Pastor's Report

- Milledgeville Grace Meal, Golden Meals delivery, annual PADS Fund raiser, mission support of the Northern Illinois Synod and the ELCA, donations to Disaster Relief, World Hunger, Crop Walk, Helping Hands Food Pantry, Pitter Patter Pantry, LOMC, Good Samaritan, NIU Campus Ministry.

Our little parish does all this because we have received so much. God continues to give and bless the world which continues to be broken because of human sin and so we too must continue to give from what we receive. We need to keep on - keeping on. We rest, pray and worship, live the lives that God has given to us so that we can keep on with our purpose to make the mercy of God in Christ known through out the world. Our ministry together began in February 1999, Maggie and Nathan were 3rd and 5th grade; it doesn't seem possible. I can only give highlights (because I can't keep track of all the things we've done together or have been through.)

- In 2003 we celebrated the 100th Anniversary of the Congregation.
- At some point we received an anonymous gift of air conditioning for the sanctuary and the fellowship hall. (I had nothing what-so-ever to do with it except say, "sure".)
- We beautifully and faithfully celebrated high holy days, shared worship with our neighbors (Cinda Heeren is a gift from God to this congregation. As is Lori Oncken. (Choir Director and Altar Guild 'chair' respectively.)
- Rally Day, Sunday School and VBS have always been fun; thanks here to Becky Anderson and many teachers and volunteers.
- Social Ministry which continues to do both Outreach and Care of the Congregation is amazing, faithfully led by Lynn Kaufman and she is amazing.
- The annual Fall Bazaar both raises money and creates a team effort and 'no one is in charge' but we can thank Carol Frederick & Carol Bushman for 'convening.'
- The Monday morning sewing group has been a wonderful development that last few years participating the LWR quilt challenge and supplying comforters where they are needed.
- W-ELCA certainly deserves a mention too for the ministry they do and support. Peace to you all.

Probably the most memorable year was 2010 beginning with the Monday after Easter when the west wall of the sanctuary collapsed. (I, for one, think that it was a tornado.) I still thank God that no one was in the building and so no one was hurt. it was a huge mess and I don't know what we would have done without Marlys Carpenter, Jim Brubaker and Lynn Kaufman. The whole time of reconstruction was an adventure; we even had some good times especially when we worshipped in the fellowship hall. Through that destruction we ended up by being blessed.

Of course, that wasn't the only thing that happened that spring and summer. John Murray had a heart event that landed him at Loyola for weeks. We had three women diagnosed with breast cancer and yours truly had unplanned surgery and was in the hospital for a week. There were so many opportunities for bickering and fussing and instead we lived in the kingdom of heaven. Thank you.

Last year started out with promise; January 2013 we did something new for Faith in Action Sunday by saying and showing our thanks to our volunteer firefighters and EMTs, all ages were included in pulling together this gala. I asked for and received a sabbatical from May to August. My hope and plan was to return and continue until I was 65 or 66. It didn't turn out that way. This is not the place to 'unpack' what happened but I would like to give you some reminders to avoid anything like this in the future.

- 1.) Trust God with all of your life, everything including your money. When we trust God it is not a burden to obey or to be generous and not just with your money. Be generous with each other, with anyone who works for the congregation. Be generous with this building; it was given to you to serve God, as well as the place where worship happens.
- 2.) Stay focused on the purpose and mission of the congregation and the church on earth. Never forget who you belong to.
- 3.) This is the last but not the least and it's as difficult as the first two for everyone.
 - a) When someone talks to you about So&So (or about the pastor) you need to ask, 'have you spoken to So&So? Then, don't repeat it.
 - b) When you hear that So&So said such&suchgo ask So&So if it's true or what did they mean? Then, don't repeat it.
 - c) Remember, each of us has our own perspective; people see, hear and experience things differently (the person looking at the front of Time magazine sees something entirely different from someone looking at the back of the same magazine and they're both right) and no one person owns the truth.

Re: 2014 Budget

Here is my proposed 2014 budget for Trinity Lutheran Church. Although the number of pledges was down from 2013, the amount per pledge stayed about the same. I believe the decrease in the number of pledges is from poor participation of the Stewardship campaign and not an indication of reduced offering.

Here are the assumptions that I used:

- No change in Regular Offering
- Remove the amount for Lent Services as this is usually included in Regular or Loose Offering
- Loose offering was abnormally high in 2013 due to large offerings by non-members
- Other Income was high due to non-repayment to Memorial Fund of Boiler money
- Bazaar & Ham Supper was doubled on the budget in 2013 because money was not transferred for 2012 until January 2013. Returned to \$1,000 annually
- 3% Increase to Cleaning, Organist, and Secretary. This is higher than we have been doing in the past but I
 believe we can afford it this year because of the reduction in pastoral expenses
- Property Insurance will be increasing
- Supply organist was doubled, we should be paying 2 organists from the organist line item for the Sunday's that they play
- Increase of \$1,000 in Benevolence because we have not changed this in several years and the Synod will be vital in our call process
- Increase Business & Professional by 50% because I am not sure where the interim will be driving from
- \$0.31/hour increase for Secretary and 1 more hour per week because of unknown impact of having an interim
- Doubled petty case because of additional mailings during call process
- Anticipated 8 months for the interim. I figured they would get the same salary as we were paying in 2013, but we would not be paying FICA, Pension and Health, and Housing during the 8 months that we have an interim.

This leaves us with a very good positive cash flow for the year which may be needed due to the uncertainty of how the call process will turn out.

In addition to the above items, the Council recommended that we pay the Choir Director an annual amount of \$4,000.
