
# The Tenth Sunday after Pentecost Sunday, August 6, 2023



Warm greetings to you, dear worshipper, in the name of our Risen Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. May the blessings of His presence and His peace be with you throughout this week.

# Preparation for the Lord's Supper

Holy Communion is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that with the bread and the wine we also truly receive the Body and Blood of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. We call this belief the Doctrine of the Real Presence. Through the gift of Communion, the Lord bestows on us the forgiveness of sins and strengthens our union with Him and with one another.

Our Lord desires that those who commune should know and believe what they are receiving in Holy Communion (1 Corinthians 11:29), should be instructed in God's Word so that they can properly examine themselves prior to communing (1 Corinthians 11:28), and should be united as one body in the faith (Acts 2:42 and 1 Corinthians 10:17).

Out of our heartfelt desire that all who commune at this altar be well prepared for Holy Communion, this congregation practices "close communion." All who are presently communicant members in a congregation of The Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod and those Lutheran churches that are in altar and pulpit fellowship with the LCMS are warmly invited to join us in Communion. All other quests are warmly invited to come to the communion rail for a blessing from the Pastor. Please cross your arms at the rail to receive the blessina.

We invite guests to visit with the pastor about how we may commune together in the future.



Communicants may receive the wafer by having it placed directly into the mouth or by having it placed in the palm of the hand. If the communicant wishes to take the individual cup, please take one from the tray when the elder comes to your place at the communion rail. Drink from the individual cup only when the pastor/elder comes to your place at the communion rail with the

chalice and speaks the words of distribution. If the communicant wishes to receive the chalice, do not take an individual cup from the tray carried by the elder.

The Lord has given His people the gift of His Body and His Blood in, with and under the consecrated bread and wine for the forgiveness of sins (St. Matthew 26:28). However, if an individual is allergic or intolerant to wheat or fermented wine, it is difficult to participate in this great fellowship. Should you be one of these individuals, we gladly provide gluten-free and alcohol-removed wine so that you are able to receive these gifts of God with your brothers and sisters in Christ.

**Guests:** If you are a guest worshiping with us today, we are honored to have you join us in receiving the rich blessings that our Lord supplies to us through the gift of His holy Word. We invite you to return and worship with us again as the opportunity arises.





**Children:** Parents and their children are welcome to sit in the front of the church so that the children can see and hear the service clearly. The Family Room in the Narthex may be used by anyone who the little children prefers or needs a more private setting.

**Prayer Requests:** If you have an intercession to add to our weekly prayers at church or to our daily Prayer Chain, please contact the Church Office or fill out one of the prayer request cards located in your pew and place it in the offering collection box.





**Publications:** We invite you to read our Trinity Weekly News and visit our bulletin boards for info about church activities. Publications including our monthly newsletter are available from the information stand in the Narthex and at various locations in the hallway.

Accessibility: A lift (slow-moving elevator) is located just outside the sanctuary overflow area for those who prefer not to take the stairs to the lower level. Ushers and many church members can assist with the operation of the lift.

If you would like to try these devices to see if they will enhance your worship experience, they are located in the Narthex. # Lectionary Preview Study Prepare for next week: Eleventh Sunday after Pentecost, August 13, 2023

#### Old Testament: Job 38:4-18

- 1. In chapter 38 the Lord answers Job. What had he asked? See ch. 23:2-6. What is the attitude of Job's heart in the ch. 23 verses? After reading 38:4-18, how heaping is the slice of humble pie Job has been giving?
- 2. Job had hoped to teach God. What does Romans 11:31-33 have to say? Even though Job sinned in his ignorance about the ways of God, God still desires to show mercy and compassion. What is the chief way God has shown mercy to those who claim to be wiser than God (that is, every person who has and will live)? 2 Cor. 2:16.
- 3. In these verses, God elaborates his almighty power and wisdom over his creation. Job had claimed to have an advanced understanding of God's design and purpose, but God made quick correction of that. Even though God is almighty and we are poor miserable sinners, how does Psalm 139 remind us that God's upholding creation is indeed loving?

#### Psalm 18:1-6

#### Epistle: Romans 10:5-17

- 4. In chapters 9-11, Paul continues to address the Jewish rejection of Jesus. Here in chapter 10, he discusses the righteousness of the law as compared to the righteousness that comes by faith. In vv. 6-8 Moses is referencing Deuteronomy 30:11-14. The short and sweet of it is: "Looky here, God gave you his Law, it came directly: God gave it to Moses on Mt. Sinai in stone" or "When it comes to the Law, it's not a "Leonard Nimoy-style intergalactic cosmic mystery that you have to wander off in your own mind and create some elaborate and error-filled explanation based on the weakness of human reason! You know how and what God says about His will. You actually know and believe the truth!"
- 5. Thus, the second part of Paul's rhetorical questions about how to think about Jesus in 6b-7. Paul is saying to the Jews, "if God came to give the law, so also He comes to bring fulfillment of the Law by faith in Christ Jesus! You don't have to wander into heaven to find Christ or descend to hell to bring him up! Don't invent some explanation of how God saves. Don't you see? Whether it's the Law or the fulfillment of the Law God comes directly to you because He sent Jesus into your own flesh! You don't have to resize the universe in your head to get ahold of God's grand plan." How do the Jews and all people receive the fulfillment of the Law, v. 9?

#### Holy Gospel: Matthew 14:22-33

- 6. Jesus walking on water and upholding Peter reveals that He indeed is Lord over all creation, both the wind and waves and our mortal bodies.
- 7. Bible word problems! When is the fourth watch of the night? Each watch is three hours long and the first watch begins at 6pm.
- 8. What was Peter's reaction to the wind in v. 30? What did Elihu warn his friend of in Job 8:17 if God appeared in a wind? Though Jesus is Lord over creation, what does Jesus say to Peter despite creation's power, v. 29?
- 9. St. John gets the most attention when Jesus says the "I AM's" of the Bible, but well, well, well, what do we have here in verse 27? Even though God is omnipotent over creation,

and the holy name of God is cause for sinners to fear, what does Jesus immediately say to the disciples after he says, "I AM?" Because of Jesus' work, why is the hearing name of God a comfort to Christians?


