent lite supper \$384 - AOV meal March 31, 2020: \$78,218 AOV EOY income/expenditures motion has not been sent to LCEF (190 Capital Outlay Reserve) at this time. Net operating cash available is \$273,799 and would be reduced to \$195,181 when this is done.

March 31, 2020: Dedicated Accounts totaled \$80,743.

March 31, 2020: Lutheran Church Extension Funds accounts total \$590,829.

February 29, 2020 TLC LCMS Foundation Endowment Funds account value was \$100,355.

There was a market reduction of \$4,495 from a month ago.

Angel Arnall moved to approve the Treasurer's Report; seconded and approved.

Larry McCoig reported that an email was received from President Hagan asking for insurance clarification. If we receive a Seminarian, TLC would pay 100% of Pastor and 75% of family. Call date ie 4/28/20.

SBA Loan / Paycheck Protection Program See page 18 of BOD packet. Angel Arnall moved to approve the Executive Committee's action; seconded and approved.

BOECE Motion Effective Monday, April 27, 2020 BOECE is requesting that Trinity Lutheran Child Learning Center remain closed until it is deemed safe for our students, their families, and the teachers and staff to return. This decision will be based on recommendations from our federal, state and city government officials, our Lutheran Church Missouri Synod, and the leadership of BOECE, TLCLC and Trinity Lutheran Church. Theresa Yeager moved to approve the BOECE request; seconded and approved.

TLC Website Upgrade

Chris Kespohl showed the BOD the website mock up. Christ shared that the next step is to ask for a written proposal with cost. Chris requested to make website decisions in conjunction with Pastor Thieme, Annette and Andrew. He also mentioned that next year's budget should have a website maintenance budget included. \$1000 should be appropriate.

Church Office Remodel Charlie Cott asked if we are ready for the church office remodel. With current social distancing regulations we are unable to start at the moment. Also, sound system, security and copiers need to be considered. We are a week or two away from a plan.

ANNOUNCEMENTS: The next Board of Directors meeting will be held on May 12, 2020. The next Assembly of Voters meeting will be held on May 17, 2020.

Larry McCoig moved to adjourn at 8:14 PM and Pastor Thieme led the group in a closing devotion.








TEMPORARY CHURCH OFFICE LOCATION
