So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!

2 Corinthians 5:17

Easter approaches quickly this year. It is March 27th. But we cannot arrive at Easter without first encountering Good Friday. The resurrection of Christ necessarily means Christ has died. And Christ did not die in any ordinary fashion. He was betrayed, accused of treason against the empire and blasphemy against God, and put to death as a traitor against the Empire by crucifixion. Jesus died. He was buried. And then, only after Jesus died and was buried, Jesus experienced resurrection.

Resurrection is something that can only be experienced after the experience of death. Newness comes when something dies. A seed dies when we plant it in the ground, so that it may become the new fruit of this year's harvest. Jesus died on a cross and awoke by resurrection to new life. In baptism, we were buried with Jesus—we have already, in faith, experienced the death that is to come. And, in baptism, we were raised to new life with Jesus, a new life we will know in fullness in a day yet to come, yet by faith we experience today.

In order to experience newness of life, we must first experience death. In both of our congregations, there is a death experience happening right now. At Trinity, our old way of doing faith education, what was called Sunday school, has died. And there is a lot of grief about that death. And that is natural and normal. Grief is a part of death. At First, the old ways of a filled church and packed basement on Sundays, has died. And again, there is much grief. We can allow ourselves time to grieve what has died.

But in faith, death is not the end. Death Is Not The End. We must emphasize that over and over again. Death Is Not The End. Death only leads to resurrection. And since Jesus has been raised to newness of life, so too are we raised to new life, so to is the ministry of our congregations raised to new life. What does this new life look like? We are still discovering it. It is like we are standing right now in the doorway of the empty tomb of Easter morning. The stone has been rolled away. The women and disciples are running to the tomb to discover it is empty and they are crying. And we are standing with Jesus, looking out on the world as the resurrected ones. A whole new life awaits our stepping out of this empty tomb doorway. Let us not be afraid to take the first step. The first step is to let go of our sadness and put on the hope and joy of newness of life. And then we walk with Jesus. We walk with Jesus out of the empty tomb and into the newness of life. We are in Christ. We are a new creation. Yes, everything old has indeed passed away. It was necessary. See everything has become new!

This is also an opportunity to talk with your children about our Mission Focus. More information in on the back page of the newsletter.


