Also, children who have not received Communion instruction are invited to come to the Communion rail, fold their hands and receive a blessing. Please notify an usher if you need a communion assistant to bring the Lord's Supper to you in the pew.

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



(This Gospel Lesson was read at the first worship service of LCVH in 1959)





Words of power that can never fail; let their truth prevail over unbelief.


Speak, O Lord, and renew our minds; help us grasp the heights of Your plans for us:


