The practice of our congregation is to place the bread into the extended hand of the communicant. The wine is offered in individual cups; please take one from the tray as it is offered by the Elder. The common cup will be offered to those who do not take an individual cup. The cups in the center of the tray are filled with non-alcoholic wine, in consideration of persons who should not drink wine. Also, children who have not received Communion instruction are invited to come to the Communion rail, fold their hands and receive a blessing. Please notify an usher if you need a communion assistant to bring the Lord's Supper to you in the pew.



Every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire.

¹¹"I baptize you with water for repentance, but he who is coming after me is mightier than I, whose sandals I am not worthy to carry. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire. ¹²His winnowing fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing floor and gather his wheat into the barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

CONFESSION OF FAITH

The Augsburg Confession: Article XII. Of Repentance

Now, repentance consists properly of these two parts:

One is contrition, that is terror striking the conscience through the knowledge of sin;

The other is faith, which is born of the Gospel, or of absolution, and believes that for Christ's sake, sins are forgiven, comfort the conscience, and delivers it from terrors.

Then good works are bound to follow, which are the fruits of repentance.
