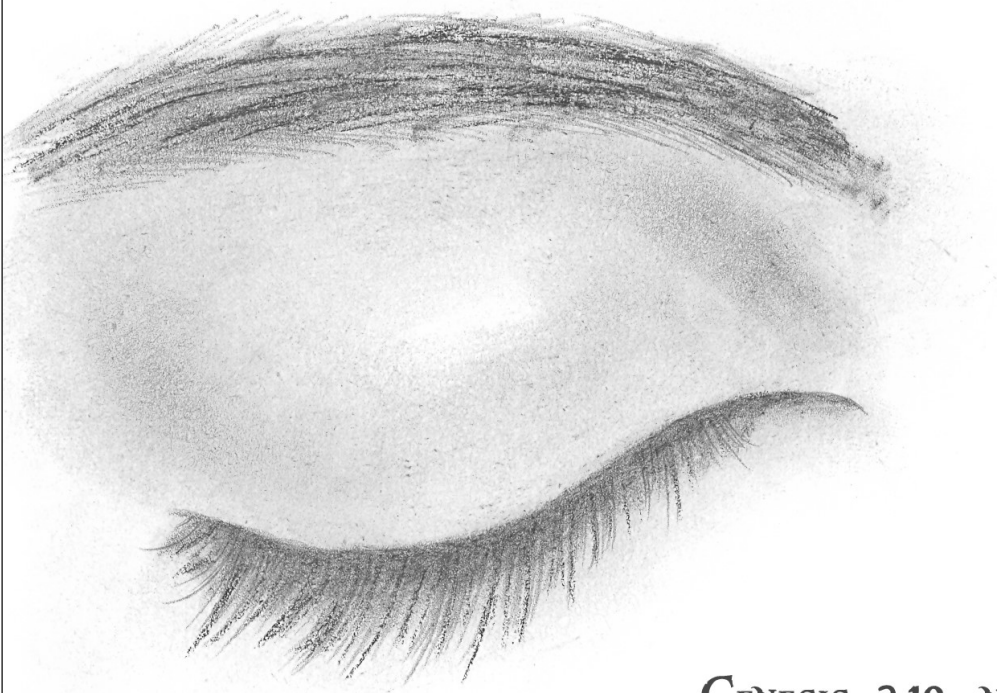

Dear Fellow Ministers,

Through the wonders of Zoom I have been leading a cohort of people who are active in churches from across the country. The cohort has been using a book by Bonnie Marden titled Church Finances for Missional Leaders. Bonnie is active in the Methodist Church as a leadership consultant and financial stewardship practitioner and educator. It has been a very good experience as I have developed relationships with those others who are in the cohort.

In the book in which we are there are several worksheets. One of them is a discover your gifts inventory. I decided to share it in my article this month because it is good to consider what our gifts may be. It is also very good to consider how it is that I am using my gifts in order to follow Jesus and be about the work which he would have me doing.

1. What are my favorite spiritual activities or disciplines? Favorite missions?
2. List my current responsibilities or commitments to a church or mission.
3. Do my commitments align with my first two responses? What changes might I consider to match my interests with my commitments?
4. Describe how I define my personal call from God. What missional needs generate the most anger or passion for me? How do I currently live that call? How could I live that call more fully?
5. If my gift would impact a need or mission, what would I be willing to give?
6. Describe my life choices or employment and explore how it aligns with my gifts and call.
7. Think of an award or recognition I received and gifts that were acknowledged. Do I use those gifts in my current commitments? What are some new options I might explore?

Being a steward is one of my favorite topics. It is a role which must be taken seriously if we are going to be people of the kingdom, living our lives as a part of the body of Christ. It is so easy for us to get into habits which may or may not be making the best use of our gifts and interests. The "Faith in Action" sheet which was produced by Evangelism Committee was another way of approaching this. As we list the different opportunities for serving within our

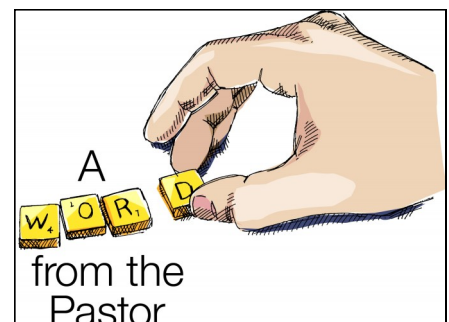
congregation one of the tasks may resonate with one of your interests or gifts. I have had that conversation several times over the years and again here recently how when we are using our gifts in a ministry, in a way of serving which is appropriate there is much joy.

