

"Where is the poor Christian to find the true Church? -Martin Luther

(Note: this is the first in a series of seven on Martin Luther's "7 Marks of the Church")

Martin Luther wrote, "First, the holy Christian people are recognized by their possession of the HOLY WORD OF GOD. To be sure, not all have it in equal measure, as St. Paul says [1 Cor. 3:12–14]. Some possess the word in its complete purity, others do not. Those who have the pure word are called those who 'build on the foundation with gold, silver, and precious stones'; those who do not have it in its purity are the ones who 'build on the foundation with wood, hay, and straw,' and yet will be saved through fire.

More than enough was said about this above. This is the principal item, and the holiest of holy possessions, by reason of which the Christian people are called holy; for God's word is holy and sanctifies everything it touches; it is indeed the very holiness of God, Romans 1 [:16], 'It is the power of God for salvation to everyone who has faith,' and 1 Timothy 4 [:5], 'Everything is consecrated by the word of God and prayer.'" (AE 41, 148)

For Lutheran Christians, the Word understood in these ways:

The person of Jesus Christ—the Word made flesh.

The Holy Scriptures (Bible)—the written Word of God.

The Living Word (the public exercise of faith)—more said on this in a future article

Christians operate with what we call a "canon"—the Hebrew scriptures, 4 Gospels and selected writings from the early church. These are the "source and norm" for our life together, per our ELCA Constitution.

All scripture is useful "for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness (2 Tim)." But Martin Luther also spoke about a "canon within a canon"—i.e. for Christians, scripture that "conveys Christ" is always primary and trumps contradicting scripture.

As I have always taught Confirmation students and others, the Bible is not a textbook, not a history book, not a fantasy book. Above all, the Bible is a FAITH BOOK. It is taken on faith even as it strengthens our faith, through the power of the Holy Spirit.
