PASTOR'S DESK

Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life.

*−Romans 6:4 −* 

A new year has begun, and with it comes all our new promises of things we will do this year, things we will change about ourselves, or habits we will start or end. These New Year resolutions are really fun to make. We have a whole new year ahead of us, not just a new day, but a whole new year. Anything is possible. So why not reach for the stars? Make that promise to lose weight, be nicer, give more, watch less TV, spend more time with the family, etc.

Each new year, each new day, each new breath we take is a gift from God. This is the foundation to our resolutions to change our ways. We have been given a gift. In our Christian faith, the sign of this gift is baptism. And on Sunday, January 10th, our worship lessons focus on Jesusøbaptism. The Bible story about Jesusøbaptism is actually fairly short. It leaves a lot of questions unanswered. Who were the sponsors? Did John drop the candle in the river? Okay, so those are a little silly. But there are unanswered questions. We donøt even know the words John actually said to Jesus. Just that John did the baptism.

What we know is Jesusøbaptism serves as the sign of Godøs amazing gift of newness of life. This does not come in the form of resolutions that we make while watching Ryan Seacrest Rock in the New Year from New York City. This does not come in the form of resolutions that we have easily given up by January 10th. This sign comes with water and Godøs word. And when Godøs Word is involved, an unbreakable promise is made. When you were baptized, Godøs word became an unbreakable promise in your life. God resolved to give you newness of life with every breath you takeô not just on January 1st, not just with the alarm clock of a new day. Godøs resolution of newness of life is experienced with each breath.

Now usually that thought is too overwhelming. So we need moments like the alarm clock each day, or the annual ball dropping over Times Square, to remind us that newness of life is a gift and a reality we get to experience. Let resolve also to include each time we shower, or wash our hands, or wash our dishes, or go through a car washô anytime it rains evenô whenever water touches you, make the resolution to remember God eternal promise in your life. You have newness of life. This is not something we are waiting for. This is something God has given as an amazing free gift of his love.







**Devotions**That wrote the Letter to the Romans before he went to Rome. It was a way of letting the Jews and Gentiles living there know about the Gospel of Jesus, so they would know what to expect from his teaching.

Pauløs teaching in Romans can be broadly summed up as the Righteousness from God, which includes themes of justification by faith, and guilt, and sanctification, and security.

Whether you just completed catechism, or whether you were confirmed 50 years ago, this Letter to the Romans serves as a basic introduction to Jesus. The season of Epiphany is a season of discovering Jesus. So this January is an excellent time to spend a little time each morning with Paul, his Letter to the Romans, and our Lord Jesus. As we remember our Baptism on January 10th, this letter will remind you that you are justified (that is made right with God) by faith, not your works. This letter will free you from guilt and encourage you in your sanctification (your being made holy by Godøs Spirit), and assure you that nothing can take away Godøs amazing love in your life.
