Jesus' transforming presence

"But Zacchaeus stood up and said to the Lord, 'Look, Lord! Here and now I give half of my possessions to the poor, and if I have cheated anybody out of anything, I will pay back four times the amount.' Jesus said to him, 'Today salvation has come to this house, because this man, too, is a son of Abraham. For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost'" (Luke 19:8-10 NIV).

Who knew, all those kids sitting in Sunday school were getting a lesson in stewardship! Generations of children have very often heard lessons based on the familiar account of Zacchaeus. The diminutive tax collector's curiosity surrounding the person and ministry of Jesus is what the Holy Spirit used to set him on a collision course for a total stewardship transformation. This transformation, according to the text of Luke 19, is not just about this life. This stewardship transformation is about eternity as well!

Remember the story: Zacchaeus was a tax collector. Do not think of friendly neighborhood IRS agents. This was more like a toll booth operator, but the governing authorities did not set the toll. They would contract men to staff roadside booths and tax the commerce that was passing along the road. This was an enterprise full of greed and graft. The tax collectors would take as much as they could and only pass on a portion to the government. The rest did not go into the community chest either! It went into the pocket of the tax collector.

This is why the people had such disdain for Jewish tax collectors. They were seen as both crooks and traitors. They were crooks in that they extorted their compatriots and others in the toll process. But worse, they were seen as traitors because their efforts supported the occupying Roman authorities. That is the real reason that the people would not make way so that short Zacchaeus could see Jesus.

For this reason, he runs ahead and climbs a tree. He had heard all the stories. He wanted to see this Jesus with his own eyes. Mercy is on display. This hated crook and traitor gets a direct audience with Jesus — at Jesus' own request! Jesus invites Himself to Zacchaeus' house. This is where the transformation is about to take place!

Notice how Jesus does it. He does not preach a three-week sermon series, nor does He ask Zacchaeus to make a pledge. There is nothing programmatic about Jesus' approach. But Zacchaeus is completely transformed! The transforming force is the very presence of Jesus!

A Study in Micah

From the Tastor First of all my dear friends and family at Trinity Lutheran Church, greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. I write to you this month having recently completing a Bible Study in the book of the Prophet Micah. A profound message written many years ago (750-686 BC) but still relevant for today. It speaks of a corrupt and sinful world facing a devastating destruction but also of a merciful and loving God who brings salvation. I found great conviction but also great comfort and peace in Micah's closing words in Chapter 7 of the book, and hope and pray that you will too.

As Micah begins this last chapter, he speaks of a feeling like the emptiness of the fields as the summer crops are gathered in and nothing remains except the dirt of the field. He writes, "Woe is me! For I have become as when the summer fruit has been gathered, as when the grapes have been gleaned: there is no cluster to eat, no first-ripe fig that my soul desires" (Micah 7:1). He goes on to write how the world has become completely ungodly and that there are no longer any righteous among humankind. He mentions the corruptness that is borne in the hands of men and that evil is their quest. Micah refers to the empty field as he claims that even the best among them are but weeds and thorns. There is fighting amongst neighbors and even family members. Things are so bad that Micah declares one's worst enemies are found within one's friends and family. And in all this Micah includes himself as a sinner against God.

Doesn't this sound familiar as we look at the world around us. The world has turned in on itself fighting against each other trying to have the most power, possessions, fame. Fighting with each other, doing whatever it takes to glorify yourself, even if it means betraying our neighbor, our friends, our family. So, we turn on each other with cruel hatred and find nothing but our lack of love and compassion. The conclusion is that we are sinners and deserve to be wiped out and totally annihilated. Micah writes this, "The day of your watchmen, of your punishment, has come; now their confusion is at hand" (Micah 7:4b). We have been judged we have been convicted.

Micah, in his sinful state realizes that even in his totally sinful state of being and worthy of destruction, he will wait for God to plead his case. God is the one who will bring him out of the darkness of his sin and bring him into the light. Micah knows that all is not lost but there will be a day of restoration and perfect peace. A shepherd will come to deliver His lost fold and bring them out of danger and peril. This Shepherd will lead His flock to pure water and soul satisfying food. There will be peace and comfort. The enemy will be destroyed and our sin "will be cast into the depths of the sea" forever.

For us, we know what Micah is talking about. We know that the light has come to shine brightly for all of creation in this dark world. Born in the small town of Bethlehem the Shepherd was born. He grew and watched over the flock by healing their diseases and giving them food and water to drink. And then He boldly stood up to the enemy, waging war against his deception and evil. In the well-fought battle, our Savior courageously was nailed to a cross where He died for our sin and disobedience. But the light was only slightly deemed, for three days later our Lord, Jesus Christ, burst forth from the grave and declared victory over our sin, death, and the great enemy, Satan.

We now live in the joy of Christ's resurrection and steadfast love toward us. Let us come before Him in worship, praise and thanksgiving knowing that in our Lord's steadfast love we have the forgiveness of sins and eternal life. May the light of our Savior, Jesus Christ shine brightly in your life and fill your hungry with the joyous of days.
