Objectives

Sunday School Times

Sunday School is held for youth age 3 through High School Seniors each Sunday throughout the year with classes beginning at 9:15am ending at 10:15am. To ensure proper supervision, children should arrive no earlier than 9:10am.

Youth classes begin with an opening in their specified areas and then break into individual classes for the lesson of the day. Parents should drop off their children at the locations listed below. Parents are always welcome to join in during Sunday School, although it is not



required. Adult Sunday School classes are also offered at this time if you would like to attend with other Trinity members and visitors.

Sunday School Locations

Pre-K thru Kindergarten meet in Rm 229 at the end of the Learning Center hallway.

First thru Fifth Grades meet in the Overflow Area in Sanctuary.

Sixth thru Eighth Grades meet in Rm 248 in the back hallway of the Learning Center.

Ninth thru Twelfth Grades meet in the Youth Room downstairs on the stage.

Adults meet downstairs in the Fellowship Hall (generally two classes offered, with an occasional special topic available in the Family Room).

Attendance

Regular attendance at Sunday School is vital for children to build an ongoing relationship with their teacher and the other



students and regularly study God's Word.

Offerings

Offerings are collected each Sunday from the children to help develop giving regular gifts back to the Lord who is the giver of all good things. The Board of Christian Education will pick a special mission to send the children's offerings to throughout the year. Memory Work

Our Sunday School curriculum includes memory work for 1st through 5th grades. Memory work is a wonderful foundation that will serve our children now and later in life.
