



A new director is in place and the speaker, Kelly Lester, a former Planned Parenthood worker, gave us a unique perspective from inside the abortion industry. The fundraising goal for the banquet was \$75,000 and God was moving in his people as the preliminary amount raised is

\$144,000! This will allow My Life Clinic to rent a billboard on I-70 for one year, provide My Life Clinic magnets for every Mizzou dorm room, hire additional staff and continue clinic renovations. Many, many thanks to all who attended and to our congregation for sponsoring a table.

This event will be held on Sunday, October 8<sup>th</sup> after the late service at 12:15 p.m. Our speakers are Susan Klein and Sherry Lee from Missouri Right to Life. #### Life's Puzzle

God's creation is a beautiful puzzle. When one decides to end his life, God's puzzle is incomplete. Everyone is part of God's creation and adds a special piece to the overall puzzle. Our lives add value and have a relevant place in the world God designed. When someone commits suicide, it takes one amazing piece away from God's puzzle.

The Bible discusses the value and purpose of life in great detail. Jeremiah 29:11 says, "For I know the plans I have for you declares the Lord, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and hope" (English Standard Version). It is important to understand life can and will be difficult. God has a wonderful plan for each and every one of us; people must not lose hope. Unfortunate events can happen, and one must figure out how to work through them. When individuals keep God in their lives and listen to what He says, they have a better chance of realizing they have a purpose, just as they are. When one commits suicide a puzzle piece is lost forever. Suicide is the 12th leading cause of death, effecting every ethnic group and all ages ("Suicide"). 1 Corinthians 6:20 says, "For you were bought with a price, so glorify God in your body." God did not give people a life for it to end early. Every person has value and is brought into the world for a reason.

All people should understand and say to themselves: I am loved, just as I am. Ephesians 2:10 says, "For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them." The importance of life goes beyond our daily lifestyle and tasks. There can also be a stronger purpose in situations not always seen and heard. While 275,000 people are saved every year from suicide, about 800,000 die worldwide from suicide alone ("Suicide"). Mental health is important, as well as helping people feel like they belong and are part of God's puzzle.

God's puzzle becomes incomplete when someone commits suicide. The Bible tells every person they have value and a purpose as a human being. If people follow God's word throughout their lives, everyone will feel connected. In the end, each piece of the puzzle will fit exactly how God intended.



Won't you encourage a young person you know to enter the essay contest this fall? They and we will be blessed by their witness to the sanctity of all human life.

## September 12, 2023 Board of Directors (draft meeting minutes)

Meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m.

- Opening Devotion & Prayer: Pastor McCalley: Pastor led the members of the BOD in reviewing Hymn #686, Come, Thou Font of Every Blessing and singing Stanzal of the Hymn.
- II. - III. Approval of the Meeting Agenda: The President asked to amend the meeting agenda to include an Audio/Visual Committee report under Old Business, and Gym basketball goals under New Business. Evangelism also asked for an opportunity to make an announcement from the Board. A motion was made and seconded to approve the meeting agenda as amended. The meeting agenda as amended was approved without further discussion.
- IV. Treasurer's Reports: The Treasurer reviewed the reports submitted as part of the packet of materials. The Treasurer noted there is \$610,922 in funds available from the LCEF for building projects for the church, if needed. A motion was made and seconded to accept the reports from the Treasurer. #### VI. Old Business:

- A. Evangelism: It was reported the Board of Evangelism is planning to host a movie night on September 30th to be held in the church parking lot. The Board requests church members come out and meet other members of the Congregation at this event.

  Trunk or Treat is scheduled for October 29th, and there is a very big need for candy for the event. A box will be set out in the church for members to drop off candy donations, and there will be a sign-up sheet for those willing to host a trunk for the event.
- B. Trustees Board of the Month Report: Trustees presented members with a Quiz regarding the role and responsibilities of the Trustees as set forth in the By-Laws and what do they mean. The Quiz was reviewed by the Trustees with the members of the BOD.
- C. Audio/Visual Committee: The President noted the BOD was asked to put a committee together to address the audio and visual needs of the church. The President has identified one member (so far) who is willing to assist with this need, but he continues to work towards completing the set up of this committee.

**Intermissio**: Pastor McCalley led the members in reviewing and singing Stanza's 2 & 3 of Hymn #686.

#### VII. New Business:

A. Constitution Committee Report: The President reviewed the handout report for the Constitution Committee. The Committee has made some proposed changes for the By-Laws and the Constitution. The Constitution committee will be present at the October 10, 2023, BOD meeting to review the handout and answer questions of the BOD members. The President also advised that some

members of the Congregation believe more than five (5) members should be required to request a Special Voters Meeting, and that the AOV agenda be provided to members further in advance of the meeting than is presently required. The BOD members are asked to review and be prepared to discuss the handout for the October BOD meeting.

- B. Board of Youth Gift Basket request: The Board of Youth discussed proposed prizes for Trivia Night which will be held on October 14, 2023. One proposed prize is a bottle of wine/alcohol. The Elders were asked if they would have any objection to offering this gift at the Trivia Night event. Elders advised that it had no such objection. The BOD also had no objection to the Board of Youth offering alcohol as a prize for Trivia Night so long as it is unopened and is not consumed on church premises.
- C. Gym Basketball Goals: The President discussed the potential danger with the basketball goals currently in the church gym as they can tip over if not properly secured. The President is looking for members to serve on the Gym Use Committee to address this and other potential uses for the facility (audio, volleyball, drop down goals, etc.). The TLC Director asked that a member of the Learning Center should be a member of the Gym Use Committee when formed.

#### VIII. Announcements:

- A. The next BOD meeting is scheduled for October 10, 2023, at 6:30 pm. Budget worksheets will be available for Board usage after the September financials are closed out. The President asked the boards to be working towards discussing and/or finalizing their respective budgets before the November BOD meeting.
- B. The next regularly scheduled AOV meeting is September 24, 2023, at 12 pm.
- IX. **Adjournment**: Meeting was adjourned at 7:30 pm
