## How do we talk to God?

The Ten Commandments taught us what God expects of us, what pleases Him, and what sins to confess. We learned from the Creed what we can expect from God. In His Word He "talks" to us. Today we are going to look at talking to Him and we do need to talk to Him.

For we are in a situation where no person can perfectly keep the Ten Commandments, even though he has begun to believe. The devil with all his power, together with the world and our own flesh, resists our efforts. Therefore, nothing is more necessary than that we should continually turn towards God's ear, call upon Him, and pray to Him. We must pray that He would give, preserve, and increase faith in us and the fulfillment of the Ten Commandments [2 Thessalonians 1:3]. We pray that He would remove everything that is in our way and that opposes us in these matters (Large Catechism, Part 3).

We pray because He commands us to pray.

You shall not misuse the name of the Lord your God.

What does this mean?

We should fear and love God so that we do not curse, swear, use satanic arts, lie, or deceive by His name, but call upon it in every trouble, pray, praise, and give thanks.

It is not left to our whims and desires. Our Lord is not looking for a silent partner. He bids us to talk to Him in prayer and turn toward Him in giving thanks and in our times of trouble. We are His beloved children and He bends an ear toward us. We pray also because He promised to hear His people.

and call upon me in the day of trouble;

I will deliver you, and you shall glorify me (Psalm 50:15).

"Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives, and the one who seeks finds, and to the one who knocks it will be opened (Matthew 7:7-8).

Our prayers are heard, not on their own merits, but because of Christ.

Since then we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession. For we do not

have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin. Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need (Hebrews 4:14-16).

How do we pray? We can pray the Psalms, as they were used by the Old Testament people, Christ Himself, and the Church as prayers. The Catechism itself can be prayer. Many of the hymns can be used as prayers. Of course the Lord's prayer is the ultimate prayer. Through this prayer He taught the disciples and us how and what to pray. "Taught by our Lord and trusting His promises, we are bold to pray:"

Our Father who art in heaven,
hallowed be Thy name,
Thy kingdom come,
Thy will be done on earth
as it is in heaven;
give us this day our daily bread;
and forgive us our trespasses
as we forgive those
who trespass against us;
and lead us not into temptation,
but deliver us from evil. (Matthew 6 and Luke 11)

#### Scholarship Opportunity

Interested in becoming a church worker (pastor, deaconess, DCE, teacher)? Trinity Lutheran Church offers scholarships for students pursuing church work.



- a. Scholarships may be awarded to students studying for an LCMS church vocation (pastor, teacher, DCE, deaconess, etc.)
- b. Recipients must be attending an LCMS university or seminary.
- c. Recipients must be a member of Trinity Lutheran Church.

#### 2. Application and Approval

- a. Potential recipients must submit a written letter of application to the Board of Directors.
- b. Scholarships may be renewed annually if the recipient requests continued support by submitting a written letter of application to the Board of Directors.
- c. Applications for summer school scholarships will be considered.
- d. Scholarships and their specific amounts must be approved by the Assembly of Voters.

#### 3. Administration

- a. Scholarship checks will be written to the institution (or its appropriate subunit) on behalf of the recipient. Checks will not be written directly to the recipient.
- b. Scholarship funds will first be drawn from the budgeted line account item (account 534). If the budgeted account is depleted, funds may also be drawn from the dedicated LCEF scholarship fund (account 195).
- c. If the budgeted line account has a balance at the end of the fiscal year, the balance will be moved into the dedicated LCEF scholarship fund.

Abortion pills took the lives of nearly 500,000 preborn babies in 2020, while sales from the deadly pill regimen made up an astounding 53% of nationally reported abortion numbers, according to updated data published by Guttmacher Institute researchers. The report entitled, "Abortion Incidence and Service Availability in the United States, 2020," also found that between 2017 and 2020, the share of "medication abortions" increased for all facility types. Numbers published by the FDA through June of 2021 reveal that the abortion pill has ended the lives of nearly five million preborn human beings since its approval in 2000 ... Abortion reporting data is not required by federal law; therefore, the CDC relies solely on data from the states that individually require abortion reporting. Guttmacher gathers information differently, relying on responses to surveys it sends to abortionists; those overall numbers tend to be more comprehensive. "There were 492,210 medication abortions in 2020, a 45% increase from 2017," Guttmacher Institute researchers wrote in a report published on November 20. "Medication abortion accounted for the majority of all abortions in 2020 (53%), compared to 39% in 2017," noted authors Rachel K. Jones, Marielle Kirstein, and Jesse Philbin ... Guttmacher's percent of national abortion pill numbers was slightly higher than what was reported by the CDC. (Live Action News, 11/23/22; CLR LifeWire, 12/8/22)

#### Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ Who blesses us,

"A blessing is neither earned nor deserved but received." And all these blessings shall come upon you and overtake you, if you obey the voice of the Lord your God" (Deuteronomy 28:2). Likewise, life ensues as a gift indicating God's grace and a privilege affirming His favor. A blessing means speaking, a promise humbly hidden in simple words. "Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed" (John 20:29). Likewise, every life has promise and purpose, no matter what size, skills, or circumstances. Blessed amounts to more than being merely happy, healthy, attractive, affluent, or influential. "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied" (Matthew 5:6). Likewise, every human life exceeds just physical functions and emotional assessments.

