Matthew 25:30 – "And cast the worthless servant into the outer darkness." Why did the worthless servant act the way he did? Because of what he believed about the Master. It's the same with us, but in reverse: since we know our Lord God to be faithful and kind, we desire to serve Him and render faithful service with what He has given us.

ing Concordia: The Lutheran Confessions – A Reader's Edition of The Book of Concord (second edition), starting with Luther's Large Catechism. We will use the same format as with The Lutheran Study Bible; i.e., we will read each section together and discuss the doctrine using the Concordia notes.

Grief Resource Available

Stephen Ministry has a resource available to you. Journeying through Grief book sets can help you extend care and minister to people you know who are grieving the loss of a loved one. The four short books are intended to be given at 3 weeks, 3 months, 6 months, and 11 months during the first year after a loss. A tracking card is included to record when each book is due to be given and the date they were given. Each 44-page book focuses on the feelings and issues a person is likely to experience at that point in his or her grief, offering comfort, help, and hope throughout that difficult first year.

Although the books are written from a Christian perspective, they address spiritual matters sensitively, with a focus on ideas and principles that would apply for any reader, whatever his or her beliefs.

It is sometimes difficult to know how to minister to others who are grieving. Our hope is this will be a loving and effective way for you to extend care to people in your life. The book sets are available to you at no cost or obligation. A sample set is on display in the information stand in the narthex. Lectionary Preview Study

Prepare for next week: The Last Sunday of the Church Year — November 26, 2023

Old Testament: Ezekiel 34:11-16: 20-24

- 1. In the lead up to these verses, the Lord preaches a stern warning against Israel's spiritual leaders. What had the shepherds of Israel failed to do, 34:8? How will the Lord himself correct this deficiency, in verse 11?
- 2. How expansive and vast will the Lord's gathering be, v. 13?
- 3. There are three references to the mountains of Israel being the dwelling place of God's sheep, in vv. 13-16. What is the significance of mountains in Ezekiel. Look at Ezek. 20:40. What is God promising to do there? If we back up just a few more verses to 20:27-29, how is God's high, holy place different from what the Israelites had been doing in the high places? (v. 27 contains the specific sin)
- 4. Vv.20-24 contain several similarities with 17-19. Why is repetition helpful? What's going on within the flock of Israel? How does Paul instruct on this matter in 1 Cor. 12:25-26?
- 5. When Ezekiel preaches, King David is dead. What David is he referring to, and how long will this David reign? Ezek. 37:25.

Psalm 95:1-7

Epistle: 1 Corinthians 15:20-28

- 6. Who are those who have fallen asleep? This refers to physical death, the death of the fleshly body. Why would Paul describe death as sleep?
- 7. Who are the two men being referred to in verse 21? Answer in verse 22. What is the work of each?
- 8. In verse 24, what is every rule and every authority, and power? These are primarily evil spiritual powers: sin, death, and the power of the devil. How do these enemies manifest themselves in all of creation?
- 9. Vv. 27-28 are really driving at the consummation of the kingdom of God. We might look at this way: our bodily resurrection means we will possesses the fullness of eternal life forever. The consummation is also complete at Christ's complete vanquishing of anything and everything that opposes the eternal reign of God. Revelation 21:3-5 also illustrates what will happen for the sake of Christ.

Holy Gospel: Matthew 25:31-46

- 10. The parables of chapter 25 increase, in an orderly fashion, the authority figure. In 25:1, we have a bridegroom. In 25:20, a wealthy landowner. In 25:31, BAM! THE SON OF MAN! A KING, really meaning, a judge—the final and absolute authority.
- 11. If someone offered the argument from vv.35-36 that we're saved by works, how would you respond? Why do the servants do these works? How do 1 Cor. 3:8 and Luke 6:35 help us understand the reward of saving faith and not the cause of saving faith?
- 12. In verse 45-50, you can hear themes from each of the previous three parables.
- 13. On the basis of verse 46, how would you dissuade someone from thinking heaven and hell are temporary?
