

Rock Island, IL (June 18, 2022) - The Rev. Stacie Fidlar of Rock Island, IL, was elected June 18 to serve a six -year term as bishop of the Northern Illinois Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). The election took place during the synod assembly which met online on June 5 and 12 and then in person at Augustana College in Rock Island on June 17-18.

Fidlar was elected on the 5th ballot with 219 votes to 111 votes for the Rev. Dr. Janet Hunt, pastor of First Lutheran Church in DeKalb, IL. A total of 166 votes was needed for election.

The bishop-elect has served as pastor of St. John's Lutheran Church in Rock Island, IL since 1999. She served as pastor of Our Savior's Lutheran Church in Seneca, IL from 1995-1999 and as interim pastor of St. James Lutheran Church in Forreston, IL in 1995.

Fidlar earned her Bachelor of Arts degree in Religion with Asian Studies concentration from Augustana College in Rock Island, IL in 1991 and her Master of Divinity degree from Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago in 1995. She completed the Shalem Institute Group Leaders Program in 2002 and participates in ongoing continuing education with foci on leadership, spirituality, and foundation management.

Fidlar will take office on September 1, and her installation is scheduled for October 8 at 11:00 a.m. at Trinity Lutheran Church in Rockford, IL. Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton will officiate the installation.

Members and friends of Faith on Forty

"The earth is the Lord's and all that is in it, the world, and those who live in it;"

-Psalm 24: 1

God breathes growth and the greening of our faith through these weeks of summer, called "Ordinary Time" on the church calendar.

In the context of the liturgical year the term "ordinary" does not mean "usual or average," however. Ordinary here means "not seasonal." Ordinary Time is that part of the Church Year that lies outside the seasons of Lent-Easter and Advent-Christmas. It occurs mostly in the months of summer—less scheduled, more relaxed, unstructured.

In Ordinary Time, the Church celebrates the mystery of Christ not in one specific aspect but in all its aspects. The readings during the weeks of Ordinary Time help to instruct us on how to live out our Christian faith in our daily lives.

The scripture readings for the seasons of Lent, Easter, Advent, and Christmas have prominent themes. During Ordinary Time the readings are not chosen according to a theme. Rather, they present in a continuous fashion the life and work of Jesus Christ as proclaimed in the Gospels of either Matthew, Mark, or Luke (this year is Luke). John's Gospel is read principally during the festival seasons.

The liturgical color for Ordinary Time is green, a sign of growing and hope. It is a time of "shalom"—God's wish, God's desire, for deep peace, wholeness and balance for creation and humanity.

I pray for each of you that Ordinary time also gives you time to re-create with some recreation! Our souls are lightened when we take time away from daily routines and remember again who we are and WHO created us!
