


Eyes on Jesus: Worldly Eyes

As We Gather

This Lent, we will use the metaphor of eyesight to examine how the various people in Mark's Gospel viewed Jesus during His Passion. In most cases, they misunderstood who He was and what He was doing; then again, sometimes by faith people did recognize Him correctly.

We have these forty days of Lent in which we may look within ourselves as people of faith in our day. How are we like or unlike the people who saw Jesus in the flesh? Most important, as we gather for worship, we will see what Jesus has done to save us from our sins by His holy, precious blood and innocent sufferings and death.

Today, we learn of Pilate's worldly view and how, to keep his position and placate the Jewish leaders and crowd, he handed Jesus over for crucifixion. The soldiers saw the opposite of a worldly king, but their ironic hailing of Him as "King of the Jews" proclaims who He really is. The world looks for power and glory; God's way is suffering and the cross. Which way do we look in the daily decisions we make?

Silence for reflection on God's Word and for self-examination.


- P The disciples misjudged the good deed of the woman who anointed Jesus,

- P Judas betrayed Jesus out of fear and for financial gain,
- and we have betrayed our weak faith in Him when making difficult decisions.
- P Jesus' closest disciples gave in to sleep rather than watching and praying,
- and we have preferred physical comfort over spiritual turmoil.
- Peter failed to keep his bold promise of faithfulness to save his skin,
- and we have let Sunday's strength fade when Monday morning dawned.


- P Jesus fulfilled the promise of salvation, even as His opponents tried to be rid of Him,
- and He went to the cross because of our sins as well.
- Pilate wanted to keep his position, and the soldiers only saw a weak man on a cross,
- and we have let ourselves be deceived by the world's definition of success.
- P Jesus' body and blood are not visible in the bread and wine of the Lord's Supper,
- and we have not always looked beyond what our eyes can see in the Sacrament.
- P His Father forsook Jesus on the cross as He took all the punishment we deserve,
- and we have, at times, focused on our works instead of fixing our eyes on Jesus.
- P The angel proclaimed Jesus' resurrection to the women,
- and we pray that You, heavenly Father, will forgive us all our sins for Jesus' sake. Help us fix our eyes on Jesus each day until we follow Him to our eternal home, where we shall see You face to face.
- From of old no one has heard or perceived by the ear, nor has any eye ever seen a God besides the Lord, who acts for those who wait for Him. Therefore, as a called and ordained servant of Christ, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Passion John 18:33–38 & 19:1–11

This Lent, we are looking at the events of our Lord's Passion through the eyes of some of the people who witnessed it. Today, you will read the words of Pilate, the chief priests, and the soldiers, the groups who executed Jesus and ironically called Him "King."

The Passion of Our Lord according to St. John, chapter 18 verses 33-38 & chapter 19 verses 1-11.

- ³³So Pilate entered his headquarters again and called Jesus and said to him,
- **C** "Are you the King of the Jews?"
- **P** ³⁴Jesus answered, "Do you say this of your own accord, or did others say it to you about me?" ³⁵Pilate answered,
- **C** "Am I a Jew? Your own nation and the chief priests have delivered you over to me. What have you done?"
- ³⁶Jesus answered, "My kingdom is not of this world. If my kingdom were of this world, my servants would have been fighting, that I might not be delivered over to the Jews. But my kingdom is not from the world." ³⁷Then Pilate said to him,

- **C** "So you are a king?"
- Jesus answered, "You say that I am a king. For this purpose I was born and for this purpose I have come into the world—to bear witness to the truth. Everyone who is of the truth listens to my voice."

 38 Pilate said to him,
- **C** "What is truth?"
- P After he had said this, he went back outside to the Jews and told them,
- C "I find no guilt in him. ...
- ^{19:1}Then Pilate took Jesus and flogged him. ²And the soldiers twisted together a crown of thorns and put it on his head and arrayed him in a purple robe. ³They came up to him, saying,
- **C** "Hail, King of the Jews!"
- and struck him with their hands. ⁴Pilate went out again and said to them, "See, I am bringing him out to you that you may know that I find no guilt in him." ⁵So Jesus came out, wearing the crown of thorns and the purple robe. Pilate said to them, "Behold the man!" ⁶When the chief priests and the officers saw him, they cried out,
- "Crucify him, crucify him!"
- Pilate said to them, "Take him yourselves and crucify him, for I find no guilt in him." ⁷The Jews answered him,
- "We have a law, and according to that law he ought to die because he has made himself the Son of God."
- ⁸When Pilate heard this statement, he was even more afraid. ⁹He entered his headquarters again and said to Jesus, "Where are you from?" But Jesus gave him no answer. ¹⁰So Pilate said to him, "You will not speak to me? Do you not know that I have authority to release you and authority to crucify you?" ¹¹Jesus answered him, "You would have no authority over me at all unless it had been given you from above. Therefore he who delivered me over to you has the greater sin."




Apostles' Creed




