## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Greetings, Members of Trinity, in the words of the Psalmist, 57:1:

"Be merciful unto me, O Lord God, be merciful unto me, for my soul trusts in You."

We are in the Church Season called Lent. What is Lent? In the past it was thought of as a time to "give up something, make a sacrifice of sorts. Was It for the Lord we did this? Or was it meant for the person to give up something "very dear" so as to see what it cost the Lord to win our salvation. Lent is a reminder of what it cost Jesus to make us His, as well as receiving forgiveness of our sins in His life, death, and Resurrection.

The name Lent is probably derived from the Anglo-Saxon word meaning spring. That in itself doesn't speak of "giving up anything" unless you see that the seed you

plant must die. Lent grew into a time for the Christian to prepare for what was coming. In the Spring we till the

land, plant the seed, and wait for the harvest. If all goes well there will be a great harvest. Lent is very similar as we prepare our hearts and lives with God's Word allowing Him to plant the Seed of the Gospel, water it, and help the Seed of faith grow whereby there will be a 'great harvest' of souls. Jesus died so that could take place.

Easter is the culmination of Lent, Maundy Thursday, and Good Friday. The harvest of Easter is the Resurrection of our Lord and anyone who believes in His death and Resurrection. We are a part of that great harvest. WOW!

What does this mean for the living of our lives? Is one in the Church for oneself? Or are we a part of something much bigger? I'll answer - we are a part of the bigger. What is our responsibility? God gives us 40 days, not counting the Sundays, for us to prepare. During Lent allow the Lord Jesus to use us. He places us in His Church to help one another grow in the faith making sure there will even be a bigger harvest of souls. God's blessings on our efforts to make a difference.

On the threshold of Lent then, cry to the Lord for mercy, forgiveness, grace, and peace, *"Be merciful unto me, O Lord God, be merciful unto me, for my soul trusts in You."* Have a blessed Lenten Season knowing it culminates in the Resurrection of our Lord! Grow and produce a harvest for the Lord.

## Treasurer Notes

Recently I was asked what the best way is to make financial donations to Trinity. To start, answer this basic question: who pays our Pastors, pays the electric bill, keeps the heat on, and pays to have the parking lot plowed in winter? **YOU** do, with your faithful donations. We do not have other regular sources of income. Instead, we are Christians who reflect the Lord's blessings to us by our regular gifts back to the Lord, given at Trinity. **THANK YOU!**

You can make donations to Trinity in cash, by personal check, or by automatic drafts generated by your bank, based on your instructions. If you wish to remain anonymous in your giving, cash is best. However, in January the church Treasurer generates a record of donations from the previous year for all donors who identify themselves. There are three options that will help me record that information correctly: Option 1: donate via a personal or bank-generated check in your name, made out to Trinity Lutheran Church. (Bank-generated checks are usually mailed by the bank to Trinity's address: 208 N. Dolores Road, Cortez, CO 81321) Option 2: ask me for a box of donation envelopes that include a number that I will assign to you for the year--this works well for cash. Option 3: put your donation into your own envelope and include your name.

How often you bring your donation is completely up to you and the Lord: about half of us give a smaller amount every week, and the other half of us make larger monthly or bi-monthly donations. Those with irregular income donate when they are able. Most of Trinity's bills are due every month, however, so giving regularly--at an interval that works for you--helps us meet our commitments.

As other questions about Trinity's finances arise that might be of interest to others, I'll use the newsletter to try to answer them. Please let me know what you might be wondering about!

The committee has received approval to support several projects for the year. Ysleta Lutheran Mission of El Paso, Texas is one our congregation has supported for many years.
