Lectionary Preview Study

Prepare for next week: Seventh Sunday after Pentecost, July 16, 2023

Old Testament: Isaiah 55:10-13

1. It may be helpful to read 55:6-9. What is the Lord calling His people to do, especially in v. 7?
2. Verses 8-9 are well-known, but reading them in context we gain a clearer understanding of their purpose. In v. 7, God is calling people to turn to him. How is this turning to be done? We don't get the answer right away, but v. 10 provides a "clue" by means of an analogy. In verse 10, what do the rain and snow actually do, what's their purpose? Now, in verse 11, we receive the answer to our question. How will the turning take place? Who solely provides the means for this turning, *and* upholding creation?
3. This chapter of Isaiah is written with the Babylonian Exile in view. In verse 12, what will the atmosphere be when the captives return home?
4. When did thorns come into the world? See Genesis 3:18. These are a consequence of the fall into sin.
5. When the Israelites are sent into Babylon, they are "cut off" from the land. But, when God brings his people back from captivity, it will be like paradise. How "long" does God promise to keep his chosen and redeemed people in paradise, the second half of v. 13?

Psalms 65:9-13

Epistle: Romans 8:12-17

6. In verse 12, St. Paul says that on account of Christ we are no longer debtors to the flesh. The Old Adam perversely delights in this because he thinks, "I can do what I want with the body" because the debt doesn't matter. It would be like the White House making an unsecured promise to forgive debts. So, Paul instructs further: if we indulge the flesh's desires, what happens, v. 12? That's right, the "Supreme Court of the Spirit" has something else to say. The desires of the flesh leading to sin are grounded in law which kills. Romans 7:7-12 is helpful for review.
7. In terms of inheritance, what's the difference between sons and slaves?
8. Are Christians called to a life of comfort, or suffering, v. 17? Since deep study of the law brings knowledge of sin, how would you respond to Christians who have been taught that the Christian life is easy?

Holy Gospel: Matthew 13:1-9, 18-23

9. "The parable of the sower is a parable of warning, but also triumph," says Pastor Bryan Wolfmueller. What verses in 1-9 and 18-23 are warning, which are triumph?
10. According to vv. 18-23, what are the enemies of the seeds?
11. What is the seed? (v. 22-23)
12. How is Isaiah 55:11 a comfort here despite the vicious opposition to the word of God?
13. What word of God dies and rises again so that the enemies of God cannot put up any everlasting obstacles to the word's purposes?

Grief Resource Available

Stephen Ministry has a resource available to you. *Journeying through Grief* book sets can help you extend care and minister to people you know who are grieving the loss of a loved one. The four short books are intended to be given at 3 weeks, 3 months, 6 months, and 11 months during the first year after a loss. A tracking card is included to record when each book is due to be given and the date they were given. Each 44-page book focuses on the feelings and issues a person is likely to experience at that point in his or her grief, offering comfort, help, and hope throughout that difficult first year.

Although the books are written from a Christian perspective, they address spiritual matters sensitively, with a focus on ideas and principles that would apply for any reader, whatever his or her beliefs.

It is sometimes difficult to know how to minister to others who are grieving. Our hope is this will be a loving and effective way for you to extend care to people in your life. 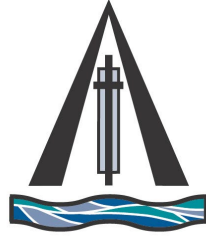
