## **From the Pastor's Desk**

Members of Trinity,

Having met with the elders every month one of their chief concerns is how to reach all the members of Trinity. For what reason? To help them with their spiritual life. I, as your vacancy Pastor, have that same concern. What do we, you and the elders, do to help encourage one another?

The best way to encourage all members is to worship God regularly, every Sunday! ## **Call Committee**

The Call Committee worked through the call list submitted to us by the Rocky Mountain District and interviewed the top three candidates for a call. The interviews took place June 15 and 16, 2017 and were done via Skype. Based on the written information submitted to us and the interviews, we ranked the candidates as follows:

1. Rev. Adam Hengst, King of Glory Lutheran Church, Williamsburg, VA
2. Rev. Anton Lagoutine, St. John's Lutheran Church, Conover, NC
3. Rev. Kent Schaaf, Grace Lutheran Church, Grass Valley, CA

Pastor Hengst withdrew his name from consideration on June 30, 2017 due to complications with his wife's pregnancy, so the Voters Meeting to decide on a call was delayed a week to July

16, 2017. Information sheets on both Pastor Lagoutine and Pastor Schaaf were distributed on July 2, 2017. Feedback from the congregation was that more information was desired prior to a vote. Based on the interview and additional information collected, the committee felt that Pastor Schaaf should not be recommended to the congregation. Although a majority of the committee favored recommendation of Pastor Lagoutine, it was not unanimous. Therefore, the committee decided to ask for additional nominations from the congregation and additional names from the District.

Nominations from the congregation are due July 31. Names and contact information can be given to any of the committee members. The committee will make the request to the District for additional names

on August 2. We expect a new call list approximately three weeks after that. Review of the candidates' resumes and interviews should take place by approximately October 1.

### **Missions**

As summer comes to a close, don't forget **Operation Christmas Child** when you are shopping. Stores are beginning to clearance out their summer clothes, shoes and flip-flops and summer toys. They are also running specials on Back-to-School items such as socks, underwear, and school supplies. Later in August these supplies will go on clearance and we should be able to pick up lots of items for our OCC boxes that we will be assembling in early October. There will be a box in the narthex to deposit items for our boxes. There will also be plastic OCC boxes available this year and I am looking into purchasing them for our boxes.

Also, please continue to bring in your **plastic grocery bags** to be made into sleeping mats for the homeless.

### **The Bridge Community Yard Sale and Silent Auction**

The Bridge Emergency Shelter and Day Labor Center has been granted permission to continue to use the old Justice Building as a shelter for the immediate future. Thanks to the generosity of this community and surrounding area, we have raised more than \$65,000 towards the building of a permanent new shelter at a nearby location. Meanwhile, we will now be incurring costs for some of the utilities in our current location. Running a shelter in any location is a costly venture. Imagine up to 50 showers, meals and laundry on a daily basis in addition to staffing costs.

How can you help us to meet this vital need in our community? You can help us by making arrangements to donate any of your gently

used items for a county-wide yard sale and silent auction planned for October 6-8 at the Bridge. Calls may be made to either Laurie Knutson or Theresa Wilson at the Bridge (565-9808) or Jackie Snow with the Shepherd's New Staff at Trinity Lutheran Church (565-2615) to schedule a drop off. To ensure that everyone's donation is handled with the care and respect that it deserves, please make arrangements prior to dropping anything off, as the shelter is currently closed until mid-October and there is not always a staff member in the building.

### **Shepherd's New Staff**

Terrylynn and Michael Tito have created a new organization called the Shepherd's New Staff. They would like to unite workers in all of the local churches to care for the needs of the neediest of our neighbors. Currently they are working with the Bridge to raise awareness and funds for the new homeless shelter in the planning stages. They welcome prayers for proper direction from the Lord. They are still members at Trinity, but felt God's calling for this new ministry.
