A Word from the Pastor...

"Grace." If there is one word which describes who Lutherans are, what they teach, and how they live it is "grace." It is a gift. Martin Luther exulted in the scripture proclamation, "we are justified by grace through faith!" Luther and the Reformers said it is "Grace alone." Period. The punctuation is definitive. We do not proclaim "God's grace is for you" followed by commas: "if you," "when you," "after you," "unless you," or "until you." It is "grace" --- period.

In 2017 we will celebrate the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation. The ELCA will promote the anniversary with the theme ---"Together by Grace."

Within the context of the 500th Anniversary, our congregational council explored a theme for our church's mission and ministry. Of course, the theme would include "grace." But our president, Erin Basta, challenged us to go further. *A theme needs to encourage action. Verbs are action words. Jesus instructs us to spread His word-including Grace. What better way to do that than by connecting with each other within the congregation and with those in our families, neighborhoods, workplaces, and communities. I believe that we will discover what a current commercial tells us "We are more alike than we are not alike." From our discussion, we enthusiastically commend Zion's new theme:*

Connecting through Grace.

We pray the Spirit's call to action as we explore ways to live out the verbs:

"Connecting through grace" in our loving, serving, praying, welcoming, inviting, praising, teaching, learning, growing, planning and acting.

In and through Jesus, who is "grace upon grace."

GENERAL FUND BUDGET UPDATE for 2016

For the month of July, Zion's weekly envelopes and loose offerings, including one-time gifts spread across the year amounted to \$39,935, compared to our 5-week donation budget of \$43,195. This is 92% of the amount needed to balance our budget for this 5-week period. This is excellent, considering we are mid-summer! Year-to-date, you have given \$247,015, or 92% of the funds needed to balance our annual budget.

For the Organ Capital campaign, we have pledges for \$53,015 (of \$220,000 total including the original proposal plus a 10% tithe.) We currently have received \$67,643, including \$600 donated in July. Of this amount, we have already committed \$20,000 to start work.

We praise God for your generosity.



Madagascar Motor Cycle Update – the Rocky Mountain Synod Committee on Madagascar has recently received an update on how our project to provide motorcycles for pastors who work in remote locations is progressing. Three of our companion synods, including Mahajanga Synod whom we in Utah have "adopted", have purchased motorcycles and are ready to put them into use.

In addition, our committee is getting ready to provide financial support of about \$6,000 to help in the purchase of materials which will enable the solar panels at the Betela Seminary to be reactivated. Currently their power comes from generators.


