


## Men's Thursday Bible Study

CHURCH YEAR CALENDAR There really is no Fourth Sunday in Advent because Christmas Eve falls on a Sunday, and therefore the celebrations of The Nativity of Our Lord takes precedence over any other liturgical date. The Church is almost impatient by the fourth Sunday and cries out, "Come quickly Lord Jesus!" You likely know the "12 Days of Christmas" carol. These 12 days are sort of a "mini-season" of the church year. The practice has been around since 567 AD when the Council of Tours set forth this celebration. The point of 12 days is to carry us from Christmas Day to Epiphany- such was the importance of gathering together to worship and meditate on God's taking on our human flesh to accomplish our salvation and His revelation as the beloved Son of God. Theme of the Week: *The Word of the is Fulfilled in the Flesh of Jesus*.
