## GENERAL FUND BUDGET UPDATE for 2016

For the month of August, Zion's weekly envelopes and loose offerings, including one-time gifts spread across the year amounted to \$23,193, compared to our 4-week donation budget of \$34,556. This is 67% of the amount needed to balance our budget for this period. Year-to-date, you have given \$270,211, or 89% of the funds needed to balance our annual budget.

For the Organ Capital campaign, we have pledges for \$53,015 (of \$220,000 total including the original proposal plus a 10% tithe.) We currently have received \$67,718, including \$75 donated in July. Of this amount, we have already committed \$20,000 to start work.

We praise God for your generosity.

## View from the Pew

To this day, I'm not sure how it happened. Yet at some point, probably about halfway through the nearly 30 years that I've managed the ushering duties at Zion, Hal Sinn became a full-time participant.

That's 52 Sundays a year, plus some Holy Week and Christmas Eve services, with nearly perfect attendance week after week.

So I commend those who organized the recent effort to honor Hal with an "endowed" chair that will serve as a tribute to his ongoing work, as the ushers sit in the foyer of the church in between their job functions. With his outgoing personality, he has been very well suited to the nature of ushering, greeting people and making sure they were welcomed. So maybe I've had to remind him to not tease people for being a little late, but since he's always early, he probably has earned that right.

One of the reasons Hal has been so vital to this operation is that I'm a poor recruiter. This is another opportunity for me to encourage members to become involved as ushers. Hal's workload aside, the basic structure has teams serving for two months each year (April/October, for example), with enough depth to cover for one another if someone has to miss a Sunday.

With the recent addition of Micah, who loves to hit the switch of what he calls "the ring bells" at the beginning of the service, we now have staffing from the ages of 5 to 85. If you fit anywhere within that range, please consider joining the team.