I wonder, what stories could you tell of those opportunities to serve which were in keeping with your interests and gifts? What were the blessings which you experienced as a result of that service? How did God use your faithful offering of those gifts in order to bring blessings to others which always result in our being blessed?

I know I have said many times before and I will say many times in the future no doubt, our gifts, the gifts given to us by our God are not just for us. Who we are, what we are with all of our talents and abilities and resources are to be used to serve. The often used phrase of course is 'use wisely and well'. The wise of course would be wise in God's eyes, which quite often is different than what the world would count as wise.

In the Lutheran Book of Worship, the green hymnal, were offering prayers which I still find powerful summations of what it means to be a steward. "Merciful Father, we offer with joy and thanksgiving what you have first given us—ourselves, our time, and our possessions, signs of your gracious love. Receive them for the sake of him who offered himself for us, Jesus Christ our Lord." and "Blessed are you, O Lord God, maker of all things. Through your goodness you have blessed us with these gifts. With them we offer ourselves to your service and dedicate our lives to the care and redemption of all that you have made, for the sake of him who gave himself for us, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen"

Highlights of February 14 Church Council Minutes

- A new Marty Haugen liturgy has been ordered for use during Lent.
 - Income for January was \$38,709.16 and expenses totaled \$28,802.78.
 - Due to a malfunction of the church's sound board on February 12, there may be a large expenditure in the near future. A technician will determine if the sound board can be repaired or if a new one will need to be purchased.
 - Penny gave an overview of her research on the Margaret Petersen Fund.
 - Council viewed the four chair choices for the library/lounge and indicated their preferred choice.
 - Trinity's choir director, Lindsey Nielsen, has resigned. She will direct the choir through May. The Worship and Music Committee has a list of possible candidates to interview.
 - The Properties Committee has determined that the amount of asbestos does not meet the requirements for abatement if the carpet is pulled up from the tile in the Fellowship Hall. This is good news!
 - New LED lighting is being installed down the center aisle of the church.
- Plans for a new church photo directory are proceeding. Pictures will be taken March 16-18 and 20-25.

Highlights from Annual Meeting January 29, 2023

- Council has granted Pastor Wilbur one month of sabbatical in 2023. His plan is to spend this time at Koinonia Farm, an intentional Christian community in Georgia, during the month of October.
- Income for 2022 was \$354,888.65 and expenses totaled \$342,098.18 for a net income of \$12,790.47.

- A new church pictorial directory is in the works.
 - The 2022 Bitz bequeath to the church was about \$70,000. This money was allotted as follows: \$20,000 towards property maintenance work, \$30,000 to the Foundation to invest, and \$20,000 to the general operating fund of the church.
 - Family events have been replacing Vacation Bible School. In the past year, Trinity has hosted a pool party, a bowling party, and a swim day at Watiki Water Park. These events are for all members of the congregation.
 - Landscaping in front of the church was removed in September, 2022 and will be replaced this spring.
 - Windows have been replaced in the Fellowship Hall.
 - The Properties Committee will be working on several electrical issues and replacing some lighting in the church in 2023.
 - Trinity's choir director has resigned, effective at the end of May. The Worship and Music Committee will be reviewing applicants for a replacement.
 - The Foundation returned \$73,924.45 back to the church in 2022 (dividends distributed to dedicated fund accounts, special projects and grants, operational needs and expenses, and Eco Prayer Park expenses).
 - Trinity applied for and received a \$10,000.00 ELCA World Hunger Grant to assist with rental needs for the working poor.
 - Four individuals have recently committed to serving on the Park Vision Board which will oversee park operations.
 - Due to increased usage of the Eco Prayer Park by our downtown neighbors, Mountain States Security has been hired to provide patrols two times per night. The Properties Committee will be installing signs stating "This is private property and you are a guest" in the park.
 - The following individuals were elected to three-year terms on the Church Council: Shane Moore, Stewardship; Cindy Elder, Evangelism; Bonnie Warejcka, Fellowship; and Melanie Paulson, Worship and Music.
- The congregation approved the proposed 2023 budget of \$357,436.56, which includes a 5% salary increase for staff.



