CHURCH YEAR CALENDAR

Epiphany focuses the Church's thinking to the specific ways God manifests His glory in the person and work of Jesus Christ.

THEME OF THE WEEK

This Sunday St. Mark records heaven opening and the voice of the Father himself confirming Jesus as His Son, a Divine Son, and a Son with authority. Our theme then is "God Manifested in the Baptism of Jesus." Jesus' Baptism is not only a confirmation of his status as God's own son, but also an inauguration of His public ministry. After the baptism everything Jesus does is publicly preaching, teaching, healing, and miracles. The Prayer of the Week encourages believers to continually return the work and promises of God given in their own baptism. For in water and word each of us was made an heir, a divine son, and that we may also enjoy the blessings of glorification (especially divine wisdom, which is why the daily morning readings are from Proverbs) which God gives on account of Jesus. A review of the Small Catechism section on Baptism will be useful for prayer and meditation this week.

Father in heaven, at the Baptism of Jesus in the Jordan River You proclaimed Him Your beloved Son and anointed Him with the Holy Spirit. Make all who are baptized in His name faithful in their calling as Your children and inheritors with Him of everlasting life; through the same Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

On behalf of Lutheran Family and Children Services of Mid-Missouri, thank you for your generosity in contributing essential items to our "Season of Sharing Christmas Tree". Your kindness helped restock the LFCS closet with critical supplies for clients' emergency use.

In this season of giving 2023, Trinity Lutheran Church and Trinity Lutheran Child Learning Center contributed 4,558 diapers/pullups and 7,164 baby wipes to this cause. I share these numbers to give you an example of your generosity and compassion for this cause in that the numbers of diapers and wipes donated nearly doubled last year's numbers collected. Also donated: pacifiers/teething rings, infant medication items, thermometers, infant formula, infant shampoo/lotion, infant clothing, blankets, bottles, books, misc. toys, household cleaning/laundry supplies, adult personal care items, and \$80 to provided services to clients. The LFCS staff members expressed sincere appreciation when items were delivered because of the growing need this year.

In addition to facilitating adoptions, LFCS assists individuals and families with parenting support. They also provide counseling services for pregnancy, postpartum depression, grief, divorce, abuse, and other emotional issues.
