

"The earth is the Lord's and all that is in it, the world, and those who live in it;"

-Psalm 24: 1

God breathes growth and the greening of our faith through these weeks of summer, called "Ordinary Time" on the church calendar.

In the context of the liturgical year the term "ordinary" does not mean "usual or average," however. Ordinary here means "not seasonal." Ordinary Time is that part of the Church Year that lies outside the seasons of Lent-Easter and Advent-Christmas. It occurs mostly in the months of summer—less scheduled, more relaxed, unstructured.

In Ordinary Time, the Church celebrates the mystery of Christ not in one specific aspect but in all its aspects. The readings during the weeks of Ordinary Time help to instruct us on how to live out our Christian faith in our daily lives.

The scripture readings for the seasons of Lent, Easter, Advent, and Christmas have prominent themes. During Ordinary Time the readings are not chosen according to a theme. Rather, they present in a continuous fashion the life and work of Jesus Christ as proclaimed in the Gospels of either Matthew, Mark, or Luke (this year is Mark). John's Gospel is read principally during the festival seasons.

The liturgical color for Ordinary Time is green, a sign of growing and hope. It is a time of "shalom"— God's wish, God's desire, for deep peace, wholeness and balance for creation and and humanity. I try to live my pastoral ministry with this peace of God in mind.

June 2021 marks the official beginning of my ministry with the Faith on 40 Parish, but it also marks our part of the larger church as representatives from around the church join us on that very special day. To paraphrase J.S. Bach, may our lives, ministry and vocations to God alone bring glory!
