

Dear Fellow Ministers,

April is the month we will celebrate the festival of festivals, Easter. There are seven Sundays of Easter because we celebrate with a week of weeks. It is this festival which is central to who we are as the people of God. Jesus died on the cross for us, and on the third day was raised again. It is on that Sunday we will break out that word from which we have been fasting for the season of Lent, the one that starts with H or A depending on which you prefer. We will have butterflies available in the entry way for anyone who wants to listen for every time we hear or speak this word on Easter to raise up high in celebration

I am thankful for the work of the Evangelism Committee for the work which they have been doing to encourage spiritual practices during this season. I would encourage people to be making use of the God moment box. I love the idea of the box. First of all it gives us a chance to hear where others have been experiencing God in their lives. What you put in can be something small, something ordinary even. In the past I have written of the beauty of sunsets. I think it is safe to say they are common, since we do get one everyday. Although indeed some days they are spectacular. Aren't those moments which move your heart, which touch your soul equally spectacular or marvelous or amazing? It could be something your child said. It could be something you saw while out for a walk. It could be an insight which came to you as you prayed, as you read, as you had a conversation with someone. Those are God moments. They are worth sharing.

The other reason I like the idea of a God moment box is that it then encourages us to be aware. If I think about looking for the places and ways where God has shown up or is showing up in my day to day life I will begin seeing where and when God is showing up in my life. It is so easy to go through the motions of the day and not have that sense of God's presence. When I keep an eye out for them I am going to see them. When I see them I will be reminded of the incredible love of God for me and for those around me. God moments are examples of God's great love for us. It is shown in amazing


ways and it is shown in small ways. Have no doubt though, our God blesses us in so many ways that we could easily report so many God moments each and every day.

God moments can also be grand and amazing. Easter is coming. That celebration of resurrection will be happening soon. There will be a sunrise service at Main Street Square again this year. There will be two services of worship at our usual times at Trinity as we celebrate this most amazing good news which we get to proclaim. I am wondering though, what God moments have you had which have also been moments of resurrection? What would be a moment of resurrection, of new life for you or for those you love.

Our daughter Bekah is recently married. That is a moment of life and new life breaking forth. It will be a whole new thing. I am trusting there will be many blessings shared and received because of this marriage.

Resurrection, it can be recovering from a health issue. It can be a new opportunity. It can be a change in life which opens all sorts of doors and possibilities. It can be changes in a relationship which brings healing and wholeness and new possibilities for the future. It is also most certainly that promise which brings comfort at the time of death and the saying good-bye to a beloved one. Each Sunday is a mini festival of Easter, a celebration of the resurrection. I like the idea of thinking about those mini resurrections which we will experience in this life. I like the idea of keeping an eye out for them. I know they are there because I know who our God is.

In just a few weeks we will celebrate that grand glorious resurrection of our Lord Jesus. Until then, keep an eye out for the small ones which he is giving to you.



Church Council Highlights February 8, 2022

- Trinity has still not received notification from YouthWorks as to whether or not they will be staying in the building this summer.
- New “yellow” information sheets are being placed in each bulletin for members and visitors to complete each Sunday.
- Telephone calls are presently being made to all members of the congregation as a way of checking in and keeping in touch.
- The Council agreed that it would be a good idea to resume the pre-Covid methods of sharing the peace during worship.
- Income for February was \$22,347.90 and expenses totaled \$25,958.36 for a shortfall of \$3,610.56.
- The Council will meet in the near future to put into action some of the topics discussed with Pastor Jonathan Steiner at the February Council meeting. The Council will discuss questions such as “I want to do _____ as a part of Trinity Lutheran Church.” and answer the question “What about Trinity’s future excites you the most?” The Council will also discuss what in the church we can “let go” and what in the church we should “let grow”.
- The Gift Committee has met and recommended that Trinity accept the Marvin Bitz bequeath (house, car, and all personal property). Karen Bulman has assumed the position of “Personal Representative for the estate of Marvin Bitz” to act on behalf of Trinity. The utilities have been turned back on in the house and as soon as the house has been professionally cleaned and fumigated, it will be put up for sale.
- The Evangelism Committee reported that it would like to host a Ministry Fair on Rally Sunday (September 11, 2022).
- The Evangelism Committee is also looking at sending out post cards on the baptismal date of members.



