“Sewing for Missions”

The LCVH “sewing ladies” have been meeting on the 2nd and 4th Thursdays of the month for about 3 years now. We meet from 9:30-1:30 in the Fellowship Hall to cut, iron, sew, and fellowship together. Some of us bring our sewing machines to sew, while others prepare fabric and lay out patterns. No sewing skills are required and anyone is welcome to come join us!

Our projects change as we discover needs and work to fulfill them. We started out sewing pillowcase dresses for girls in Uganda and Nicaragua. We couldn't leave the boys out, so shorts were another project. During the winter months, we created double layer hats and scarves for the Firehouse Shelter. Another project involved sewing pillowcases and drawstring bags for care packages assembled by the social ministry, which were then donated to Lovelady.

In order to support the Shirks' mission in Kijabe, we began by making infant hats for the newborn babies delivered in the hospital where Arianna works. Now, we are creating quilts in blues, greens, and browns for the hospital's theme “Islands of Hope.” We hope to also create quilts for Lutheran World Relief in the future.
