Trinity Lutheran Church — Columbia, MO



On the heels of the pandemic have followed other disruptive plagues of mind and body affecting us as Christians, but also our society as a whole: isolation, depression, unrest, anger, and insecurity, to name a few. We can be sure that our Lord is using these trials and even the temptations that come with to strengthen us in the faith and Christian living. The Lord Jesus heals us from these "mini-plagues" (which to be sure are also part of life in fallen creation even without a pandemic) chiefly when we gather together in

worship: hearing of God's love in Word in Sacrament, thereby receiving His forgiveness. Yet, his Spirit also heals through us as we bear one another's burdens and build each other up when we gather in fellowship.

Since this plague has changed more than a few aspects of how we gather for worship and fellowship, our newsletters in the coming editions will offer a review of "why we do, what we do" in our Sunday and Monday worship, the Divine Service. Pastor Thieme and I (the new guy) pray that this study will strengthen and deepen our understanding of the why and how of worship. Even though the months ahead bring an added degree of uncertainty, we pray that we may be comforted and sustained by the certain and unchanging promises and word of God, even if it looks different. Whether we're gathering in person, watching online at home, or listening on the go, we remain steadfast in the faith and knowledge that in worship our Lord ministers to us with healing balm—his Word. The Scriptures exhort us to not give up meeting together, and we pray that God would grant us that joy, in all its fullness, soon.

We'll start our study with a little vocabulary and history lesson (yes, yawns are okay). Our word "liturgy" is derived from the Greek word λειτουργία (lay-tour-ghee-ah) which clunkily comes into English as "town hall work." In ancient Greece, a public official, a minister (think in the sense of "prime minister") in a community would provide a significant work to the community of great benefit, usually announced in a meeting place. We can think of this comparably to an Eagle Scout project; it is a project completed for the benefit of many. The Latin word "liturgia" echoes the Greek, meaning "work to/for the people" or "public service." By the time these words were associated with the Christian church, liturgy had a definite sense conveying "God's work for His people through his ministers."

Things took a little different turn in the 6th and 7th centuries with the word "Mass," roughly meaning dismissal or formally, "it is sent." Mass became the common word for worship with the Lord's Supper because the priest would dismiss the people after the Eucharist. The Lutheran Reformation initially kept the word "mass" for worship, but gradually the German word "Hauptgottesdienst" became the norm. This word means "Chief Service" indicating the Lord's Supper would be given. This word in rigorous, efficient German style conveys that it is "God's Service," which He does for us, not the other way around. (And not to forget the Scandinavians out there, "Gudstjeneste"). In the chief service God (Gott) serves (dienst) his people with the word of forgiveness (Absolution), Holy Baptism, and the Lord's Supper. It is from this German meaning that we call our worship "Divine Service." Gathered together God distributes his forgiveness through his ministers, the pastors.

The teachings our church holds about worship are rich in history, but more importantly, they confess that when we gather together, we receive Christ's gifts, which he desires to give. In the coming issues, we'll see that the components of the liturgy have their sources in Scripture. Next time we'll examine the beginning of the Service of the Word: the Invocation and the Confession and Absolution.

IN-PERSON WORSHIP SERVICES AND EVENTS

Trinity is holding in-person worship services and on-site events. However, the COVID-19 pandemic requires several modifications to the way we meet for worship. Based on the most recent orders from the City of Columbia, we are observing the following practices:

We are following strict social distancing guidelines. Households are encouraged to sit together, but groups must sit at least six feet from the nearest group with vacant pews both in front of and behind each occupied pew. Please follow all written and verbal instructions given at the service.



- Worshipers must wear face masks when attending worship services. Worshipers may, at their discretion, remove their face mask once in their seats and at least six feet from the nearest group. Face masks must be worn when arriving, leaving, or otherwise moving about the church.
- If you need to visit the Church Office, you must wear a face mask. If you have a meeting or other business at the church, the only time you may remove your mask is if you are alone in a room. Masks should be removed if you are playing a sport or other athletic activity.
- \$\frac{1}{4}\$ If you do not own a face mask or forget to bring one, we will provide a mask for you.
- \$\frac{1}{2}\$ Services are held at regular times: 8:00 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. on Sunday and 6:00 p.m. on Monday.
- † The 8:00 a.m. service will be livestreamed at www.facebook.com/trinitylutherancomo.
- The Communion will be offered at worship services as scheduled.

 Communion will also be available at other advertised times and by appointment.
- There will be no in-person Sunday School or Fellowship Hour at this time. Children's Sunday School will be meeting via Zoom at 9:30 a.m. An adult Bible Study will be available at www.facebook.com/trinitylutherancomo.
- If you are in the high-risk group as defined by the City of Columbia (65 or older or have an underlying medical condition), you are encouraged not to attend services or events.
- † If you have a cough, fever, shortness of breath, loss of taste or smell, or other COVID-19 symptoms, please do not attend.
- The most recent guidelines do not limit our occupancy to a specific number, but our socially-distant capacity is just over 100 people.



