School Supplies: pens, pencils and sharpeners, crayons, markers, notebooks, paper, solar calculators, coloring and picture books, etc.


Non-Liquid Hygiene Items: toothbrushes, bar soap, combs, washcloths, etc.



1 Corinthians 16:1

"Now I call you, just as I did the churches gathering in Galatia, to collect funds to support God's people in Jerusalem."

This November, we are exploring the stewardship theme "What we can accomplish together with the gifts God has first given us." This is a theme that draws on the experiences of the early church as it encourages us to see that stewardship is not about us individually, but to see that stewardship is about our being a community that works together to accomplish God's mission.

Paul writes to the Corinthians to ask them to support the Christian church in Jerusalem. It is the same work the churches in the region of Galatia (a territory in modern day Turkey) has been going together. These churches understood something fundamental about their stewardship. No one stands alone. We are the Body of Christ gathered locally, even if we are spread out around the globe.

Take a moment to think about what we accomplish together with Christians across Northern Illinois. Together, we support a church camp in Oregon, we support a campus ministry in DeKalb, we support new start congregations across Illinois, we provide for disaster relief for places like Washington, IL, we support a lay training school, two of the eight ELCA seminaries are directly supported from our Synod, we have partnerships in Tanzania and India, and so much more.

Could our individual church build and maintain its own church camp? Could we organize a center for college students by ourselves? These and any other question can only be answered NO - we accomplish them together with all the other congregations across Northern Illinois. Likewise, individually are you alone able to provide for the paper products that are needed for monthly Grace meals and other special events? Are you alone able to support the music ministry, the utilities, the staff salaries and benefits? Of course not.

Everything we do as a congregation is accomplished because we bring together the gifts God has first given to us. We all have been gifted, and when we lift those gifts up in worship to God, our individual gifts are multiplied and blessed for accomplishing many great things. Let us celebrate God gifting us for the work of ministry and let us dream what we can accomplish because of these gifts brought together.
