A couple years ago, my wife and I went on a retreat in Arizona. During that retreat, we had the opportunity to go hiking in the desert and mountains. Another pastor and his wife, who were on the same retreat, as Katie and I, took a hike up Vulture Peak, which reaches just over 3600 feet. The majority of the hike was relatively simple - a winding path through the desert and up the side of the mountain. Then the last 300 or so feet to the peak was a near vertical climb.

Katie and I decided we wanted to be at the very peak, while our friends chose to wait. So I went first and called out to Katie where the places to put her hands and feet were - and ouch - where the cacti were hiding. And again, on the way down, I went first, again, to guide Katie as she stretched for the ledges coming backwards down the side of this mountain. It was a truly amazing sight standing up on top of this mounting, seeing Phoenix, over 60 miles away to our southeast and all the desert surrounding us.

Up on that mountain top, Katie and I had a moment with God. It was absolutely peaceful. And powerfully prayerful. Why are mountaintops associated with moments with God? Moses, Elijah and Jesus each had their own mountaintop experiences. In one story in the Gospel, the three of them even come together for one scene, when God confirms Jesus as his only Son, as the one we are to listen to.

For Katie and I, that moment had its practical sides - reminding us what it is like to work together, reminding us of our need to trust and communicate clearly. Our friends, who waited patiently in the shadow of that 300 foot climb, said afterwards they were impressed with how much we were able to guide each other both up and down and give each other the confidence we needed to make the ascent and descent.

But Katie and I don't remember the climb for its practical implication. We remember it for the moment with God, for that chance to see the world anew again, to hear God's still voice in the soft wind blowing around us as we stood up there. And for the pure serene calm that we both experienced, knowing that ahead of us was an unknown journey, with winds that were going to blow a lot stronger, and uncertainty. Yet there, on the top of Vulture Peak, non of that uncertainty mattered. It only mattered that God was with us.

I don't know if I am fully sure of why mountain tops are associated with these kind of holy moments. I just know they are. This Lenten season, I hope you join us in worship, to hear how people of faith used stones and rocks, the very stuff a mountain is made of, and recognized God's presence in their midst. Maybe you will have a mountaintop experience - right here in the church basement.