"A blessing comes from God and connects to Him." So shall they put my name upon the people of Israel, and I will bless them: (Numbers 6:27). Likewise, every human being embodies God's creation, reflects His incarnation, and ensures His ongoing and increasing involvement. A blessing implies multiplication and abundance. "I will surely bless you, and I will surely multiply your offspring as the stars of heaven and as the sand that is on the seashore" (Genesis 22:17). Likewise, even at the beginning, every human person makes our heart bigger and our world better. Blessings often issue from loved ones of significant age and experience. [Elizabeth in her old age] exclaimed with a loud cry, 'Blessed are you among women and blessed is the fruit of your womb!" (Luke 1:42). Likewise, every neighbor draws us beyond appearances and expectations. Blessing consists not only of substance but of activity. "If you know these things, blessed are you if you do them (John 13:17). Likewise, life sets love in motion and puts joy into practice.

## January 10, 2022 Board of Directors (draft meeting minutes)

- I. **Opening Devotion & Prayer**: Pastor Thieme led the Board members in singing the first 2 verses of Hymn # 828, We are Called to Stand Together.
- II. Attendance: Larry McCoig (President), Warren Harms (Treasurer), Mary Frerking (Secretary), Gary Kespohl (Trustees), David Attebery (Elders), Dan Watts (BOECE), Gary Frisch (Endowment), Jacque Eckhoff (Youth), Dianne Mirtz (Evangelism), Pastor Thieme, Daniel Hakes (BOCE), Larry Samuel (Social Ministry), Annette Kiehne (TLCLC Director), Jensen Duenckel (Stewardship & Finance), Doug McDowell (Trustees) & Karen Harms.
- III. Approval of the Meeting agenda: The President noted three additions to the agenda: VI. E., Administrative Items, VII B., Building Committee request, and the monthly report from the Board of Youth (Consent Agenda). Motion made and seconded to approve the agenda as amended. Motion approved without further discussion.
- IV. Treasurer's Reports: The Treasurer reviewed the attached reports. For the year 2022, total receipts for the church were 112% of our annual budget. For the year 2022, total receipts for the Learning Center were 105% of our annual budget. TLCLC reported they did not access any of their reserved funds to meet the budget for 2022.

TLCLC Director had a question about the money for the bonuses for employees that are not part of the grant and should be paid out of 2022 funds. The Director will discuss this with the Treasurer after the meeting. If the grant is not approved, TLCLC will still pay out bonuses for all staff. If granted, TLCLC will pay bonuses to those not covered by the grant.

The Chair of Elders took over as chair of the BOD meeting so the President could discuss several budgets and/or financial items. The President asked generally about the loose plate. The President noted the-laws provide that a board can spend their budget but not spend over their budget without prior approval. Each board needs approval to go over their respective budget.

Motion was made and seconded to accept the Treasurer's reports. Reports accepted without further discussion.

V. **Approval of the Consent Agenda**: The President briefly explained the purpose of a Consent Agenda to the new board members. A motion

was made and seconded to approve the Consent Agenda (as amended with the Board of Youth report). Motion approved without further discussion.

VI. Old Business: Proposed By-Laws changes:
Endowment Fund: This motion was first presented
by the Board of Endowment at the December
2022 BOD meeting and tabled for review and
vote at the January 2023 meeting. After a brief
discussion, the motion remained tabled until the
March BOD meeting so the other boards can also
review their respective portions of the TLC ByLaws (see Motion noted below).

Brief discussion: The Chair of the Board of Endowment discussed the three individual Endowment Funds. Funds from the Main Endowment Fund can be drawn from both the principal and earnings in the fund. Amounts drawn from the two remaining Endowment Funds, a. the 2012 Trinity Youth Endowment Fund, and b. the 2015 Bourret Fund, can only be taken from the earnings in those funds.

The President made a proposal that each board review their section of the Constitution and By-Laws for any changes they would propose for review at the May AOV meeting. The Chair would convene a committee – which is made up of the BOD – to present proposed changes to the AOV. And anything in the By-Laws not reviewed by a specific board be reviewed by the Executive Committee.

A comment was made to simplify the Constitution and/or By-Laws, and instead put details in a separate document such as Operating Procedures.

A Motion was made by the Chair of the Elders for each board to review their respective section of the By-Laws to include greater efficiencies and operational procedures to be presented and reviewed at the March BOD meeting. A second was made. Motion approved.

It was requested that the Secretary send an electronic copy of the By-Laws to be forwarded to all board members.