Lenten worship invites us to follow Jesus

from Galilee to Jerusalem. For him it was going to be a much different trek from long ago with his parents. Research points to healing power of Park (by Park Director Ken Steinken)

Sometimes when I'm working in the Park I've observed what seemed like a rather curious phenomenon. People, who are walking down Saint Joe Street, will take the sidewalk into the Park, follow the walk that runs parallel to the street, exit back on to the public sidewalk and then keep walking in the same direction. They don't stop to look at any flowers or plants. They usually don't even slow down. They just keep walking at the same pace they were before they entered the Park. Their total time spent in the Park – less than one minute. "Why do they do that?" I wondered.

I recently listened to an episode of a "Hidden Brain" podcast (thanks to Pastor Wilbur for suggesting it) that may help explain what appeared to me as unusual behavior. It featured Dr. Ming Kuo, who heads the Landscape and Human Health Lab at University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign. Some 30 years ago her research focused not on people, but on the well-being of zoo animals. It explored why they died "at a fairly alarming clip" even when they had the basics – food, shelter and safety. What she and other researchers discovered is that when zoo animals are kept in habitats that resemble as much as possible the natural settings where they come from, they do much better physically, socially and psychologically.

When she turned her research to people, she was looking at the negative effects that violent and dangerous urban environments had on people. But as she studied this, something she wasn't looking for kept popping up in the data. "We see the same thing in humans that we see in zoo animals." She found that "when people have more access to nature you see better social functioning. You see better psychological functioning and better physical health."

Over the decades she has seen dozens of long-term health outcomes tied to contact with nature. "When you look out at a green landscape, even from indoors, your heart rate will go down," says Kuo. And your body goes from "fight or flight" mode to "tend and befriend"

mode. As a result she became an advocate for urban greening in the U.S., Europe and the Caribbean, extolling the benefits of adding trees, grass, flowers, and green space to cityscapes. Her research has shown that adding these elements to a neighborhood can reduce crime and violence, strengthen communities, and improve learning, self-control and attention as well as create personal well-being and vitality.

"When you come into the Park you can hear birds singing," a recent visitor to the Park told me. "You can listen to the wind blowing through the tall grass."

One of the major goals of Trinity Eco Prayer Park is to be a natural oasis in the heart of downtown Rapid City, to be a place where a person can connect with nature, even if for only a minute.

Tijuana Mission Team

We have 14 people signed up to go on our Tijuana mission trip this year. This is an all congregation trip; our age range is 12-79 years old a lot of in between. This will be our congregations third trip. We have built 2 family homes, furnished those homes and spent time in an orphanage, a men's convalescent home, a feeding kitchen and the dump where people live. On our last trip we visited the family from our first trip. Unfortunately the dad of that family has had many health problems due to diabetes. We were able to purchase a washing machine for the family; this helps the mom of the family not only with her own laundry but she earns money doing laundry for others.

This year's trip will be a little different. We will again go back to the family we built for in 2016 and see what we can do to be helpful to them. We will also go back to the home we

built in 2019 as we have been told they are using a tarp over an area that is serving as a kitchen for them. We will build a roof and help make that area a little more weather proof.

Each year we have visited a place called Campo De Fe. This is a home for men that are disabled. We sing songs with them, visit with them and pray with them. This has been a group favorite. Also we have been to two different orphanages and we will do that again on this trip. We will play with children, sing with them, we will take them treats and possibly have something like a VBS with them. Some of our group will go to the Dump. This is a place we visited in 2019. It was heartbreaking and moving in so many ways. We will take breakfast to give out in a building that is there for ministry, we will bring treats for the children and hopefully do some sort of VBS with them.

Yes, we will get to do fun things also. Eat at a taco stand, eat ice cream, go shopping at the market and spend some time at Rosarito Beach.

We have done many fundraisers already and will be doing more over the next several months. We are so thankful to our congregation for their generosity. That is one way to help our team. Other ways to help are praying for them. The more prayer the better.

Loads of Love

In April and part of May Trinity will be participating in a Lutheran Social Services program called Loads of Love. At the March Tuesday luncheon, Roslyn Stevenson from LSS spoke about youth who have been in foster care but never adopted. When these children age out of the system, they can no longer live with their foster family or in a group home. LSS works with youth across the state to help them prepare for this transition and help them find the next right step. They help them secure housing, further their education, give tips on how to find a better job, or the ins and outs of owning a vehicle. LSS becomes the family support that these young adults need to guide them and lead them to become responsible members of society.

Once they are ready to go on their own -- whether it's renting an apartment with others, moving into transitional housing like Abbot House or LSS New Alternatives, or into a dorm to attend secondary education, they are provided with a sort of "housewarming" gift. That is where Loads of Love comes in!

Laundry baskets will be purchased by a Thrivent Action Team. Below are the lists of some of the items needed to fill the laundry baskets. New items are preferred but if you have some items that are gently used they would be accepted as well.




