

Glad Tidings "Sound the Good News"







On the day of Pentecost all the believers were meeting together in one place. ² Suddenly, there was a sound from heaven like the roaring of a mighty windstorm, and it filled the house where they were sitting. 3 Then, what looked like flames or tongues of fire appeared and settled on each of them.

Acts 2:1-3, New Living Translation

It is springtime. In our homes, our windows are open. As we bounce from room to room with our spring cleaning, the fresh spring air fills our homes with the sweet aroma of blooming flowers and lilac bushes and budding trees. The sounds of returning birds and children once again playing outside make us smile

and give thanks for another winter gone by.

At Trinity, we too have opened our windows during worship. The fresh air fills the sanctuary with cool breezes. We are even interrupted more now by the occasional passing train or motorcycle. These sounds thunder in as if on cue to interrupt something important being said. And we grumble at the interrupting sounds, and we sneeze as the sweet air brings with it the small particles that annoy any with allergies. But it is spring. And the fresh air is just feels too good to close our windows.

Imagine these scents and sounds as you read the Pentecost story in Acts. Early Christian disciples have gathered for worship. Their windows are open too. The gentle breezes carry the blossoms of early spring Jerusalem into their sanctuary. But then suddenly the wind picks up. It is not so gentle. It is loud, quite like a train or a motorcycle gang riding by.

Initially, there is confusion. Then came fear as what appears to be tongues of flame land on each person. But out of the chaos comes peace, calm, then excitement and a new energy. A new rush of wind blows but not from outside, this time from inside as the disciples began speaking the Good News in many languages. The church roared to new life so much so that those outside the church were interrupted. Their lives paused by the sound coming out of the church.

Our windows are open. The Holy Spirit is blowing into our sanctuaries, interrupting our lives, our lives of chaotic schedules, our lives of stress and joys and losses and gains. In the midst of this chaos the Spirit fills us with peace and calmness; and then the Spirit fills us with excitement and newness and an energy that should have us proclaiming the Good News louder than the passing train, interrupting the motorcyclist on his Sunday drive. The Spirit can do this. The Spirit yearns to do this. The Spirit is excited to see our windows are open again, so our lives may be interrupted that we may become interruptions for our community.

It is spring. Let the Spirit blow through our open windows!


