
Distribution

The pastor and those who assist him receive the body and blood of Christ first and then distribute them to those who come to receive. Only individual cups will be offered at this time. Purple cups are non-alcoholic.

*Family groups will be ushered to the communion rail and remain standing while communing (don't touch the rail or cushion). **Masks are recommended (but not required)** as you approach and exit the rail and as the Elder and Pastor are distributing the elements. After you are given the elements, you will hold onto the bread and the wine until everyone has been served. Then Pastor will announce, "take and eat/drink." You may partake of the Lord's Supper at this time. After you have finished you will exit back to your seats, placing your cup into the basket on either side of the Sanctuary.*
