The Gift of Holy Absolution

Who of us is without sin? We are God's Baptized children, yet sin rails against us. I say, think, and do things that I should not. The things I should do as a Christian, I push aside. Even Paul struggled with this plight. "Wretched man that I am! Who will deliver me from this body of death? Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord!" (Romans 7:24-25)

This battle is not a one-and-done for us. Daily we struggle against sin. Our desire is Christ, but our stumbling slams us face-first into our failings, shortcomings, and sin. Such a life leads to discord in our life with God and one another.

Into that discord comes a bright note, Christ has given us the gift of Holy Absolution to bring us from death to life. A daily dying and rising, if you will. "And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you withhold forgiveness from any, it is withheld" (John 20:22-23).

The Lord does not leave us alone to struggle but sends us His servants. "God, having raised his servant, sent him to you first, to bless you by turning every one of you from your wickedness" (Acts 3:26). Showing us our sins, God bids us to confess those sins.

"But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin. If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. If we say we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us" (1 John 1:7-10).

In turning you by the law of God from sin, the servant of the Lord then proclaims forgiveness (that is, to send our sins away from us to Christ, who by His life redeems).

God alone forgives sins and gives the authority to his servants (John 20:22-23) to declare forgiveness to the hurting sinner. Thus, the small catechism asks, "What is the Office of the Keys?"

"The Office of the Keys is that special authority which Christ has given to His Church on earth to forgive the sins of repentant sinners, but to withhold forgiveness from the unrepentant as long as they do not repent."

Thus, by the authority and command of the Lord, a Pastor does the bidding of Christ to bring comfort and restoration to His people. During private confession and absolution, as well as during the Divine Services, the servant of the Lord and your servant delivers this great gift of forgiveness.

- Almighty God in His mercy has given His Son to die for you and for His sake forgives you all your sins. As a called and ordained servant of Christ, and by His authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Spreading His Word

2023 Higher Things Conference • Beyond Reasonable Doubt



I2 Trinity Youth and 6 adults traveled to sultry Carbondale IL to the campus of Southern Illinois University July 18-21 for a Higher Things youth conference. This was our congregation's first time attending. We had strong feelings about our Soviet-style dorms, but thankfully we were busy with worship, breakaway sessions, plenaries, eating, and enjoying the entertainment offerings, we barely even had time to sleep!

WORSHIP

I, 150 students and adults worshiped four times a day. The morning services were Morning Prayer or Matins. After lunch, the students prayed Vespers or Evening Prayer, offering a little taste of incense. At IIpm small groups throughout campus prayed Compline. We learned and loved what is available in our hymnal. Divine Service opened and closed the conference.

We were so excited to sing great hymns with 1,000 other youth along with organ, choir, and many instruments.





TEACHING • BREAKAWAYS

Participants had 2-3 breakaways each day they could attend on specific topics. Several of our youth enjoyed "Faith and Reason: A Scientist's Perspective" by Dr. Bryan Stearns. Pastor McCalley taught a session as well "Only Believers Have Doubts." Other topics included, "A Healthy Dose of Lament" about the psalms of lament and "Cantorology 101" explaining the what, why and how of church music.

TEACHING • PLENARIES

We learned from Dr. Adam Francisco in our first two plenary sessions about the reliability of the Bible and how to address common objections about its veracity.

Pastor Harrison Goodman presented on Thursday and Friday on how doubt afflicts a believer and how Christ's cross is the answer to all doubt. He reminded us: "do not let your doubt be measured by the difficulty of the struggle, but by the sufficiency of Jesus' death."



ENTERTAINMENT

Each evening after dinner but before Compline, youth had a whole host of activities to choose from: axe throwing, paint along, use of the university's rec center with bumper balls, volleyball, basketball, sidewalk chalk.

Were you interested in attending the Death and Dying Study offered at the 6:30am Men's Study but would rather learn during hours for the living? Pastor McCalley will offer this study again in August. This study is designed to encourage you to Christian confidence to contend with death in this life, help prepare for death, equip to share and teach others about these issues, and answer as many questions as you have about anything and everything related to it; all this so we may fear the grave as little as our bed for Jesus' sake. We'll begin with the Scripture, discuss the rites and worship services used when death is near and for funerals, move on to planning, and finally explore many questions and issues such as organ donation, near death experiences, and hospice. Please let Heather in the Church Office know if you plan to attend so materials may be prepared. [It is not necessary to read this announcement with a Vincent Price accent].