Park Vision Board holds first-ever meeting

After a yearlong-plus search for people who were willing to help guide the future of Trinity Eco Prayer Park, the Park Vision Board convened for the first time on February 1.

The Park Vision Board will oversee the operation of the Park. It is unique in that it is made up of Trinity Lutheran members along with representatives from the community. Although the Park is a joint effort between Trinity Lutheran Church Foundation and Trinity Lutheran Church, the Park functions as a public park and the hope is that involving community members on the board will inspire people outside of Trinity to use and support the Park.

"I am thrilled to finally have a group committed to be advocates for the Park," said Director Ken Steinken. "They are literally an answer to my prayers."

Trinity members who have stepped up to serve as Park Vision Board members are Erica Haugtvedt, Lisa Westlake, Bob Truman and Pastor Wilbur Holz. Community representatives include Bob Scull, owner of RCS Construction, the company that built the Park and Jason Phillips, an engineer with TerraSite Design, which created the original plans for the park as well as the recent drainage renovation project. The goal is for the board to have 7 to 9 members with a majority of the board being from Trinity.

Vision Board members will 1) create an annual park budget; 2) work with the Park Director Ken Steinken to raise sufficient funds to operate the Park; 3) ensure the Park operates in alignment with the Park Mission Statement; 4) monitor and amend Park operational policies as needed; and 5) be responsible to hire and fire park staff.

At the first meeting the board brainstormed programs and events to make the community more aware of the Park. The members also discussed ways to educate the public about the park's sustainability features and to create an

understanding of the Park's naturalistic approach to landscaping.

The board is scheduled to have regular quarterly meetings. However, at its initial meeting members expressed a desire to gather more frequently in order to get some of their ideas up and running.

Park guidelines posted

Property committee members George Powers and Larry Bulman teamed up to install three signs in Trinity Eco Prayer Park on a mild February afternoon. The signs serve several purposes: to welcome park visitors and to lay out expectations for park users.

"We want to help visitors understand what behaviors are acceptable in the Park," said Park Director Ken Steinken. "But we didn't want to post a list that created a negative atmosphere. So, we designed a sign that states the park rules but does not include the word No."

Another function of the signs was inspired by advice from the Rapid City Police. In order to discourage people from using the park as a place to spend the night, the police said the Park's hours of operation should be posted. Having the hours clearly posted removes any doubt about when visitors should or should not be in the Park, and in extreme cases could facilitate charging somebody with trespassing.

The signs also intend to clear up the misconception that some people have that Trinity Eco Prayer Park is a City park. The signs state: "You are a guest on our private property. Please help us keep it a peaceful, sacred, safe & clean place." The signs also add a warning that since it is private property individuals can lose their privilege to be in the Park.

Thanks to George and Larry for putting up the signs that educate visitors and help the Park fulfill its mission "To be a place to reflect on how we relate to God, one another and the planet."

Security company begins nighttime patrols in Park

In an effort to deter people from using Trinity Eco Prayer Park as an overnight camping spot Director Ken Steinken enlisted Mountain States Security to do random checks of the Park premises during the hours the Park is closed.

The Park patrols began in conjunction with the installation of signs that state the Park is closed from 10 pm to 6 am. Mountain States personnel inspect the Park on foot several times during those hours and inform anyone they find that the Park is closed and ask them to leave.

"We selected Mountain States because of their experience working with the Rapid City Parks," said Steinken. "They handle the closing of city park restrooms and advise anyone present that the Park is closed. So, they are skilled at respectfully dealing with street people who they sometimes find in the parks at closing time."

At its meeting the Park Vision Board also talked about possibly adding video cameras in the Park as a way to monitor overnight as well as daytime happenings there.
