> A voice cries out: "In the wilderness prepare the way of the ORD, make straight in the desert a highway for our God. ${ }^{4}$ Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be nade low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. ${ }^{5}$ Then the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together, for the mouth of the LORD has spoken." - Isaiah 40:3-5

Advent is a season of preparations. In our homes we prepare with decorations, wrapping paper, baking, and eggnog. In our worship, we prepare to hear the story of Jesus' birth. One of the aspects of Advent that is often set aside or lost to all our other preparations is the season of Advent also prepares us for the Second Coming.

Yes! Jesus is coming again. Not as a baby in a manger, but as the King of Kings, the Prince of Peace, the heir of righteousness, the one who has brought salvation through his death and by his resurrection has brought everasting life. Yes, that very Jesus is coming again. And yet, we are often too busy with our carols, our wreaths, our bows and safe-winter driving to remember this very important aspect of our faith.

So when Isaiah cried out "Prepare the way of the LORD" he was looking forward to the day the messiah would come and restore Israel. When we cry out, "Prepare the way of the LORD" we are looking forward to the return of the Messiah. What are we doing then to prepare the way?

We prepare the way when we provide a place for forgiveness to be experienced. We prepare the way when we fight for social justice and equality. We prepare the way when we reach out in love to someone who has never experienced love. We prepare the way when we do these things and so much more, all because Jesus calls his disciples to do this.

Feed the hungry (the Milledgeville Food Pantry), when we clothe people (the Pitter Patter Pantry, Mia's elementary school classroom, coat and mitten drives), when we bring Jesus to homebound and shut-in members, when we laugh, sing and pray with Southtown residents.

Jesus is returning. And when he does, he will not count how many presents are under our tree, or how many lights brighten our house for the holidays. He will look at how many people we have fed and how many oppressed we have proclaimed freedom to. Jesus will ask if we joined the worker crews-not to smooth out the pavement on our ancient downtown blocks, but have we cleared the obstacles that prevent people from hearing the Good News that God loves them.

Looking forward to the Second Coming really means a lot of work. It sounds exhausting, so it is easy to distract ourselves with all those other preparations. And yet, we are given this season of Advent to prepare our hearts for the work that lays ahead of us. Join us in worship this season, take a break from the other distractions of the season and hear God's calling to be a part of the work crew preparing the world for Jesus' return!

Prepare the royal highway; The King of kings is near! Let ev'ry hill and valley a level road appear! The greet the King of glory, Foretold in sacred story: Hosanna to the Lord, For he fulfills God's Word!

Our Advent theme is Prepare the Royal Highway. We will hear this theme as we sing our Advent Candle song, LBW Hymn \#26. It was even the basis for the Christmas Pageant we will see on Sunday, December 17th, as we hear how a crew of road workers built the roads that brought Mary and Joseph and the Magi to Bethlehem as well as the road that saved Mary, Joseph and the baby Jesus on their way to Egypt.

This theme is also our stewardship theme this year. Jesus calls us to build not a royal highway but a ministry that carries his name into the hearts of the world around us. We do this by having a wonderful church structure to gather in and worship and host community meals and so much more. We do this by sending our members to volunteer with delivering golden meals or helping at the food pantry or going on mission trips as the youth did a few years ago.
What enables us to build this ministry? Our dedicated members make this happen. And yet the word "member" makes church sound like a social club, where membership has its benefits, or a shopping club, where membership means you get discounts. So let's not use the word members anymore
What enables us to build this ministry? Jesus' disciples do. And Jesus empowers his disciples to be stewards We who gather here are disciples. We are not members. We are disciples. We are empowered by the Spirit to build our ministry. This includes supporting our annual budget.
This season you received a letter sharing some Biblical principles of stewardship as well as some information about our current budget. This letter is an invitation to prayerfully consider how being Jesus' disciple is a calling in your life to increase how you support our annual budget. The Spirit empowers Jesus' disciples to build ministry and building ministry comes with a budget.

Prayerfully consider how the Spirit is empowering you to increase your support of our ministry budget; your gifts are a mark of discipleship and a sign of your thankfulness to God for his Son Jesus!
