
The Festival of the Reformation Sunday, October 29, 2023


Nicene Creed






The Words of Our Lord


Infant/Toddler Opening

Lectionary Preview Study

Prepare for next week: The Feast of All Saints (observed), November 5, 2023

First Reading: Revelation 7:2-17

- 1. John sure is seeing quite a number of angels in his vision. How many does he see in verse one of this chapter? What is the duty of the angel in verse 2? In general, what does a seal signify?
- 2. There are different types of angels in the Scripture. What is the job of the angel in Malachi verse 3:1? He is a messenger of the _____? How is this similar to a seal?
- 3. Chapter 6 describes the wrath of God against unbelief. Chapter 7 is encouraging for believers. What is the good news in verse 3?
- 4. The listing of 12,000 from each tribe of Israel would have resonated powerfully with the saints of the early church because they saw themselves as the **NEW** Israel. What makes a person a believer of the new Israel? Romans 9:8.

Psalm 149

Epistle: 1 John 3:1-3

- 5. What part of the Small Catechisms' teaching on the Lord's Prayer instructs Christians on how to address God?
- 6. According to verse 1, what is the only way to the Father?
- 7. In verse 3, Christians are pure for Christ's sake. In the Greek, the word purify is in the present tense, indicating *ongoing* purification. How is the Christian continually purified throughout life? This is to ask, how are we kept holy? See the Explanation to the Third Article of the Creed.

Holy Gospel: Matthew 5:1-12

8. The debate about who Jesus is talking about in the beatitudes (the *blessed are...*) in some form or another usually ends up at this point: "is Jesus talking about himself or us?" Certainly, Jesus Himself is indeed everything He lists in vv.5-12, and perfectly so! Yet, He is also talking to a crowd who has gathered to hear Him preach. It seems odd He would be talking about Himself. Usually, He refers to Himself in this way when addressing His opponents. How can we be sure the blessings Jesus describes are indeed ours, especially in light of his resurrection and glorified body. Look back to 1 John3:2; Romans 8:29, 12:1; Colossians 3:10; Ephesians 4:24; Philippians 3:21; 1 John 4:4, Titus 3:5.
