A Word from the Pastor...

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ, gathered by the Holy Spirit into this community of faith in Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church, called to be caught up in the Reign of God in this world, which God so dearly loves:

May God's great grace be with you.

The signs are clear. We face new challenges for all that it means to be church in our changing culture. We have experienced significant decline in our congregation's participation and overall attendance in worship. We can no longer stand still and keep up with what God is doing in a changing world.

But the signs are also clear that the Spirit is testing us, calling us to listen to God in a new way, calling us to be church in a new way. Dave Daubert says, "God is going to do what God is going to do. The only question is, do we want to be part of it or not?"

This sign is clear. The sign of Lent with the ashen cross, traced upon our fore-heads, is a sign for the way God is making old things new. We call this repentance. It means, "turn around" or "to live life in a new direction." Congregations are no different. A community of faith that desires to be renewed will need to repent. In Zion, we need to be open to the ways God is working for us, with us, and through us.

I believe that the Reign of God is breaking in and all around us, blessing and saving the world. I believe that God is working among us, inviting us to be signs of grace in God's beloved world.

I am inviting you to listen to God and to one another in a new way. How does our ministry together in Zion help you to follow Jesus? We will listen to God's Word and to one another as we discern our purpose in God's mission in the world: "God's purpose for Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church is

______." I am encouraging you to participate in this Visioning Retreat on February 21.

View from the Pew:

As a Christian, I welcome hearing athletes give credit to God for their success. Yet it becomes complicated sometimes.



The example of Seattle Seahawks quarterback Russell Wilson is timely. After his team beat Green Bay to advance to the Super Bowl, he praised God for creating the circumstances that forced the Seahawks to make a triumphant comeback. That's taking it too far. For one thing, it implies that God helped Green Bay lose the game, and I know a lot of Lutherans who never could accept that belief.

It's tricky, though. Romans 8:28 promises us that "all things work for good" when we believe, so it's natural to think that everything we're involved in will turn out just the way we want, including winning football games.

But the extreme application of that verse would suggest that we're never going to get sick or have problems with the kitchen sink or experience any heartache or grief. As we know, that's just not true. What that verse tells us is God is with us, in our best moments and toughest times. He may not cause everything that happens to us, but shares equally in the triumph and disappointment.

So Wilson's comments were well intended, and helped to spread the Word. But he should know that God didn't give the Packers a 16-0 lead, just to take it away from all of those Lutherans who love them.

CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS—JANUARY, 2015

- A ZELC vision retreat is set for February 21st at the Episcopal Retreat Center, Salt Lake City.
- General Fund giving was 4% less than budgeted in 2014, while spending was exactly as planned. The over-run for the year, taken from savings, was \$19,600.
- We have received 11 new confirmed members.
 Each confirmand completed a paper about their personal faith formation and each designed a ceiling tile conceived as "faith art" to be mounted in the ceiling of the youth room.
- Council has approved two phases of a 4-phase proposal for changing out old, inefficient lights to new environmentally friendly lighting. The net cost will be approximately \$2700, with payback estimated to be approximately 1-2 years. New sanctuary chandelier LED lamps are also being considered as a future change.


The annual Seder Meal will be scheduled in March. Details coming soon.



GENERAL FUND BUDGET UPDATE for the end of 2014

For the month of December, Zion's weekly envelopes and loose offerings, including one-time gifts spread across the year, amounted to \$56,125, compared to our 4-week donation budget of \$32,416. This is 173% of the amount needed to balance our budget for this 4-week period. For 2014, our giving totaled \$394,890. This represents **94%** of the funds needed to balance our annual budget to date.

Income from all sources, not including dedicated funds was **\$421,679**, compared to our budgeted income of **\$440,139**, or **96%** of the funds needed to balance our annual budget.

Total spending was **\$441,295** on a budget of **\$442,863**, or **99.6%** of the budget. About \$10,000 of this was a budgeted Special Repair line paying for roughly half of the Sunday School roof repair.

The net general fund overrun is \$16,900, plus a planned overrun (congregation-approved budget imbalance) of \$2,700, for a total overrun for the year of **\$19,600**. Our general savings account balance was, therefore, reduced by about \$20,000 in 2014.

Our Capital Improvements dedicated account was reduced by \$10,890 in 2014 to pay for the remainder of the Sunday School roof repair. Note that the repair was originally estimated to cost \$24,000. Our actual cost was less than \$21,000.

All told, it wasn't as a bad a financial year as we feared. But the concern expressed at the November congregational meeting and the Council President's December letter was justified, and generously acknowledged by our faithful congregation with December giving that was **73% more** than budgeted for the month. Even with this, we had a deficit of \$20,000. Next year, an increase in the budgeted expenses will require a **10% increase** in giving (over 2014 actual giving) to avoid a deficit.

For the Organ Capital campaign, we have received pledges of \$51,515 (of \$220,000 total including the original proposal plus a 10% tithe.) We currently have received \$36,795, which can be used to begin the upgrades.

We praise God for your generosity.
