

Lectionary Preview Study

Prepare for next week: The Sixth Sunday After Pentecost, July 17, 2022

Old Testament: Genesis 18:1-14

1. Where or what is the oaks of Mamre, verse one? A reference also occurs in Genesis 13:18 and 14:13. It is also identified as Hebron in Genesis 23:19 and 25:27. Generally speaking, a specific site is not agreed upon. Roughly speaking, about 24 miles south-southwest of Jerusalem.
2. There is giving and receiving occurring in this account. What did the LORD receive from Abraham? What did Abraham receive from the LORD?
3. This pericope is understood by the Eastern Churches as the Holy Trinity visiting Abraham. An icon, written between 1408 and 1425 by Moscovite Andrei Reblev portrays the visitation. It may also be understood as the Pre-Incarnate Christ and two angels visiting Abraham.
4. In what ways are we “slow” to receive God's visitation? Abraham's enthusiasm to receive the visitors indicates his great faith. Thinking back to the parable of the Good Samaritan, why are we hesitant to give in abundance to our neighbors?
5. In the big picture, what is God promising through Sarah's son and the words of v. 18?



Psalms 27, ant. v 4

Epistle: Colossians 1:21-29

6. St. Paul writes, “you...were alienated and hostile in mind, doing evil deeds.” To what spiritual state is he referring to? See Ephesians 4:18 and Galatians 5:16-24.
7. Verse 22, “reconciled in his body of flesh...” What a glorious statement! The Gospel of Christ Jesus is *extra nos*, outside of us. It is entirely His sacrificial body, not our own, that satisfies the punishment for sin. And it is entirely Jesus' crucified body that makes us, *above reproach*, that, is acceptable to God. The righteousness of Christ is imputed, “stamped,” to you from outside.
8. How do vv.26, 27 connect to the Old Testament?
9. Food for thought: what is the point of Christian suffering?

Holy Gospel: Luke 10:38-42

10. How is Martha's response to the guests similar to Abraham's?
11. Jesus' rebuke in vv.41, 42 is direct, but gentle. How did Sarah respond to the Lord's rebuke in Genesis 18? Though Luke does not provide us with Martha's response, the Lord speaks again to the believing, "Is anything too hard for the Lord?"
12. How do John 4:13-15 and John 6:35 apply here?




Volunteer Sign Up:
