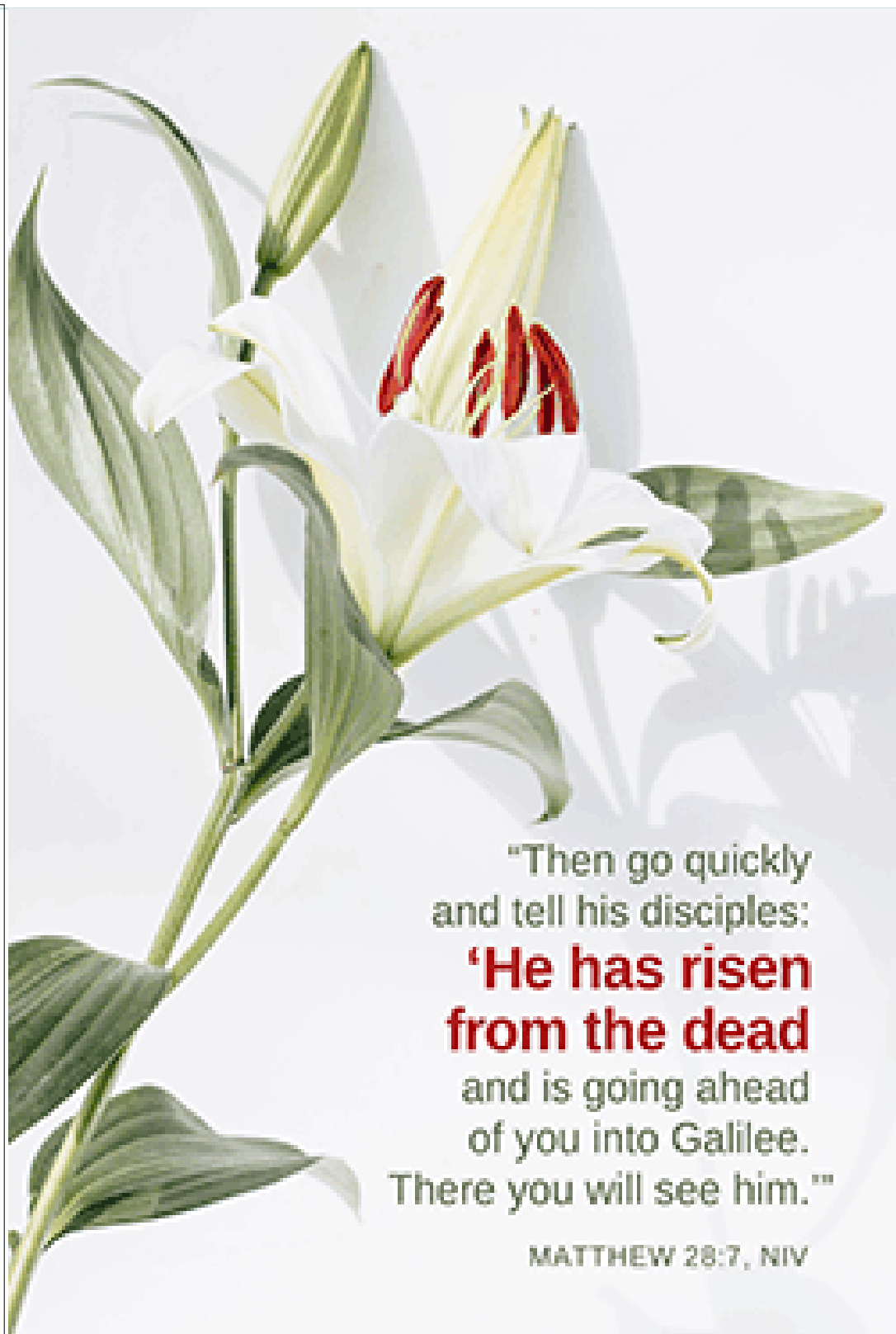

BE A BLESSING

At the beginning of Lent, the Evangelism Committee challenged us to “Be a Blessing to others” reminding us that as Christians we are blessed beyond measure by God’s undeserved grace! So how are we doing?

A couple Sundays into Lent, after Sunday School was over and the second service had begun, I walked around the corner to come face to face with someone I did not know struggling to use the phone in the hallway. I asked if I could help him. He turned to me with tear-filled eyes and said, “I need so much help.” I responded that I meant help with the phone but that I was willing to see how I could be of help no matter his need.

He was very open about his circumstances. He took responsibility for really messing up. And now he was just released from jail with his phone, wallet and keys all in his truck in impound on a Sunday. I listened, without judgment, and he really had what he needed. He could call his dad – a number he knew – to find family friends who lived in Rapid City. I pointed out Pastor Wilbur to him then leading worship, and said if his calls didn’t work out, he could wait in church and talk to Wilbur after.

I do not know how many other Trinity people had already shown him kindness or how many would after I left. I know there were several. His family friends found him by calling Lutheran churches trying to find the one he was at to come get him and Trinity members helped with that. And a few days later, Pastor received this e mail from him:

Dear Pastor Holz,

I'm writing to thank you, as sincerely as is possible, for your kindness, openness, and support. A week ago, I showed up at your church having been through one of the most trying times of my life and both you and your parishioners showed me incredible kindness. While I struggle to come to terms with large swathes of the bible, it was eminently clear that the gospel of love, acceptance, and forgiveness is alive and well at Trinity Lutheran. I wish the very best to you, your church, and to all creatures (and as best I can, me)

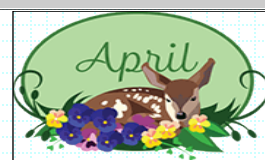
Our Synod's vision of Journeying Together in Christ has continued to focus our work. We invite you to take a few moments to review the list below which celebrates some of the ministry we shared together in 2022. **Journeying together in Christ as the South Dakota Synod, in 2022 we:**

- Walked with a new start congregation, **Spirit of Hope, in Scotland, SD**, called their mission developer and found a site to worship, as they had outgrown their house.
- Continued to partner with the **McLaughlin Community Alliance Group**, a non-profit utilizing the building of Redeemer Lutheran Church for the empowerment of the community.
- Began exploration for two new potential church plants, with **Box Elder** and **Shepherd's Table in Sioux Falls**.
- Walked with the **30** people in various stages of **Candidacy** and have 3 new entrance interviews scheduled in January 2023!
- Received **9 new first call candidates**.
- Completed **28 Ministry Site Studies** and extended **41 calls**!
- Ensured that nearly every congregation has a called pastor, interim pastor, Synod Authorized
- Minister, or lay leader to care for God's people (thank you to all of you who are helping out with area congregations and filling in!)
- Distributed **\$60,201** through the **Seminary Debt Reduction Program**.
- Granted **\$124,290** in scholarship funds to seminary students plus **\$20,000** in **internship site assistance**.
- Received **\$102,000** in grants from ELCA Christian Community & Leadership.
- Distributed **37 disaster recovery micro-grants for \$18,800** to congregations in need of repairs or community relief after natural disasters. In addition, Beaver Valley Lutheran Church received **\$22,000** from Lutheran Disaster Response and **\$10,000** from Synod Storm Recovery funds for tornado recovery.
- Held a **Synod Assembly**, where we gathered again as a community to conduct the business of the synod.
- Hosted **Spring** and **Fall Theological Conferences**, where we continued to support the continuing education of our Rostered Ministers either online or in-person.
- Continued to invest in **FaithX**, a community mapping tool for congregations to see hard data about their neighborhoods and learn more about their neighbors.
- Supported the congregations and ministries of the synod through visits by synod staff, both digitally and in-person.
- Created **new synod staff** positions including a **Rural Ministry Liaison** to journey with our rural ministry sites. In the past year, the Rural Ministry Liaison has worked directly with **10 communities** and **19 congregations**.
- Held an inaugural **Farm to Table Dinner and Auction** which resulted in gifts and pledges of almost \$100,000 to support rural ministry in South Dakota.

Thank you for all the ways you have supported the ministry of the South Dakota this past year! God has called us to be the body of Christ together, and this is an active and healthy body. We look forward to continuing our journey with you in 2023 and beyond!

Update on Church Landscaping

Several members of the Landscape Task Force, along with Larry Bulman of the Properties Committee, met with Kenzie Millar from TerraSite Design on March 2. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss design work and planting of the two flower beds at the front of the church.

Kenzie received input from the group as to the size and shape of the flower beds, plant suggestions, and the need for some type of "curbing" around the flower beds. Just one week later, Kenzie e-mailed a tentative plan. Task Force members met on March 12 to approve the plan. Kenzie will now do a cost estimate prior to a final decision. The cost estimate will have an option of the church doing some dirt work and laying sod in order to save dollars.

We are hoping to have a beautiful and welcoming landscape at the front of the church sometime this spring.

Church Council Highlights March 14, 2023

- At the Bear Butte Conference Assembly on March 12, Karen Bulman was reelected to a two-year term as Treasurer and Pastor Wilbur was elected to a four-year term as President.
- The church is still using a borrowed sound board while our sound board is being repaired. The good news is the cost of repair should be just a few hundred dollars.
- KOTA is moving their broadcast offices to Jackson Boulevard. Pastor Wilbur will meet with KOTA to see if or how this will effect the Sunday radio broadcast.
- LED lights in the choir loft and sanctuary have been installed. There will be about a 60% cost reduction per light.
- Income for February was \$23,497.66 and expenses totaled \$26,772.64.
- The Landscape Task Force has approved the preliminary design work for the flower beds at the front of the church. TerreSite Design will present the Task Force with cost estimates in the very near future.
- Forty new chairs, at a cost of \$3,714.03 have been ordered for the Library/Lounge. Delivery is expected on March 24.
- Forty family units have signed up to have their pictures taken for the church photo directory. Cindy Elder has begun calling those who have not yet signed up.
- The April Church Council Meeting has been rescheduled to April 18.
- The Worship Committee has begun contacting possible candidates for the choir director position.

Rockside Ranch

At our March Tuesday Luncheon, our guest speaker was Amy Painter, the Director of Development at Rockside Ranch Black Hills. She spoke about Rockside and what they do.

Rockside Ranch is a working ranch for young men in crisis. The program is a 8 month residential program that focuses on sobriety, mental health, job, and life skills. Rockside Ranch will not give up on the young men in their program. They coach them through the program with encouragement, skills, and lots of prayer. Upon graduation graduates immediately begin a job either independently or through the Rockside Workforce Program.

There is a host family on each ranch that guides the students on a daily basis. They help them to understand that God is in control and that by giving their life to God they will prosper in the things they try to do. There are 8 students on the ranch at any given time. Each student is assigned a day to do all the household chores in the home, like cooking and cleaning up for all the members in the program. They receive an allowance each week and on Sunday after they go to church they stop at a store to do a little shopping. Their weekends are for hiking, camping or some type of outside recreation fun.

A typical day on the ranch starts at 7:00 a.m. with farm chores and breakfast. Worship

and Bible study is at 9:00 a.m., trade projects at 10:00 a.m., lunch is at 1:00 p.m., class is at 2:00 p.m., farm chores and break are at 4:00 p.m. and the day ends with dinner and evening session at 6:00 p.m.

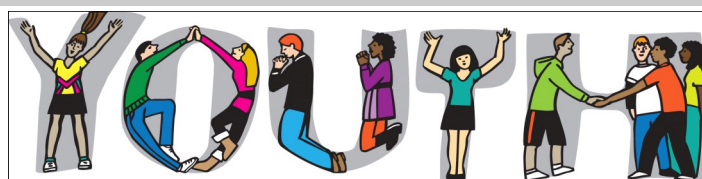
The ranch does not bill for services. Families contribute what they can and they trust that God will provide the balance. Donors make it possible for them to award over \$200,000 in scholarships each year.

Trinity Eco Prayer Park has recruited community partners who align with the mission of Trinity Eco Prayer Park to live lightly on the planet and find ways to work with nature instead of against it.

For most people who have been in Rapid City for a while, **Jolly Lane Greenhouse** needs no introduction. The thriving enterprise located on Highway 44 just east of town has provided gardening, landscaping and greenhouse supplies to locals for five decades. Jolly Lane will provide Park members with a **10 percent discount**. If you're not familiar with Jolly Lane check out www.jollylane.com.

Head back toward town on Highway 44 and you'll find **Wild Idea Buffalo Company's** store. Wild Idea's mission is "to regenerate the prairie grasslands, while improving our environment and our food supply by bringing back the buffalo." (Learn more at www.wildideabuffalo.com) The company raises buffalo on the Cheyenne River Ranch about 15 miles south of where Highway 44 crosses the Cheyenne River. The buffalo roam free on the prairie and are harvested in the field using a state-certified mobile processing plant. Wild Idea is offering a generous **20 percent off** their products to park members.

Dry Creek Farm & Ranch, located east of Caputa, raises livestock and crops using regenerative agricultural practices. The Freeland family strives to "honor God by managing our soil and livestock holistically, providing exceptional products to local consumers, and investing in and educating our community." Dry Creek offers beef, pork and lamb from their herds that are pasture-raised and never fed with GMO's or growth hormones, given antibiotics, or grazed on artificial pesticides. They also sell honey from their pollinator-friendly farm. In the fall they run a maze and pumpkin patch. Dry Creek will

whopping 25 percent off ranch tours. To find out more go to atdrycreek.com.

Uprooted, began as a mobile “pop-up” plant shop. Last summer they moved in with Hippie Haven (which is now strictly an online business) at the corner of Mount Rushmore Road and St. Joe Street. In addition to selling beautiful plants and their custom-blended potting soil, which includes algae harvested from the Trinity Eco Prayer Park ponds, they offer a variety of plant-related services. Uprooted will repot your plants, provide a plant doctor consultation or plant sitting while you’re out of town. Or if you have (or would like to have) plants at your business, they will do weekly plant care visits to keep your plants happy and healthy. They also host events like Community Plant Swaps, Non-alcoholic Sip and Paint and plant workshops. Park members will receive a **10 percent discount** on Uprooted plants and services. 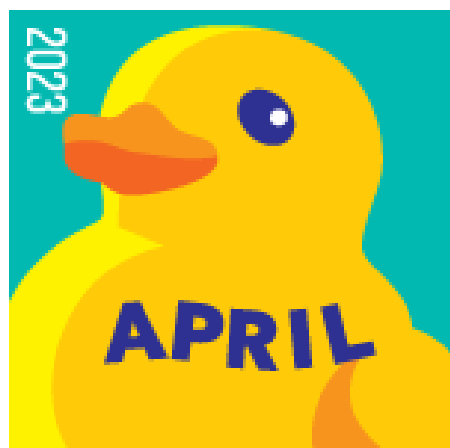