Meetings and events may be held on site. Social distancing guidelines and all City of Columbia orders must be followed including rules for wearing face masks and for food preparation and service. As with worship services, high-risk and symptomatic individuals are encouraged not to attend events and meetings. Please contact the Church Office if your organization, group, board, etc. plans to resume meeting at Trinity.

Greetings to you in the name of Jesus who told Martha that only "One thing is necessary, the good portion."

It seems everyone is anxious and worried about many things these days. You know what causes your fear and anxiety. However, the problem is not what worries us but the fact that we trust in something other than God to provide for our well-being and happiness. Dr. James Lamb, former executive director of Lutherans For Life addresses the anxiety an infertile couple faces in the following article entitled "Hope for the Infertile Couple":

Assisted reproductive technology (ART) offers hope for couples dealing with the pain of infertility. But ART sometimes fails. It does not always work for every couple. Some such technologies are problematic for the Christian because of moral and spiritual problems inherent in them. Infertile couples need a hope that transcends ART and one that will not fail.

Such hope can be found only in the risen Jesus and the promises that find their "yes" in Him. But first it is important to look at what God does **not** promise. There is nothing in Scripture that declares that having children is a right granted to couples. Children are a gift from God, an "inheritance" (Psalms 127:3). No one has a right to an inheritance. The granting of an inheritance is according to the will and goodness of the giver.

God is the giver of life (Job 12:10). God is the one who opens and closes wombs (Genesis 20:18, 29:31). He does so according to His express purpose. For example, Sarai's womb was closed to emphasize that Isaac was a child of promise (Galatians 4:27-28). Elizabeth's womb was closed to show the importance and significance of John the Baptist. Christian couples should never feel that infertility is the result of being punished for some specific sin. That is not how God relates to His people in Christ. He has taken the curse of sin and placed it on His Son (Galatians 3:13). He was punished in our place (Isaiah 53:5). Infertility is the result of sin in general. Our bodies are not the perfect bodies God intended us to have. They are subject to disease and imperfections. Certainly infertility can be the consequence of bad choices, but most often it is due to circumstances over which couples have little control.

Thus, as painful as infertility is, there is no promise that even Christian couples are somehow entitled to conceive and bear their own child. Nor are they free as Christians to pursue reproductive technologies or treatments that are outside the parameters of the one-flesh union of husband and wife or those what involve the inherent destruction of life in order to achieve a pregnancy. Sometimes Christian couples are called upon to accept their infertility, not as chastisement from God, but as an opportunity to strengthen their faith and be a witness to others to trust in the Lord of Life.

This is where the true and unfailing promises of God are so important. The one we turn to frequently is Romans 8:28 (GOD'S WORD): We know that all things work together for the good of those who love God-those whom he has called according to his plan." Sometimes, however, we fail to see the significance of the last phrase, "according to his plan." In spite of sin and imperfection, God's plans are always carried out for His people (Jeremiah 19:11). A plan God has for an infertile couple, for example, might very well be that He has in mind a child for them to parent through

Another hope-filled promise is found in Proverbs 3:5-6 (GOD'S WORD): Trust the LORD with all your heart, and do not rely on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make your paths smooth." Human understanding is not enough when dealing with childlessness. It is hard to understand. Hearts are heavy and the questions are many. Leaning too heavily on our won understanding can either lead to hopelessness or to paths for remedy that may not be God-pleasing. Abram and Sara, for example, tried to deal with their infertility by having Abram impregnate Sarai's handmaid, Hagar. This was not the path God had chosen, and it only led to bitterness and constant strife. Real hope is found in trusting that God knows the journey He wants us on and will direct our steps (Proverbs 16-9). I remember a childless couple in my former congregation. The path God laid out for them was that they became "mother and father" and spiritual mentors to hundreds of children as they taught Sunday school for a combined total of 85 years!

A final and foundational promise from 1 John 4:9 (GOD'S WORD): "God has shown us his love by sending his only Son into the world so that we could have life through him." Infertile Christian couples are going to have all kinds of doubts and fears. But one thing they need not doubt is the love of God. One thing they need not fear is being forsaken by Him. The assurance of God's love is not determined by the blessings that He gives or withholds. The assurance of God's love is in the cross where He "purchased and won" us. The assurance of God's presence is in the empty tomb. A risen Savior is a present Savior. People who are loved by God, people with whom God is constantly present, are never without hope!

Pastor Thieme led the opening devotion.

The Total Year to Date collections through the end of July are 106.31% of the anticipated amount of \$283,181.53.