- A. 2023 Schedule for BOD & AOV meetings: The schedule, which was approved at the December 2022 BOD meeting, was reviewed with current members. It was agreed the BOD will continue to meet at 6:30 pm.
- B. Memo from the Secretary: The Secretary reviewed the attached summary of how board reports are submitted to the Secretary.
- C. Board Report Templates: The Secretary reviewed the attached proposed templates for board reports and board minutes.
- D. Administrative: Pastor Thieme reviewed the handout for a Plan of Action Presentation (handout at meeting). The President reviewed the process of presenting a motion as set forth in the proposed Plan of Action.

Intermissio: Pastor Thieme led the board members in singing verses 3 & 4 of Hymn #828.

#### VII. New Business:

  3 objectives the board wishes to achieve in 2023.
  The proposed schedule was changed to switch
  BOECE to February and BOCE to March. Those
  boards agreed to the proposed schedule
  change.
- B. Building Committee Funding for an elevator in the lift location (handout at meeting): This request for funding was submitted to the President on 1/9/2023. Motion was made and seconded as submitted by the Chair of the Building Committee. Discussion followed.

The Motion as presented by the Building Committee was not approved by a unanimous negative vote. The President advised that the BOD will report to the AOV that this motion was presented and not approved by the BOD.

C.Trustees provided an update on construction of the Infant Room. Remaining projects to complete the room include the installation of the lights and finish patching sheet rock holes.

On 1/24, Septagon will cut out the window and put up a temporary guard until Koontz arrives as planned on 1/26 to install the door. Then finishing work will be needed to complete the project and install pavers by the door. The TLCLC Director advised that once the project is completed, the fire department, licensing, and health department will need to review and approve the project.

## Latin America & the Caribbean: missionaryMAC

I stayed with friends after flying into SDQ late on a Saturday night in November. The following afternoon, we popped over to what was anecdotally described to me as "the most expensive school in the country" to catch the end of a basketball tournament: Carol Morgan School (CMS).



CMS, a pre-K-12 private (though not religiously affiliated) international school, sits on 15 beautiful acres. Its 980 "Sharks" enjoy, among other amenities:

- an air-conditioned gymnasium with wood flooring;
- a water filtration system that allows for potable drinking fountains throughout;
- 72 classrooms;
- seven computer labs; and
- accreditation by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools.

#### How He Built This

I'm an every-now-and-then kind of podcast listener (except when it comes to "5" Minutes with a Missionary," in which case I'm a diehard fan). One I find interesting from time to time is NPR's "How I Built This." Each episode consists of host Guy Raz digging into the backstory behind a mainstream brand, establishment, or website by interviewing its founder. A sampling of some I've listened to includes Jeni's Splendid Ice Creams, Stacy's Pita Chips, Famous Dave's, Expedia, and Mailchimp. It's safe to say most of the guests, whether they set out to or not, have come into the kind of wealth that means they're set for life, with household name recognition to boot. Guy's very last question is always something along the lines of "How much of your success can be attributed to hard work and intelligence, and how much is just being lucky?"

Answers vary.

We, too, are set for life—life eternal. All believers can look forward with joyful anticipation to the riches of heavenly mansions (John 14:2), streets paved with gold (Revelation 21:21), and sumptuous banquets (Isaiah 25:6). How much of our spiritual "success" can be attributed to hard work and intelligence and how much is just being sons and daughters of a loving, merciful Father?

The Bible's answer doesn't waver:

For every house is built by someone, but the builder of all things is God. (Hebrews 3:4)

Your salvation and mine is 100% God's doing. I remember my pastor telling my confirmation class that we have about as much to do with getting ourselves to heaven as a fly flapping its wings on the back of an ox pulling a fully laden carta contribution too infinitesimal to register, and even that's an overestimate.

In grateful response to God's mercy that "depends not on human will or exertion" (Romans 9:16), let's make the name of the "founder and perfecter of our faith" (Hebrews 12:2) a household one, too.



### Partner Spotlight: MOST Ministries



I first got to know MOST (Mission Opportunities Short Term) Ministries, an LCMS Recognized Service Organization, in July 2009, interpreting for an eyeglass clinic as a GEO. Like the LCMS Office of International Mission (OIM), MOST is a mission sending organization, one whose bread and butter is indeed the eyeglass clinics they have down to a science, having given out 149,621 pairs in their 21-year history. In fact, there's an eyeglass team serving in Tanzania

as I write this! Contrary to popular belief, though, MOST isn't a one-trick pony; remaining 2023 opportunities include medical, construction, VBS, water filter, and community outreach teams. MOST and OIM aren't in competition but rather hammering out the minutiae of a symbiotic relationship. COVID put the kibosh on two joint teams slated to serve in Peru in 2020, but three years later—with the addition of a new Executive Director in August 2022 and a former LAC missionary in the role of Mission Engager— I'm again looking forward to how OIM can help MOST round out their calendar and MOST can help OIM fill critical, field-driven needs. Now that's making the MOST of it!