Grief Resource Available

Stephen Ministry has a resource available to you. Journeying through Grief book sets can help you extend care and minister to people you know who are grieving the loss of a loved one. The four short books are intended to be given at 3 weeks, 3 months, 6 months, and 11 months during the first year after a loss. A tracking card is included to record when each book is due to be given and the date they were given. Each 44-page book focuses on the feelings and issues a person is likely to experience at that point in his or her grief, offering comfort, help, and hope throughout that difficult first year.

Although the books are written from a Christian perspective, they address spiritual matters sensitively, with a focus on ideas and principles that would apply for any reader, whatever his or her beliefs.



The Life Team has several items to share with you. First, we recommend the movie, Sound of Freedom. It is a true story of the horrific reality of human trafficking which happens all over the world, including the United States. This is a powerful and emotional movie and definitely not recommended for families to watch together. However, it is the slavery of our times and we urge you to see it, if possible, to become informed about this issue and see how you can help.

Next, Save the Date! Life Network of Central Missouri is holding their annual banquet on Friday, September 15th at the Crossing Church. The speaker this year is Kelly Lester who shares her story about desperate situations and that they are not beyond God. She shares her story of God making beauty from the ashes of her life. The Trinity Life Team is sponsoring a table this year and 4 seats are available. If you are interested in attending, please contact Sylvia Glenn or Phyllis White.

And one more item: the Life Team, in an effort to educate and equip our congregation to be Gospel motivated voices for life, is working to bring a speaker from Missouri Right to Life to talk about the proposed initiative petitions for the election in 2024 and how, if passed, they would affect the protections for women and unborn children in our state. Be on the lookout for the announcement in the weeks to come!

Greetings in the name of Jesus who cares for the caregivers,

God calls us to care for those in need, especially disabled persons, those with an incurable disease or the elderly. He also promises to help those

involved in care giving. Much of that help comes from fellow believers who come along side the caregiver. Hospice care is one avenue for that help. Last month we considered questions to ask before choosing a hospice. This month we will consider other aspects of care giving as presented by Pastor Scott Licht, CFO/COO of Lutherans For Life, when he spoke about some end of life considerations at the Annual meeting of Lutherans For Life of MO.

Care giving can bring many conflicting emotions. Here are some, to name a few: stress; satisfaction; frustration; love; anxiety; commitment; overwhelmed; inadequate; joy; grief; helpless; resentful; tired; angry; happy; opportunity; hopeful; fulfilled; obligated; honored. As you can see the emotions are varied and run from one extreme to another. All these emotions can bring about "careaiver stress".

Signs of caregiver stress include

Feeling overwhelmed or constantly worried

Sleeping too much or too little

Significant weight gain or loss

Becoming easily irritated or angry

Losing interest in activities that were enjoyable

Frequent headaches, bodily pains, or other physical problems

Abusing alcohol or drugs, including prescription medicines

There are ways caregivers can relieve their own stress and ways that others can help them. The caregiver can

PRAY!!!

Ask for/Accept help

Focus on what one CAN do

Get connected with community services such as transportation, meals or disease-specific education

Be vigilant about one's physical, spiritual, and mental health.

Others can be God's hands in helping the caregiver. This is where the church steps in by PRAYING!!. One might also offer to provide respite care so the caregiver may go to work, get her hair done, get a massage, meet with friends, shop for Christmas presents, attend choir practice, etc. Another might organize volunteers to provide respite care so that caregivers can get together as a group for mutual support and encouragement. It is also important not to forget the person being cared for by giving them opportunities to keep up with friends, etc.

Is there a caregiver that you can help today? Look around and be God's hands and feet.



Confession and Absolution



What is Confession? Confession has two parts. First, that we confess our sins, and second, that we receive absolution, that is, forgiveness, from the pastor as from God Himself, not doubting, but firmly believing that by it our sins are forgiven before God in heaven.

What sins should we confess? Before God we should plead guilty of all sins, even those we are not aware of, as we do in the Lord's Prayer; but before the pastor we should confess only those sins which we know and feel in our hearts.

Which are these? Consider your place in life according to the Ten Commandments: Are you a father, mother, son, daughter, husband, wife, or worker? Have you been disobedient, unfaithful, or lazy? Have you been hot-tempered, rude, or quarrelsome? Have you hurt someone by your words or deeds? Have you stolen, been negligent, wasted anything, or done any harm?