Pastor McCalley will take over chapel at the beginning of the fall semester. TLCLC License expires on 8/31/20. Paperwork has been submitted. Licensing changing to non-expiring licenses; unsure of future requirements. Kitchen flooring and countertops are complete. Trustees are scheduling foundation repair on 2/3 year old end of building with settling problems.

TREASURER'S REPORT - Jim Harms

July's Church income was \$45,550 with a year-to-date income for the period ending July 31, 2020 at \$329,567 (60.82% of the years \$541,875 budgeted income).

July's Church expenditures was \$33,692 with a year-to-date expense total for the period ending July 31, 2020 at \$223,380 [45.27% of the years \$493,439 budgeted expenditures adjusted for Acct 519 - Pastor Contingency expenses (\$541,875 budget - \$48,436)]. The Church's year-todate income over expenditures was \$106,188.

July's Learning Center income was \$57,464 with a year-todate income for the period ending July 31, 2020 at \$322,773 (44.09% of the years \$732,000 budgeted income). At the end of July TLCLC still has a \$2,994 COVID-19 Tuition Credit Accounts Payable.

July's Learning Center expenditures were \$54,859 with a year -to-date expense total for the period ending July 31, 2020 at \$362,865 (49.57% of the \$732,000 annual expenditure budget). Learning Center's year-to-date income over expenditures was a negative (\$40,092).

Combined (Church and Learning Center) income over budgeted expenditures totaled \$66,096. However, this amount is reduced to a \$4,271 after \$61,825 was paid in BOD & AOV approved expenditures.

Net operating cash available again increased slightly this last month to \$141,304. COVID-19 and AOV/BOV Motions/ Approvals has greatly reduced the church's available cash to cover its day to day operations. At the end of July \$60,013 is readily available in the checking account when you exclude \$125 Petty Cash and \$81,166 of Money Market Reserves.

On April 14, Trinity received a \$109,500 SBA Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) forgivable 1% loan. These funds are being held in the Designated Accounts. Plan to apply to SBA this month for the loan to be forgiven.

July 31 Dedicated Accounts total \$192,003 which includes the \$109,500 PPP loan. Excludes the GSLS \$144,000 reserve held at LCEF. Adjusted for (\$183.51) Lutheran Witness. Adjusted for (\$50.30) Books Ordered Mbrs.

July 31, 2020: Lutheran Church Extension Funds accounts total \$670,537.

June 30, 2020 TLC LCMS Foundation Endowment Funds account value was \$99,863. A 3.08% market reduction of (\$3,172) from the beginning of the year.

Acct 995.1 TLC BOD/AOV App: \$2,111 expenses (\$1,318.20 - 4 wooden sanctuary chairs; \$408.87 - Lent lite supper; and \$384 - AOV meal).

Upon her death, Joan Quilling bequeathed her estate to TLC valued at approximately \$225,000 to be used for the specific purpose of improving or upgrading the facilities, educational programming, technology and enhancing personnel performance. Settlement pending.

Jim Harms moved we continue with Concordia Health Plan and stay with what we have now for 2021; seconded and approved. Robert Hall moved to approve the Treasurer's Report; seconded and approved.

OLD BUSINESS: None

NEW BUSINESS:

Monitors and Equipment for Pastor Thieme's Study Pastor Thieme requested two 25" monitors, and one docking station. Mary Frerking moved to approve up to \$650 for the purchase of two 25" monitors and one docking station, and the purchase would come from line item 995.1; seconded and approved.

Topographical Survey and Drainage Design for Storm Water Angel Arnall moved that this topic go to the Building Committee for discussion; seconded and approved.

TLCLC Values and Vision Theresa Yaeger gave an overview. No action required.

Life Team Voter Registration Drive Request On behalf of Life Team, Phyllis White requested passing out Voter Registration Cards in September, possibly communion Sundays. Voters must be registered by October 3, 2020. They would also like to make available a Lutherans for Life pamphlet. Carole Eilers suggested having absentee ballots available also. Mary Frerking moved to approve this request, pending available dates; seconded and approved.

Life Team Movie Request On behalf of Life Team, Phyllis White requested to show the movie "Unplanned". The license cost \$189 and it can be shown as many times in a year as we'd like. The Life Team budget would be used for the cost of the license. During the movie they'd like to make available Word of Hope pamphlets. Mary Frerking moved to approve this request; seconded and approved.

Life Team Live Stream Request A live stream is available Saturday, September 26, 2020. It is an online event featuring pro life stories and music. It is set up by "Focus on the Family". Life Team would like to stream it at TLC, and wants to provide the link in the church bulletin and newsletter. Mary Frerking moved to approve this request pending calendar review; seconded and approved.

ANNOUNCEMENTS: The next Board of Directors meeting will be held on September 8, 2020. The next Assembly of Voters meeting will be held on September 20, 2020.

Charlie Cott moved to adjourn at 8:04 PM & Pastor McCalley led the group in closing devotion.
